BE IT RESOLVED that the Zoning Ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, be amended by adding thereto Section 20B, FUNERAL HOMES OR MORTUARIES, to read as follows:

I-FUNERAL HOME OR MORTUARY IN A RESIDENCE DISTRICT OR IN A BUSINESS DISTRICT ADJOINING A RESIDENCE DISTRICT

No funeral home or mortuary shall be located in a residence district or in a business district adjoining a residence district, except by resolution of the Town Board. The application therefor must be accompanied by the written consent for such use by the owners of not less than 60% of the frontage and not less than 60% of the owners of all premises located on either side of the street and within four hundred (400) feet of the applicant's premises.

The consent shall also include the signature of all owners of property immediately adjoining the applicant's premises on the same side of the street.

The application shall be accompanied by a map or plan indicating the parcel of land and buildings thereon, the building area to be devoted to funeral services, the location and extent of off-street parking to be provided on the premises, and the driveway or driveways.

In default of such written consent, notice of a public hearing shall be given to all owners within the above specified distance by service of a copy of the notice of hearing or by registered mail at least eight (8) days prior to the date set for said hearing.

The public hearing, with respect to the application, shall be held by the Town Board. It shall be the duty of the Town Board to deny the application if the location of said FUNERAL HOME or MORTUARY seriously interferes with the flow of traffic on the highway, or if sufficient off-street parking space is not provided.

If a public hearing is required, the applicant shall pay a fee of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) to defray the cost to the Town in connection with such public hearing.

II-FUNERAL HOME OR MORTUARY IN A BUSINESS DISTRICT.

No Funeral Home or Mortuary shall be located in a business district as the same is defined in the Zoning Ordinances, except by resolution of the Town Board. The application for such authorization must be accompanied by the written consent for such use by the owners of not less than 60 % of the frontage and not less than 60 % of the owners of all premises located on either side of the street and within four hundred (400) feet of the applicant's premises. The consent shall also include the



signatures of all owners of property immediately adjoining the applicants' premises on the same side of the street.

The application shall be accompanied by a map or plan indicating the parcel of land and buildings thereon, the building area to be devoted to funeral services, and the location and extent of off-street parking to be provided on the premises and the driveway or driveways.

In default of such written consent, notice of public hearing shall be given to all owners within the above specified distance by service of a copy of the notice of hearing or by registered mail at least eight (8) days prior to the date set for the hearing.

Such public hearing, with respect to the application, shall be held by the Town Board. It shall be the duty of the Town Board to deny the application if the location of said Funeral Home or Mortuary seriously interferes with the flow of traffic on the highway, or if sufficient off-street parking space is not provided.

If a public hearing is required, the applicant shall pay a fee of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) to defray the cost to the Town in connection with such public hearing.

It has given me a great deal of personal satisfaction to be able to continue in a field of learning for which I have been trained. The personal feeling of satisfaction in being of service to you and the township is in direct proportion to my joy in being able to feel a part of the township.

All of my activities and exhibit material would not have been possible had not you so generously allocated funds for the work of the Town Historian. I hope that you feel repaid. I shall continue to work on the different aspects of local history, in an effort to assemble additional material, which will be of value, not only to town officials, but also to the residents of the township and others who are interested in our town.

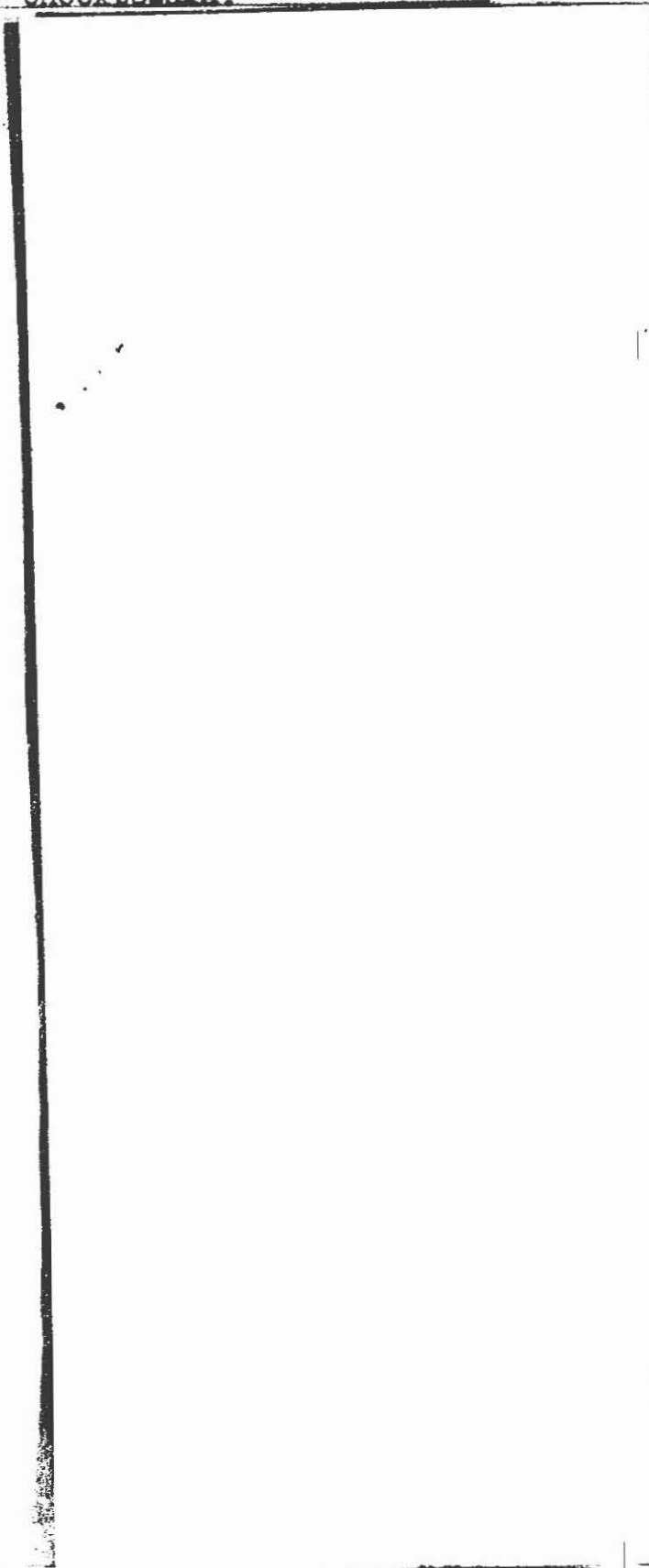

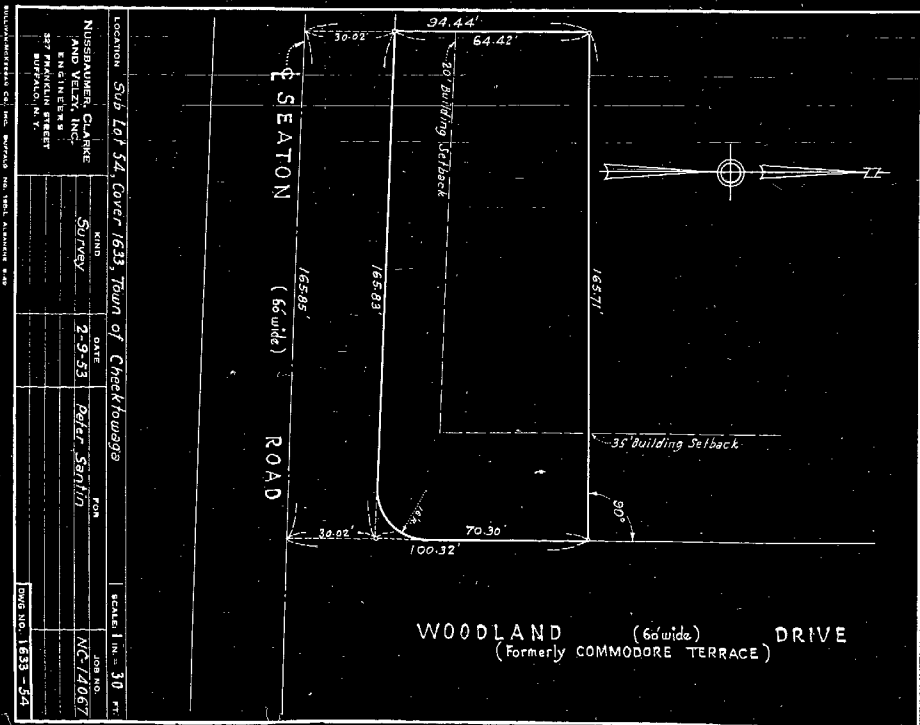

Mr. Ulsh went on to tell the Board that they operate with the very latest scientific equipment, and that in one instance they have used a seismograph to measure blasting operations and that the result showed that the blasts transfer any inconvenience to the surrounding neighbors.

At the request of the Town Board Mr. Ulsh went on record to the effect that the Federal Crushed Stone Company would make an investigation of the complaints filed with the Board.

The Town Attorney advised the complainants that only the Supreme Court can control blasting operations alleged to be damaging homes in their part of the Town.
