The provisions of this section shall be liberally construed to prevent excessive, unreasonable, disturbing and unnecessary noise, due consideration being given to the circumstances, time of day and particular location of each violation.

Any person or corporation violating the provisions of this section shall be liable to a fine or penalty of not more than \$250.00 for each offense.

Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, of the aggregate principal amount of \$5,000 shall be issued pursuant to the bond resolution entitled "bond Resolution, dated December 31st, 1948, authorizing the issuance of \$5,000 Serial Lateral Sewer Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, pursuant to the Local Finance Law", which was adopted by the Town Board of said Town on December 31st, 1948

Section 5. Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, of the aggregate principal amount of \$5,820 shall be issued pursuant to the bond resolution entitled "Bond Resolution, dated December 31st, 1948, authorizing the issuance of \$5,820 Serial Lateral Sewer Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, pursuant to the Local Finance Law", which was adopted by the Town Board of said Town on December 31st, 1948.

Section 6. Said bonds shall consist of one bond of the denomination

of \$320 numbered 1 and twenty-seven bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 and twenty-seven bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered from 2 to 28, inclusive, in the order of their maturity, and shall be dated January 1, 1949. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate which shall not exceed five per centum (5%) per annum and such interest shall be payable semi-annually on January 1st and July 1st. Said bonds shall be payable serially as follows: One bond of the denomination of \$320 and five bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each on January 1, 1950, five bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each on January 1st in each of the years 1951 and 1952 and six bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each on January 1st in each of

the years 1953 and 1954.
Section 7. Both principal of and interest on said bonds shall be payable at the Manufacturers & Traders Turst Company, in Buffale, New York, in any coin or currency of the United States of America which at the time of payment

is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.

Section 8. A portion of the indebtedness evidenced by each bond shall be deemed to be incurred for each of the five improvements described in said bond resolutions. Such portions are the following respective percentages of the principal amount of each bond: (1) Bond resolution described in Section 1 10.98%, (2) bond resolution described in Section 2, 29.28%, (3) bond resolution described in Section 3, 20.13%, (4) bond resolution described in Section 4, 18.30%, and (5) bond resolution described in Section 5, 21.31%.

Section 9. Each of said bonds shall be payable to bearer with coupons attached for the payment of interest to bearer and such bond shall be convertible into a registered bond. Each of said bonds shall be executed by the Town Supervisor of said Town and shall be attested by the Town Clerk of said Town. Each of said bonds shall be sealed with the seal of said Town. Each of the interest coupons to be attached to said bonds shall be authen ticated by the fac-simile signature of said Town Supervisor.

Section 10. The power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said Serial Bonds, subject to the provisions of this resolution, and all powers and duties pertaining or incidental to the sale and issuance of said Serial Bonds, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate specified in the proposal to purchase said bonds which shall be accepted by the Town Supervisor at the public sale of said bonds.
