RESOLVED that the New York State Traffic Commission be authorized and directed to erect a Boulevard Stop and Go Sign at the intersection of Genesee Street and Buell Avenue, in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York. Seconded by Councilman Neibert. CARRIED: AYES: -3--.

Councilman Wroblewski presented the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS the Town Board on June 16, 1952, at 7:30 o'clock P.M., held a public hearing as to the advisability of the Town of Cheektowaga entering into a contract with the Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Inc., to provide fire protection for Fire Protection District No. 1; and

WHEREAS the Town Board has determined that it is in the best interests of the Town of Cheektowaga and said Fire Protection District No. 1 that a contract be entered into between the Town of Cheektowaga and the Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Inc., to provide fire protection for said District in accordance with the terms and conditions of the resolution of the Town Board adopted June 2, 1952; and

WHEREAS the annexed contract prepared by the Town Attorney correctly sets forth the terms and conditions under which said fire protection is to be furnished by said Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Inc., to said Fire Protection District No. 1, be it

RESOLVED that said contract be and the same is hereby approved; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Supervisor be authorized and directed to execute said contract on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York. Seconded by Councilman Neibert. CARRIED: AYES: -3--.

AGREEMENT

This agreement made by and between the Town of Cheektowaga, of the County of Erie and State of New York, party of the first part; and Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Inc., a corporation organized under the Membership Corporation Law of the State of New York, having its office at Bowmansville, in the Town of Lancaster, County of Erie, and State of New York, party of the second part:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga by appropriate resolution and action of its Town Board established Fire Protection District No. 1, more particularly hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS at a regular meeting of the Town Board, at the Town of Cheektowaga, held on the 2nd day of June, 1952, duly adopted a resolution calling for a public hearing to be held at the Town Hall on June 16, 1952, at 7:30 o'clock P.M., for the purpose of considering the advisability of entering into a contract with the Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Inc., to provide fire protection for said Fire Protection District; and

WHEREAS the notice of said meeting was duly published in the Cheektowaga Times, a newspaper having general circulation within said Fire Protection District, and the Town Clerk duly posted in five public places within the boundaries of said Fire Protection District a notice of said public hearing as required by said resolution; and

WHEREAS the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga met on the 16th day of June, 1952, at 7:30 o'clock P.M., and a public hearing was held by said Town Board as to the advisability of entering into said contract and an opportunity was afforded all persons interested in the subject matter to be heard, and the Town Board having decided that it would be to the best interests of the Town of Cheektowaga and said Fire Protection District that a contract be entered into between the Town of Cheektowaga and said Bowmansville Fire Association, Inc., to provide fire protection for said Fire Protection District in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in said resolution, adopted June 2, 1952, and in the notice published and posted, as therein provided; and

WHEREAS the party of the second part is willing on such terms and conditions contained in said resolution to furnish said fire protection;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00), each in hand paid to the other the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, the parties do COVENANT and AGREE:

1. The Corporation represents and agrees that it now has adequate and suitable fire fighting apparatus and equipment as well as sufficient membership and personnel to enable it to furnish suitable, prompt and adequate fire protection to the Fire Protection District hereinafter more particularly described, and it further agrees that it will at all times during the duration of this Contract, have and maintain adequate and suitable fire fighting equipment and apparatus, as well as sufficient members

and personel, to furnish suitable, adequate, and prompt fire protection to said District.

2. The Corporation agrees that it will throughout the term of this contract, furnish adequate, suitable and prompt fire protection to said Fire Protection District, and in connection therewith, it further agrees that it and its members will promptly respond to and attend any and all fire occurring in said District, and to the best of its ability will extinguish such fires and prevent loss of life and injury to person or property therefrom.

3. The Town of Cheektowaga agrees that it will pay for such services for the year commencing the 1st of January, 1953, and ending the 31st of December, 1953, and for each year thereafter until the 31st day of December, 1958, to the said Bowmansville Volunteer Fire Association, Inc., such amount of money as may be raised by an assessment at the rate of \$1.80 per thousand dollar assessed valuation, levied against the property situated within the limits of the Fire Protection District, and the payment of said moneys to be made to the Corporation between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of April each year.

4. The Corporation agrees that it will use and devote the moneys so received by it from the Town solely and exclusively to fire fighting and fire protection purposes, and to provide insurance coverages for the Town and the said district against any liability under Section 205 of the General Municipal Law.

5. The parties hereto agree that this contract shall continue to the 31st day of December, 1958, and may be renewed for the additional periods of one (1) year, by agreement of the parties hereto.

6. The Fire Protection District to which the fire protection shall be furnished as hereinbefore provided, consists, of and includes the territory and property within the following boundaries, viz:

COMMENCING in the center line of Transit Road at the north line of the Village of Depew, running thence west along the north line of the Village of Depew to the east line of the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad, thence north along the east line of the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad to the north line of lands of the West Shore Railroad, thence west along the north line of the West Shore Railroad to the west line of lands of Albert J. Schulenberg, thence north along the west line of said lands of Albert J. Schulenberg to the center line of Genesee Street, thence east along the center line of Genesee Street to the center line of the Sugg Road, thence north along the center line of Sugg Road to the north line of the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad; thence west along the north line of the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad to the center line of Spies Road, thence north along the center line of Spies Road to the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga, thence east along the north line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the east line of the Town of Cheektowaga, and thence south along the east line of the Town of Cheektowaga to the place of beginning.

WHEREAS it is necessary in connection with the extension of Sanitary Sewer District No. 3 to construct a sewer under the railroad tracks of the New York Central Railroad Company, and a consent to do so is required of the said New York Central Railroad Company, and

WHEREAS the annexed contract, dated the 6th day of October, 1952, between the New York Central Railroad Company and the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, sets forth the terms and conditions to be complied with by the Town of Cheektowaga in making such installation, and

WHEREAS Nussbaumer Clarke and Velzy, consulting engineers of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, have recommended that the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, sign the annexed agreement, be it

RESOLVED, that said agreement be and the same is hereby approved, and that the Supervisor be and he is hereby authorized to execute said contract on behalf of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York.

Seconded by Councilman Neibert. CARRIED: AYES: -3-.

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 10th day of October, 1952, between THE NEW YORK CENTRAL RAILROAD COMPANY, hereinafter called First Party, and the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, a municipal corporation organized and existing pursuant to the laws of the State of New York, hereinafter called Second Party.

WITNESSETH, that First Party, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) to it paid by Second Party, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hereby licenses and permits, but without warranty, the Second Party, upon condition that Second Party faithfully keep and perform the covenants and agreements herein provided to be kept and performed by Second Party, and not otherwise to install and maintain a twelve-inch (12") vitrified tile sewer pipe, encased in a thirty-six inch (36") reinforced concrete pipe, through the lands and under and across the roadway and tracks of First Party, at Chaining Station 2294 plus 385, at a point thirteen thousand and fifty-seven (13,057) feet easterly of BUFFALO CENTRAL STATION, on line of the railroad of First Party, in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie, State of New York; said sewer pipe and encasing pipe to be installed and maintained in accordance with detail plan thereof, submitted by Second Party and approved by First Party, and in the manner and at the point shown in yellow color, upon the map or blueprint thereof, which is hereto attached and hereby made a part of this instrument, all of which is hereinafter referred to as the "WORK," upon the following terms and conditions, all of which Second Party covenants and agrees to keep, abide by and perform:

FIRST: Said work shall be done at such time or times, in such manner, which such material and under such general conditions as shall be satisfactory to and approved by the Chief Engineer of First Party, or his duly authorized agent, and as will not interfere with the proper and safe use, operation, and enjoyment of the property and railroad of First Party. Second Party shall after the doing of said WORK restore the premises of First Party to the same or as good a condition as they were in prior to the commencement of the doing of said WORK.

SECOND: All the work to be done by Second Party, or by the contractors, agents or servants of Second Party, in connection with the doing of said WORK, or in connection with the repair, renewal or maintenance thereof, shall be done at the sole risk and expense of Second Party, and the cost of all work done by First Party in connection therewith, the checking of plans and the wages of any inspectors or watchmen which, in the judgment of the said Chief Engineer of First Party, may be required during the doing of said WORK, or in connection with the repair, renewal, maintenance or use thereof, for the proper and safe protection of the property, traffic, and business of First Party, shall be paid to First Party by Second Party, upon bills being rendered therefor.

THIRD: First Party may, at its election, do all the work within the exterior lines of its lands in connection with or necessary for the doing of said WORK, or in connection with the repair, renewal, maintenance or use thereof, through its lands and across its roadway and tracks, and all of said WORK shall be paid for by Second Party as hereinbefore provided.

FOURTH: Second Party shall, if requested so to do by First Party, advance to First Party the estimated cost of said work, and upon completion of said WORK, the unexpended balance, if any, shall be returned to Second Party, or if the sum advanced by Second Party to First Party is insufficient to pay for the cost of said WORK, then Second Party shall pay to First Party such additional sum as was necessary to complete said WORK, upon being furnished by First Party with a detailed statement of the amount and cost of such additional work.

FIFTH: Whenever it may be necessary to make any repairs to or renewals of said WORK in or upon the premises of First Party, such repairs or renewals shall be made under the supervision and control of said Chief Engineer of First Party, or his duly authorized agent, at the sole expense of Second Party, in such a manner as to interfere as little as possible with the premises, property and business of First Party, and Second Party shall, at the cost and expense of Second Party, restore the premises of First Party to the same or as good a condition as they were in prior to the making of such repairs or renewals; or First Party may, at its election, make such repairs or renewals, and the expense thereof shall be paid to it by Second Party, as hereinbefore provided.

SIXTH: Second Party shall and will at all times hereafter indemnify and save harmless First Party from and against any and all detriment, damages, losses, claims, demands, suits, costs, or expenses which First Party may suffer, sustain, or be subject to, indirectly or directly, caused either wholly or in part by reason of the location, construction, maintenance, use or presence of said WORK as permitted by this license or resulting from the removal thereof.

SEVENTH: This agreement and the license and privilege it confers may be revoked and terminated at the option of First Party at any time by giving thirty (30) days' written notice to Second Party or by posting such notice in a conspicuous place where said WORK has been done; and upon the expiration of said thirty (30) days after service, this agreement and the license and privilege hereby granted shall be absolutely terminated and extinguished; and thereupon, Second Party shall remove said WORK from the premises of First Party and restore same to their former condition at the expense of Second Party, or on the failure of Second Party, so to do, First Party may remove said WORK at the expense of Second Party, which the latter hereby expressly agrees to pay on demand.

EIGHTH: It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that if, at any time or times hereafter, First Party shall desire to make any changes in its tracks, structures, roadbed or other facilities at the point of crossing, or make any changes whatever, in, to, upon, over or under the premises owned, controlled or leased by said First Party, and crossed or in any way affected by the WORK of Second Party under this agreement, then Second Party shall, at its own cost and expense, upon thirty (30) days' notice in writing to that effect from First Party, make such changes in the location or construction of its said WORK, as in the judgment of the Chief Engineer of First Party may be necessary to accommodate any future construction, improvements or changes of said First Party.

NINTH: It is agreed that in no event shall any wires, pipes or other structures, except those herein mentioned and shown on the blueprint hereto attached, be strung or placed across the tracks or upon the property of First Party, without express permission so to do, in writing from said First Party, to that effect; and that in that event, all the terms and conditions of this agreement shall immediately, upon the giving of such permission for the stringing and placing of such additional wires, pipes or other structures, apply to and cover the same with the same effect as if the right to string or place them had been incorporated in this agreement.

TENTH: It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that if at any time during the continuance of this agreement, Second Party hereto removes, abandons or discontinues the use of the WORK hereinabove referred to, this agreement and all rights hereby conferred upon said Second Party shall be deemed to be abrogated and determined as of the date of such removal, abandonment or discontinuance, without other or further action on the part of either party; and Second Party covenants and agrees that, in case the said WORK hereinabove referred to is at any time during the continuance of this agreement discontinued or abandoned, second Party shall, within sixty (60) days after the abandonment or discontinuance of said WORK, actually remove said WORK from the premises of First Party hereto, or cause it to be removed, and, if after the expiration of said sixty (60) days the said WORK is not

actually removed, it is understood that First Party hereto may forthwith remove the same at the risk and expense of Second Party, and without being in any manner liable to said Second Party for such removal, and Second Party covenants and agrees to pay to First Party hereto the cost of such removal upon bill therefor rendered to Second Party.

ELEVENTH: In addition to the consideration hereinbefore mentioned, and as a further consideration, Second Party hereby covenants and agrees to pay First Party, as rental for the privilege of crossing the private lands of the First Party, the sum of Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) per annum, payable in advance, the first payment to be made as of the first day of October, 1952.

The covenants and agreements herein contained shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of, the heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns of the parties hereto respectively.

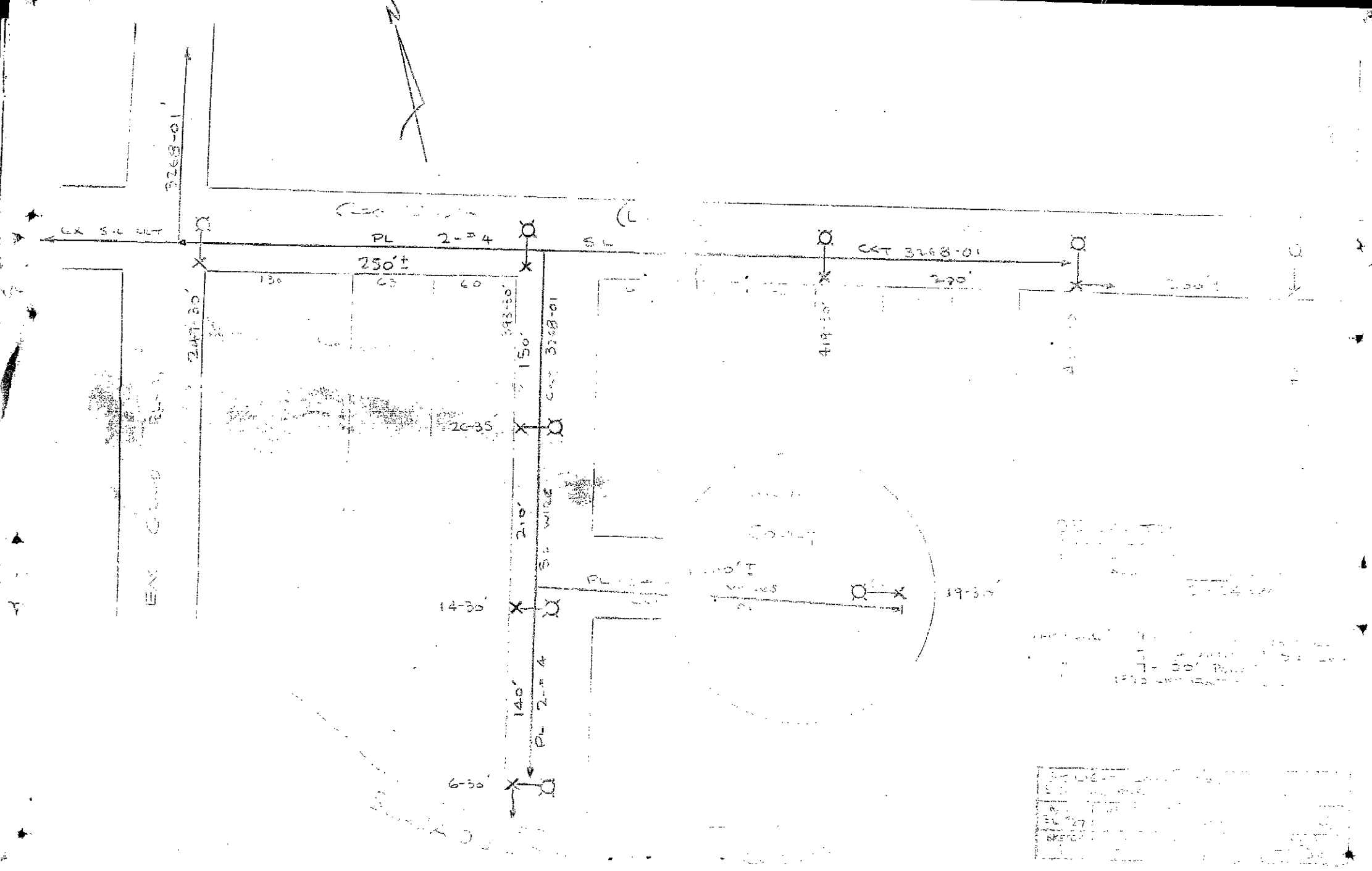

At this location the sewer was lowered about 18 inches to avoid existing utilities. It was hoped that bid unit prices might apply to the additional depth. However, ground conditions different than any other location encountered on the job were found requiring pumping, tight sheeting, special foundations, and other expensive precautions not required on other work. 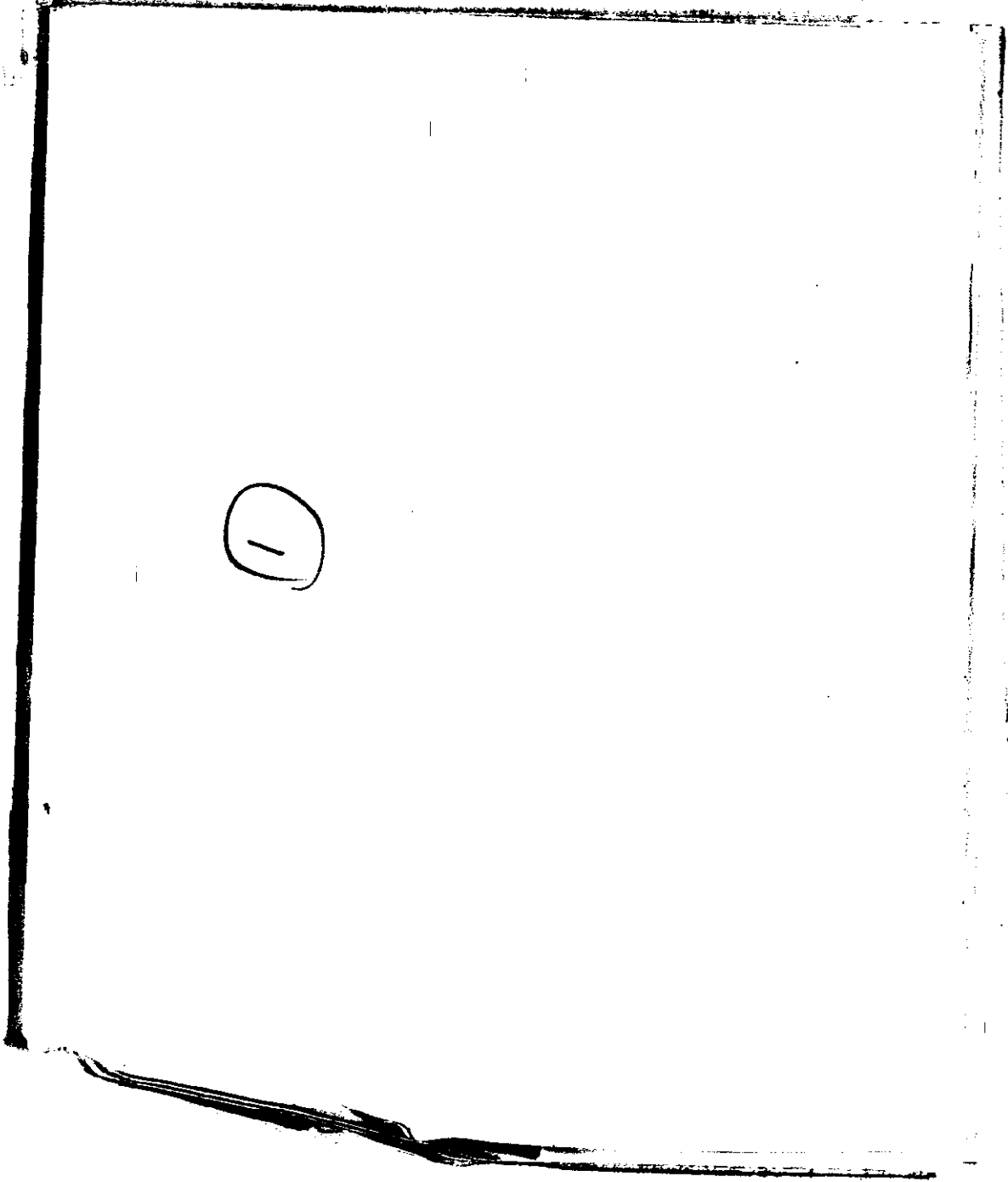
