Councilman Ladwinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption and it was seconded by Councilman Napieralski.

WHEREAS, Newell L. Nussbaumer, Consulting Engineer, has advised this Board that in the new addition to the Sewage Treatment Plant, it would be advisable to substitute face brick instead of old brick in the facing of the building so that it will conform with the facing of the old buildings in the Town, and the cost will be \$490.00, and has further advised that in the remodeling the existing imhoff tank into a primary sedimentation tank, it has been found that it is necessary to install three transverse braces across the tanks with buttress beams on the outside and one longitudinal brace in the long direction, including two buttress beams on the outside. This is to be reinforced with installing concrete for the sum of \$2978.75 and said

engineer further advises that the heating system is insufficient and for efficiency sake ought to be changed and a gas fire boiler be installed together with the necessary radiation, supports, supply and return piping, flues and other appurtenances and the same could be supplied for the sum of \$1095.00, and

WHEREAS, the Supervisor, C. Chase Zalemski, advises that there has been provided in the bond issue the sum of \$4000.00 for these extras,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT, RESOLVED, that the general contractor, C. E. Knowles Company, be and he hereby is authorized and directed to make the aforesaid changes subject to the approval of the consulting Engineer, Newell L. Nussbaumer, providing, however, the said contractor makes the amount set forth in the bond issue and reserved for such contingences and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the acceptance of the offer on behalf of C. E. Knowles Company should be made in writing, addressed to the Town Board, setting forth in detail the exact specifications of the work to be performed and the fact that said work will be performed for the sum not exceeding \$4000.00, said acceptance shall be subject to the written approval of the consulting engineer and the Town Attorney.



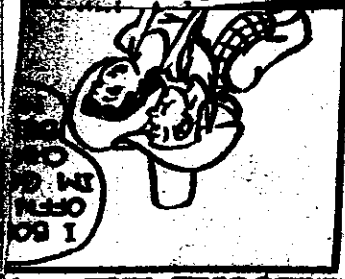

Hearing of the Zoning Commissioners of the Town of Cheektowaga, held at the Town Hall in the Courtroom therein on the 18th day of August, 1941. The meeting was opened at 7 P.M. Daylight Saving Time by the Chairman. Commissioners present were Joseph Owczarzak, George Mulligan and Michael Henfling. The Chairman asked the Town Attorney, Carlton A. Fisher to read the notice of the public hearing; he read same which had been published in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News. The Chairman announced that this was the first of several hearings, another one to be held one week from this evening on August 25, 1941 at the same time and place.

Doctor Reinstein suggested that before a building can be occupied that an occupancy permit be obtained. He further suggested that there be a minimum ground floor space for each dwelling of 528 square feet, and he also suggested that the lot size as specified in Sec. 12 of the Zoning Ordinance be changed to read 50 X 110 feet.

Regarding Sec. 18, Isidore Mazurowski asked that the sign permits be issued for a period of one year only, and renewed the following year in order to maintain the sign.

Michael Henfling suggested that some provision be made whereby dog kennels, mink farms etc. could be regulated.

Present besides Commissioners were: Isidore Mazurowski, Town Assessor and representative of the Walden District Taxpayers and the Central Council of Taxpayers; Felix Kurowski representative of the William St. Citizens and Taxpayers; and Andrew Napieralski of the Doyle Fire District No. 1.

The meeting was adjourned until one week hence, August 25, 1941 at 7 P.M.

Hearing of the Zoning Commissioners of the Town of Cheektowaga, held at the Town Hall in the Courtroom therein on the 25th day of August, 1941. The meeting was opened at 7 P.M. Daylight Saving Time by the Chairman. Commissioners present were George Mulligan and Joseph Owczarzak. Carlton A. Fisher, Town Attorney, read the notice of the meeting which had been published in the Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News.

Mr. Fisher suggested the following addition to Section 24: "No such certificate shall be issued by the Town Clerk until it has been approved by the building commissioners."

It was suggested that the word "signboard" be redefined in Definition 30 as relating to Section 18.

Dr. Reinstein suggested that two classes of residential districts be defined.

Present besides the commissioners were Dr. Reinstein and Felix Kurowski of the William St. Taxpayers Association.

The meeting adjourned until Monday, September 8, 1941.

1. Authority to Act.

Pursuant to the authority given to the Town Board by Section 266 of the Town Law (Laws of 1932, Chapter 634 effective January 1, 1934) The Town Board duly passed the following resolution appointing the members of this commission at a regular meeting of the Board held on June 16th, 1941. The resolution reads as follows:

"WHEREAS it is the desire of this Town Board to appropriately zone the Town of Cheektowaga in order to make it a more desirable place to live in in the future and to protect property,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Michael Henfling, George Mulligan and Joseph Owzarczak be and they hereby are appointed Zoning Commissioners and shall constitute a Commission to recommend to this Board the boundaries of the various original districts, and appropriate regulations to be enforced therein. Such commission shall make a preliminary report and hold public hearings thereon in accordance with the law before submitting its final report to this Town Board for appropriate action, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sum of <sup>500</sup> \$5000 be and the same hereby is appropriated for the use of said commission for payment of such clerical and professional hire as may be necessary in order to prepare their final report, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Attorney and all other officials of the Town are hereby directed to furnish the commission with all necessary information and guidance which they desire, upon the request of said commission.

2. Action of Board

The members of this Commission, pursuant to your resolution duly met and considered the boundaries of the various original districts and appropriate regulations to be enforced therein. The Commission has also made a preliminary report and has held public hearings thereon on the 18th day of August, 1941 and the second on the 25th day of August, 1941. That timely notices of said hearings was duly given by Publication of said notices of hearings in the official newspaper of the Town, The Depew Herald and Cheektowaga News as appears from the affidavits of publication attached hereto marked "Appendage A" and "Appendage B". Copy of the preliminary report is annexed hereto and marked "Appendage C".

3. Recommendations and Final Report.

A. It is recommended that the attached ordinances marked "Appendage D" be adopted as Zoning ordinances and that the attached map marked "Appendage E" be adopted as the official Zoning map of the Town, said map having been prepared by A.G. Leupold, duly qualified engineer.

B. It is further recommended that the attached building Code marked "Appendage F" be adopted as an ordinance at the same time as being a part of the Zoning Plan.

C. It is further recommended that the attached Plumbing and Drainage Code marked "Appendage G" be adopted as an ordinance at the same time as being a part of the Zoning plan.

The members of the Commission served without compensation as a public service to the community.

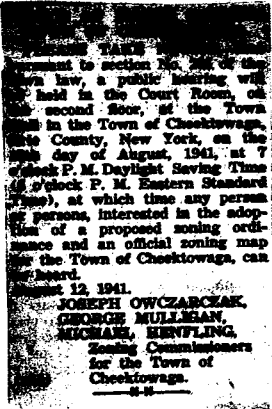

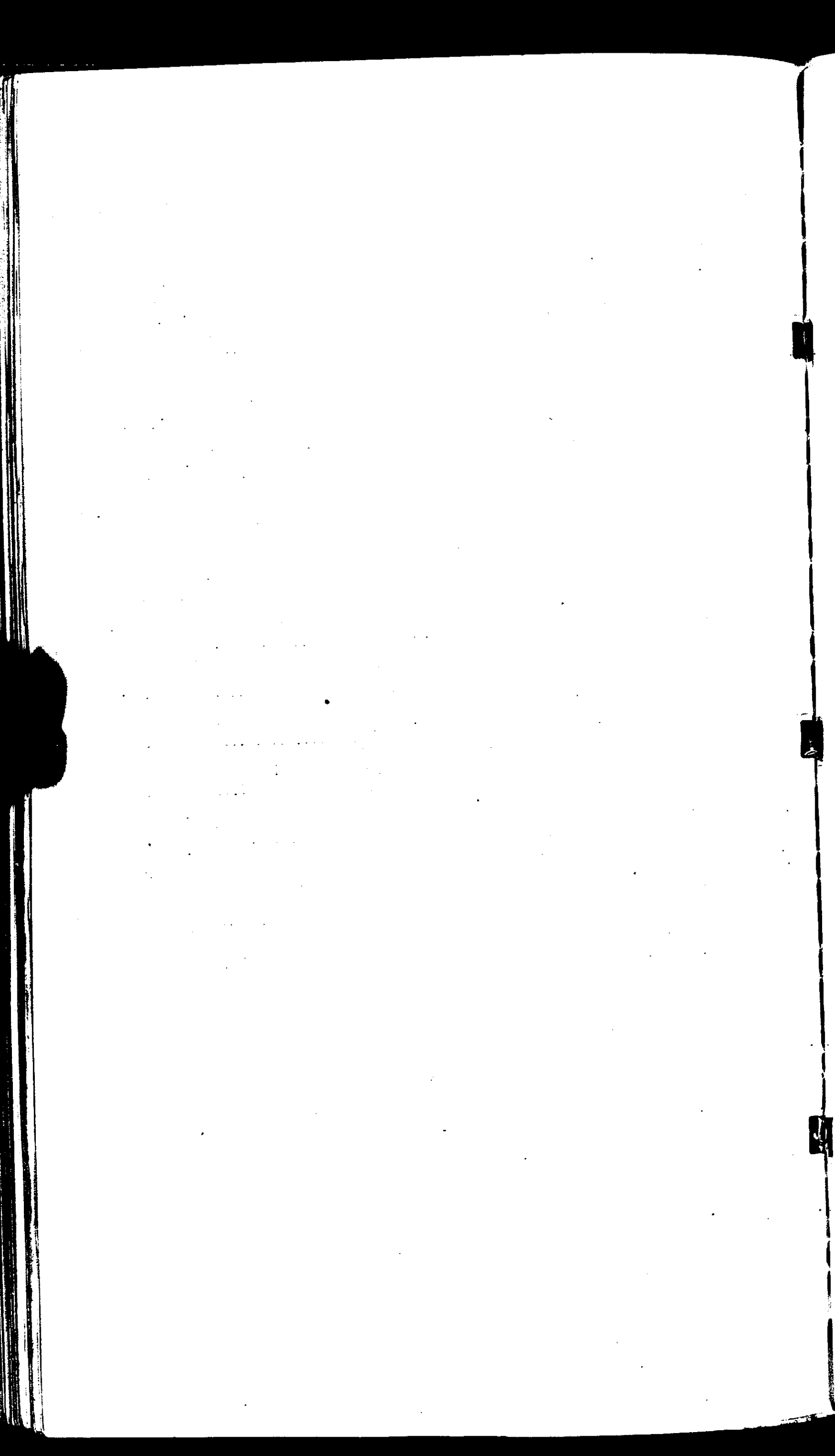
