This Agreement made this 17th day of October, 1955, by and between the Town of Cheektowaga, a municipal corporation of the State of New York with its office and principal place of Business in the County of Erie, State of New York, party of the first part and Zygfried Pieczynski, Bernard Pieczynski and Stanley Michalak, d/b/a Cayuga Construction Co., a domestic corporation, organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New York with its office and principal place of business in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, parties of the Second part;

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the parties of the second part are the owners of the abutting property on Vern Lane, commencing 500 feet of the north line of William Street and extending in a northerly direction a distance of 500 feet, and

WHEREAS, the parties of the second part have constructed the foundation for the highway and have also constructed in said highway, sanitary sewers and have entered into a contract with the Erie County Water Authority for the construction of a water line in said highway and have paid the Erie County Water Authority the cost thereof, and

WHEREAS, the parties of the second part have requested the Town of Cheektowaga, to accept, as a Town Highway, Vern Lane, commencing 500 feet north of the north line of William Street and extending in a northerly direction a distance of 500 feet and have agreed to enter into a contract with the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, to place the topping on said street and complete the same so that the same will comply with the specifications of the Town Highway Department and the regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, it is hereby

AGREED, that the parties of the second part agree to place topping on Vern Lane, commencing 500 feet north of the north line of William Street and extending in a northerly direction a distance of 500 feet on or before _____. It further agrees, where necessary, to reconstruct the foundation of said highway and complete the same so that said highway will conform in every respect, with the specifications of the Town Highway Department and the regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, it is further

UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED, that the parties of the second part will furnish the party of the first part, a Surety Bond, executed by a Bonding Company authorized to do business in the State of New York, in the sum of \$2,500.00, said Bond to provide, that the parties of the second part will, in all respects, conform with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the accompanying resolution of the Town Board on or before 10-17-55. In the event the parties of the second part fail to live up to the terms of this Agreement, then the party of the first part is authorized to complete said highway so that the same comply in every respect with the minimum specifications of the Town Highway Department and the regulations of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, and all expenses incurred by it in completing said highway shall be paid by the parties of the second part and its surety, and in the event said sum of \$2,500.00 is insufficient to pay such cost, then the parties of the second part hereby agree to pay any sum required in excess of that amount, it is however,

AGREED, that the maximum liability of the Surety Company is limited to the sum of \$2,500.00 and the parties of the second part agree to file in the Town Clerk's Office, the agreement by Pomeroy Organization, Inc., that it will withhold the sum of \$250.00 from the final draw on all mortgages processed by it.

Upon filing with the Town Board an executed copy of this Agreement and the Surety Company Bond, it is agreed that the party of the first part does hereby accept said highway as a Town Highway, subject to the jurisdiction of the Town Highway Superintendent.

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TO: THE CHEEKTOWAGA TOWN COUNCIL

We, the undersigned, as residents and electors of Cheektowaga, New York, submit the following for your earnest consideration.
WHEREAS

1. The Ward System of Town Government was duly adopted as of November, 1953, at the general town election, by a substantial margin.
2. The system again was voted upon in March 1955, this time at a special election called by action of the Town Council itself.
3. In spite of very limited voting facilities and hours some 8500 votes were cast at the special election.
4. The result of the special election revealed that only 120 ballots were the margin of difference, in spite of a well organized and financed campaign waged against the system.
5. The special election, referred to, cost the taxpayers some \$6000.00, the same question submitted to the people at the coming general Town election would cost not a penny.
6. The special election failed to afford each and every voter a fair opportunity to vote because of short hours and only ten polling places as compared with forty-seven election districts available at the general town election in November.
7. The special election was held by paper ballot instead of automatic voting machine. This resulted in confusion, and many voters, for some small technical error, lost their right to be heard at the polls.
8. Serious legal obstacles exist which make it next to impossible to petition the council as prescribed by law.

THEREFORE, we respectfully request and strongly urge the town council to place this serious question on the voting machines as of our next general Town Election to be held November 8, 1955.

We feel it is the solemn duty of the council to follow the precedent which they have set in the past and by their own motion cause this question to appear on the voting machines this Fall.

To do so is to save the Town Taxpayers some \$6000.00 and at the same time carry out their public trust in responding to the will of the voters. Not to do so is to defy the taxpayers in saving his tax dollar, and to reject the reasonable and fair request of the undersigned.

Mr. Charles Wohlfert requested the Town Board to debate the petition filed for the establishment of the Ward System for the Election of Town Councilmen, referring to the fact that the petition bears approximately 1500 signatures.

Supervisor Holtz advised the audience that the Town Board would debate the aforementioned petition on Wednesday evening, October 19, 1955, at 7:30 o'clock P.M. 17

Section 2. The specific object or purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") to be financed pursuant to this resolution is the construction of a lateral sewer in that portion of Chessie Street extending from Midland Drive, northeasterly

200 feet, towards East Grand Boulevard so as to serve both sides of said highway in accordance with a resolution adopted by the Town Board of said Town of Chestotnaga, New York, on the 2nd day of May, 1958.

Section 3. The expense of making the improvement described in Section 2 of this resolution shall be borne by local assessment upon the several lots and parcels of land which the Town Board shall determine and specify to be especially benefited by such improvement. An amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said Serial Bonds, as the same shall become due, shall be annually apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land especially benefited by such improvement shall become due in proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall confer upon the same, in accordance with Subdivision 2 of Section 231 of the Town Law of New York.

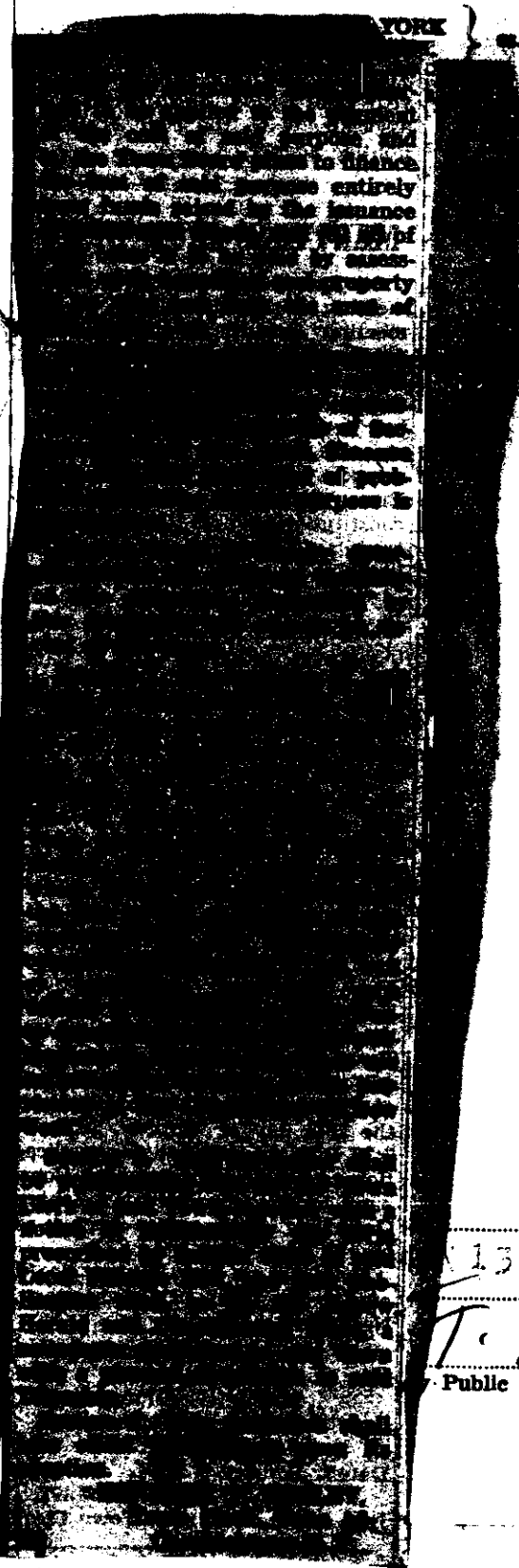

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, as follows:

Section 1. The Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, shall issue its bond anticipation notes of the aggregate principal amount of \$2,200.00 pursuant to the Local Finance Law of New York, in order to finance in Sewer District No. 5 of the Town of Cheektowaga the construction of a lateral sewer in that portion of GENESEE STREET extending from Midland Drive, northeasterly 290 feet, towards East Grand Boulevard, so as to serve both sides of said highway, in anticipation of the sale of \$2,200.00 Serial Bonds authorized by the bond resolution entitled "Bond Resolution dated the 19th day of December, 1955, authorizing the issuance of \$2,200.00 Serial Bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, pursuant to the Local Finance Law, to finance the construction of a lateral sewer", adopted by the Town Board on December 19, 1955.

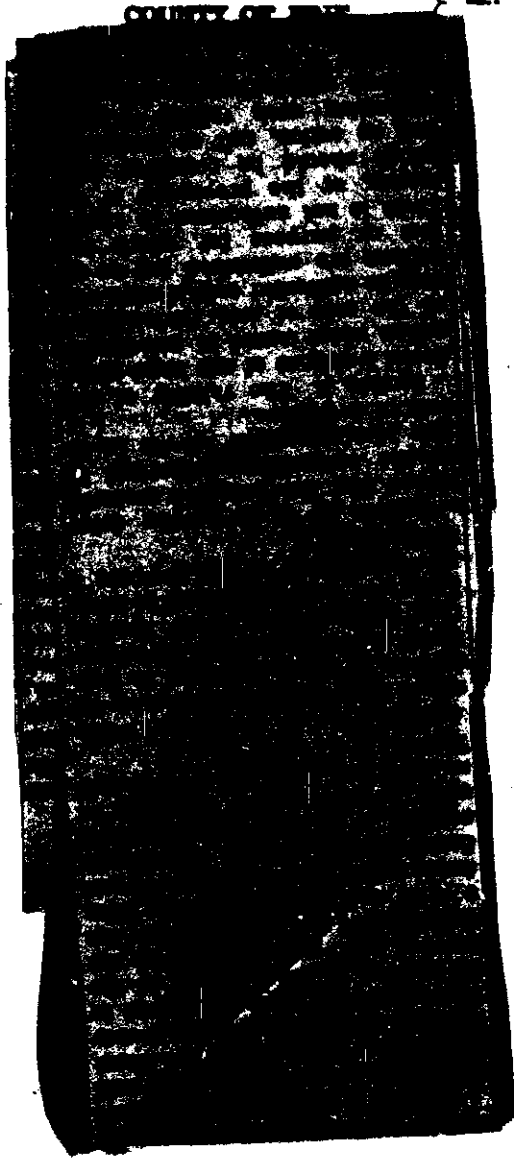
