



A temporary enclosure, within the meaning of this erdinance, shall mean any structure or building in which there is installed no means for heating the interior in cold weather, either in whole or in part; or which has no roof; or which has a roof and an open side or sides; or which has no covering of a permanent nature for the openings in the same; or, apart from the land upon which it is located, said enclosure or building has a value of not more than \$1,000.00.

Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding \$250.00 for each offense.
