Every act, motion or resolution shall require for its adoption the affirmative vote of a majority of all the members of the Town Board. The Board may determine the rules of its procedure, and the Supervisor may, from time to time, appoint one or more committees, consisting of members of the Board, to aid and assist the Board in the performance of its duties, and

BE IT RESOLVED, that

1. No act, motion or resolution shall be deemed to be adopted by this Board without the affirmative vote of at least three of its members.
2. Voting upon all motions, resolutions or other matters before this Board for consideration shall be oral and by ayes and noes and the Clerk of the Board shall, for the purpose of all such voting, call the roll of all members of this Board according to the Alphabetical location of the first letter of the last name of each of the members of the Board, in alphabetical order, A's first and Z's last.
3. No member of this Board present, at any given meeting thereof shall be excused from voting on any matter before the Board for vote, except upon the unanimous consent of the Board voting at such time to grant such excuse.
4. No report shall be made by any committee on any subject referred to them in the absence of a majority of said committee unless a majority of the Board so direct.
5. All questions relative to priority of business shall be decided by the Chairman without debate and his decision shall be final, unless reversed by a majority of the members then in attendance.
6. The following standing committees to consist of three members each shall be appointed by the permanent Chairman within twenty-five days after the annual organization meeting and the list of Committee shall be filed with the Town Clerk.
