A regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, held at the Town Hall, Monday, April 1st, 1935 at 2:00 o'clock P. M. with the following members present:-

Present -5- Absent -0-

A quorum being present the chairman called the meeting to order to transact all business that may come before the Board.

Supervisor Zalemski, stated that the meeting was now open for the public hearing on the proposed fire hazard ordinance as published in the Cheektowaga Record.

The Town Clerk then presented proof of publishing said notice in the Cheektowaga Record and continued by reading same.

Supervisor Zalemski asked if there was any one to speak in favor of this proposed ordinance. Mr. Edward Fath, Fire Commissioner of the U-Crest District stated that he was in favor of this ordinance being adopted.

Supervisor Zalemski, then asked if there was any one present who objected to the Town Board adopting this ordinance as published, No objections were heard.

On motion of Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Rzyrkowski the ordinance was adopted.
(Copy of ordinance as adopted) follows:-

FIRE HAZARD.

It shall be the duty of the owner or leasee of every store, dwelling or other building, to keep such store, dwelling or other building, with all of its appurtenances, including the space not occupied by buildings, clear and free from all kinds of inflammable refuse or rubbish that is easily ignited.

It shall be the duty of the fire commissioners of any fire district within the Town, and in the event there are no fire commissioners, the Chief of Police, to inspect and examine any building, structure or premises for the purpose of determining whether there exists therein a fire hazard. The Chief of Police shall have the power to compel the owner thereof to remedy any conditions found to be fire hazard.

Every person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each offense.

Each week's continual violation of this ordinance shall constitute a separate additional violation.

Mrs. Bowers entered a complaint about excess water in and along the West side of Olcott Place due to improper grade on said street. This matter was referred to the Engineers office and Highway Superintendent.

Mr. Pearce, addressed the Board stating that they were building eleven new homes on Huxley Drive and that the road was in very poor condition, no mail service, or street lights, also would like to have two fire hydrants installed along said highway. Mr. Pearce's complaint was referred to the Highway Superintendent and the Fire Commissioners of said district.

On motion of Councilman Burst, seconded by Councilman Rzyrkowski the following building petitions were granted and the Town Clerk was authorized to issue permits for same:-

On motion of Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Kaufman the communication from John J. Eberl, Supt. of Highways relative to road conditions in sanitary sewer district No. 3 was ordered received and filed for further consideration.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Communication from Councilman Burst, relative to the possibility of deepening and relocating Soajaquada Creek was read.

Supervisor Zaleski, appointed Councilman Burst, Denk and Rzyrkowski, also Town Attorney Doyle as a committee of four to study this communication and report back to the board as soon as possible on their findings.

On motion of Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Kaufman the Town Clerk was directed to write to the New York Central R.R. Company requesting that they erect flash signs at their crossing at Ellicott and Dick Roads.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Application from the Board of Fire Commissioners, Dist. #6 for an additional fire hydrant at the N. E. Corner of Huth Rd. and Harlem Avenue was on motion of Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Kaufman, granted and the Supervisor was directed to order the Western New York Water Company to install same.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Supervisor Zalemski, reported that the State Highway Department was not in favor of a stop and then proceed sign at the intersection of Broadway and Union Road but he thought they would grant a permit for a stop and go signal at this intersection.

On motion of Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Burst the Supervisor was authorized to get estimates for the installation of stop and go sign at this crossing.

Carried, Ayes -5 - Noes -0-

On motion of Councilman Burst, seconded by Councilman Denk, the public service commission reports and being cases Nos. 4786-4666 and 3142 were referred to the Town Attorney for study.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Mr. George C. Diehl, presented a claim against the Town of Cheektowaga for \$3,250.00 for services rendered the Town on Scajaquada Creek and in sewer district No. 5.

After some discussion by the various members of the Town Board, Councilman Burst offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Kaufman.

RESOLVED, that the claim of George C. Diehl, against the Town be compromised by the payment of \$1,250.00 in full settlement of his claim against the Town of Cheektowaga.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Town Attorney Doyle, presented a letter from Frank C. Moore, Executive secretary of the Association of Towns relative to an act to amend the Town Law in relation to Justice of the Peace in Towns of the first class, stating that the bill was now amended to make it permissive legislation instead of mandatory.

On motion of Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Kaufman this communication was ordered received and filed.

Carried.

Councilman Denk, Rzyrkowski and Town Attorney Doyle were authorized to check with the Board of Assessors on Franchise Tax and to make certain recommendations to the Commission at their hearing to be held at Albany, April 25th.

On motion of Councilman Denk, seconded by Councilman Rzyrkowski the Supervisor was authorized to submit as an E.R.B. project reconditioning and installing of baseball diamonds in the Town, also painting of fences and green houses at Disposal Plants No. 3 & 5.

Carried, Ayes -5- Noes -0-

Councilman Denk, offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Rzyrkowski.

RESOLVED, that the estimate submitted by the/FILLMORE FOUNDRY INC. to furnish the materials hereinafter mentioned for the construction of additions in Sewer District #3, be addepted.

That the Town Attorney be authorized and directed to prepare a contract in accordance with the terms of said estimate and when drawn, the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to sign the same, on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, Dated - April 1, 1935.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be directed and authorized to have printed in pamphlet form the following, and to have same distributed to the residents and owners of property in said district.

FACTS RELATIVE TO CONTROVERSY ARISING OVER SEWER CONNECTIONS
WITH AMHERST SANITARY SEWER.
* * * *

For many years a portion of the property located in Sewer District #5, in the Town of Cheektowaga, N. Y. has been connected with the Amherst Sanitary Sewer, under a contract entered into between the Town of Cheektowaga and the Town of Amherst. Under this contract, which has been renewed from time to time, it is provided that a yearly rental be paid to the Town of Amherst for the use of such sewer. The reason this contract was entered into was to obviate the necessity of the Town building a booster station in order

to connect with the Cheektowaga sewer. This was not done at the time the sewers were constructed in Sewer District #5, because it was considered cheaper to enter into the contract with Amherst than to expend the money to build a booster station of the size and capacity necessary to connect with the Cheektowaga sewer.

The residents of Eggertsville and Snyder have at different times made complaint to the Town Board of Amherst relative to storm waters getting into the sanitary sewer, causing cellars to become filled with water, and have requested that the contract between the Town of Cheektowaga and the Town of Amherst be cancelled. In order to do its part to remedy the condition complained of by the residents of Eggertsville and Snyder, the Town Board of Amherst adopted an ordinance forbidding any connection with the sanitary sewer of storm waters. The Town of Cheektowaga has been reluctant to enact such an ordinance, although it has been requested to do so by the Town of Amherst.

It is necessary for residents and owners of property in this district to co-operate with the Town officials so that the contract above referred to will not be cancelled at this time. In the near future it is hoped that the district will be in such financial condition as to permit the expenditure of the necessary money with which to pay the cost of building a booster station. There will then be no necessity of connection with the Amherst sewer. For the present we believe it is to the best interests of the Town of Cheektowaga, and particularly to the residents and taxpayers of Sewer District #5, that the contract be continued. While this is our desire, we still must obtain the consent of the Town Board of Amherst, and the only way that consent can be obtained is by the residents and owners of property in the district complying with the request of the Town of Amherst, or else build a booster station.

The members of the Town Board of Cheektowaga have conferred with representatives of the Town of Amherst in an effort to amicably adjust this matter, and with a little co-operation on your part, we believe that our difficulties can be satisfactorily settled. We cannot recommend at this time the expenditure of the money necessary to build a booster station; and for that reason we feel compelled to co-operate with the Town of Amherst at this time, and urgently request the residents of the district that where possible, storm water connections be eliminated. The Town Board of Amherst has insisted that we authorized its Plumbing & Building Inspector to make a survey of the portion of District #5, which connects with the Amherst sewer. We ask that you extend to the Inspector the courtesy of permitting him to examine the sewer connections, and that you comply with any reasonable request which he makes.

We hope that you appreciate the gravity of the situation, and lend us any assistance you can in our efforts to amicably adjust this matter. We dislike very much the necessity of calling this matter to your attention, but there is no way of our preventing the Town of Amherst cancelling its contract, unless we are willing to do our part in assisting it to satisfy the residents in the Amherst sewer district.

We are extremely anxious to have the contract continued as it is not only to the best interest of the Town of Cheektowaga, but to the taxpayers and residents of Sewer District #5, as well.
