WHEREAS, in September 1936, this Board submitted to the Comptroller of the State of New York a plan for the issuance of a series of bonds to be sold under a debt equalization plan and it was provided in the plan that during the year 1936 bonds be issued in the principal sum of \$25,000.00, in the year 1937 \$18,000.00, in the year 1938 \$13,000.00, in the year 1939 in the principal sum of \$12,000.00 and in the year 1940 in the principal sum of \$10,000.00, and

WHEREAS, in order to carry out the plan it is now necessary to issue the 1939 series of bonds in the principal sum of \$12,000.00, to mature during the fiscal year beginning 1942 in the sum of \$4000.00, during the fiscal year beginning 1943 in the sum of \$4000.00 and during the fiscal year beginning 1944 in the sum of \$4000.00 and to issue in 1940 the 1940 series in the principal sum of \$10,000.00 to mature in the fiscal year of 1942 in the sum of \$4000.00, to mature in the fiscal year of 1943 in the sum of \$3000.00 and to mature in the fiscal year of 1944 in the sum of \$3000.00, and

WHEREAS in order to issue the aforesaid bonds it is necessary under the Constitution of the State of New York as amended to have the approval of the Comptroller of the State of New York for the issuance thereof,

NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED, that a request be made by the Supervisor to the Comptroller of the State of New York for the approval of the issuance of bonds by the Town of Cheektowaga in the amounts and in the manner as aforesaid.

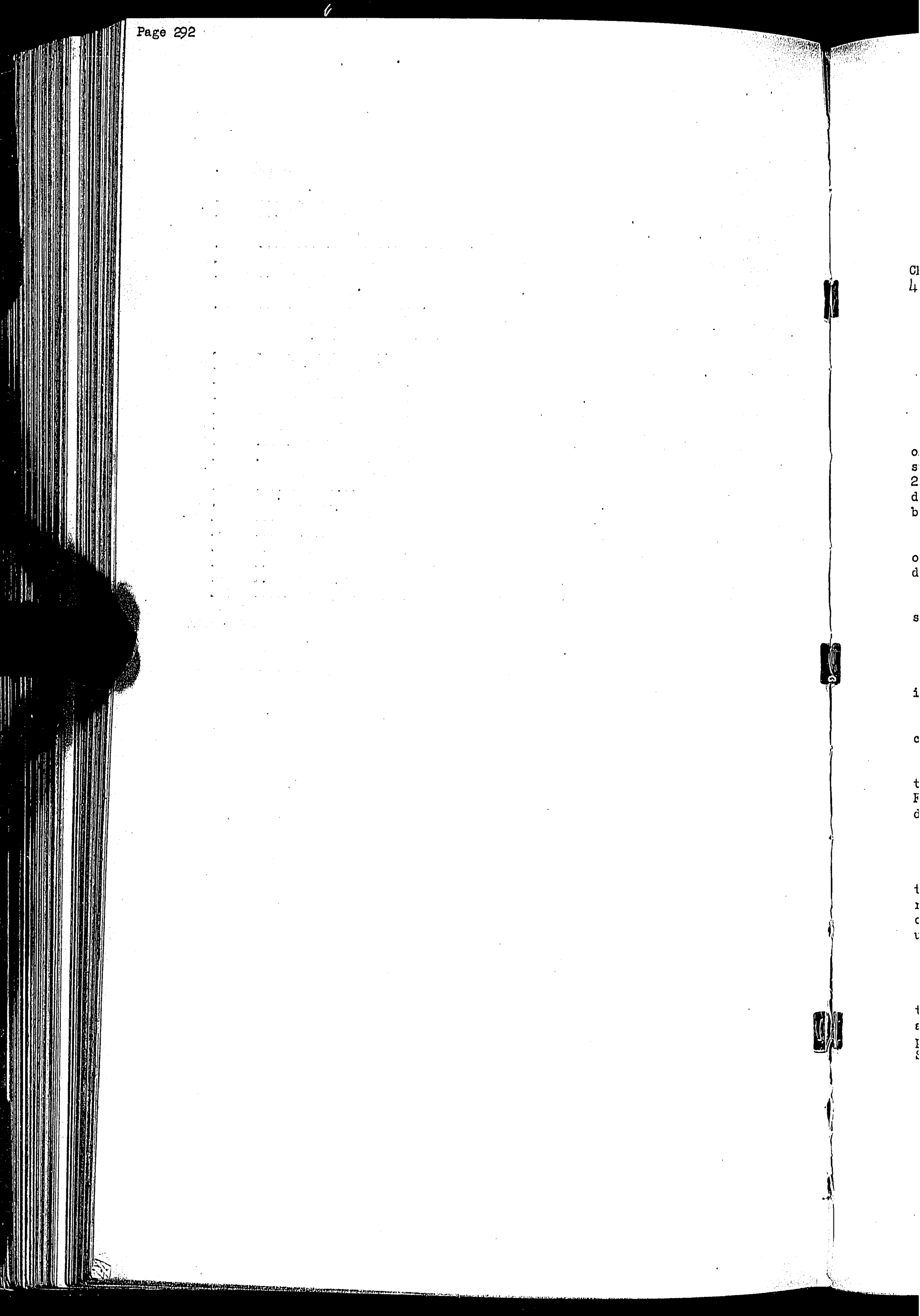

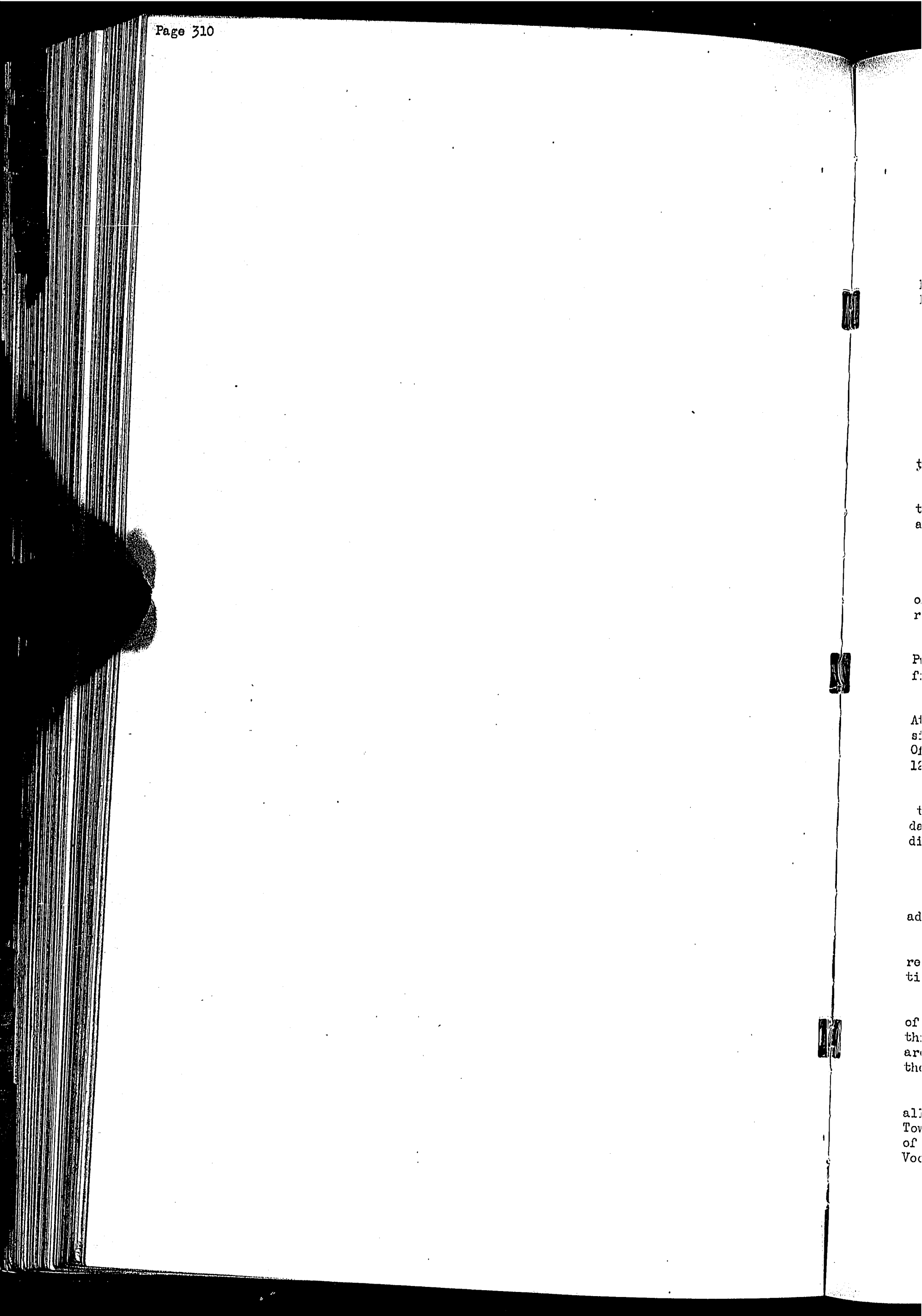
