The petition to zone a large tract of land on Genesee Street, of approximately 12 acres, as hereinafter described, from "Residence" to "Business" for sales and display of house trailers has been carefully considered by the Zoning Board of Appeals.

It has inspected the property involved and has also made an inspection of the location of trailers throughout the Town of Cheektowaga, New York. The Zoning Board of Appeals has been advised that it is the policy of the Town not to allow trailers to be located in the Town of Cheektowaga for residence purposes for the reason that the same does not comply with the requirements of the Building Code.

In only one instance has a permit been granted under Section 32 of the Zoning Ordinances of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, which regulate the establishment of tourist parks or camps. Since the granting of this permit many towns and communities throughout the State of New York have banned trailer camps. We recommend to the Town Board that no more trailer camps be allowed to locate in the Town of Cheektowaga.

While this application to rezone is not for the purpose of establishing a trailer camp but for a display room for the sale of trailers, we are of the opinion that it falls in the same category and cannot be permitted because of the provisions of Section 14 a of the Zoning Ordinances.

If this display room for the sale of trailers was allowed to do business in the Town of Cheektowaga, some people would be induced to purphase trailers on the theory that the same could be located within the town.

We believe it would be to the best interests of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, if this application were denied without prejudice, and the petitioners applying for "Business" zoning for some other purpose.




