Item No. 4 Councilman Fath presented the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, a public hearing was conducted on September 19, 1960 to consider the advisability of entering into a contract with the Cleveland Hill Fire District No. 6, to provide fire protection for fire protection District No. 2 (Tiorunda) for a term of 5 years terminating January 1, 1965, in accordance with proposed agreement attached hereto, and

WHEREAS, all interested parties were afforded an opportunity to be heard concerning this matter, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board deems it advisable to enter into this contract.

Item No. 4-Cont'd.AGREEMENT

This Agreement made this 3 day of October, 1960, by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, County of Erie and State of New York, party of the first part; and

CLEVELAND HILL FIRE DISTRICT NO. 6, of the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, party of the second part:

## WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga by appropriate resolution and action of its Town Board has established a Fire Protection District No. 2, and

WHEREAS, the party of the second part has submitted a proposal to the Town Board to provide fire protection for said Fire Protection District No. 2, for the term of five (5) years to commence January 1, 1960 and to end on January 1, 1965, subject to a right of termination at the end of any year as more fully hereinafter set forth, and a Notice of a public hearing upon said proposal specifying the time when and the place where the said Town Board would meet to consider said proposal and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same having been duly published and posted as required by law, and the hearing having taken place at the Town Hall, corner of Union Road and Broadway, Town of Cheektowaga, New York, on the 19th day of September, 1960, at which hearing all persons interested in the subject thereof having been given an opportunity to be heard and the Town Board having given due deliberation thereof, and

WHEREAS, the party of the second part represents and agrees that it now has adequate and suitable fire fighting apparatus and equipment as well as sufficient members and personnel to enable it to furnish suitable, prompt and adequate fire protection to the Fire Protection District No. 2, and it further represents and agrees that it will at all times during the duration of this contract have and maintain adequate and suitable fire fighting equipment and apparatus as well as sufficient members and personnel to furnish suitable, adequate and prompt fire protection to said district, and

WHEREAS, it would be to the best interests of the Town of Cheektowaga, and particularly to the residents and owners of property within said Fire Protection District No. 2, that the proposal made by the Cleveland Hill Fire District No. 6 be accepted,

NOW, THEREFORE,

In consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, it is agreed:

1. The party of the second part agrees that it will throughout the term of this contract furnish adequate, suitable and prompt fire protection to said Fire Protection District No. 2 and in connection therewith, it further agrees that it and its fire company will promptly respond to and attend any and all fires occurring in said District and to the best of its and their ability will extinguish such fires and prevent loss of life and injury to person or property therefrom.

2. The Town of Cheektowaga agrees that it will pay for such services to the party of the second part the sum of Forty-five hundred dollars (\$4,500.00) plus the cost of the water and hydrant rental to be paid the Erie County Water Authority for providing water and hydrants within said Fire Protection District No.2.

3. That the said amount of Forty-five hundred dollars (\$4,500.00) to be paid Cleveland Hill Fire District No. 6, Cheektowaga, New York, shall include all of the expenses in providing fire protection for said District, excepting the cost of water and hydrant rental.

Item No. 4-Cont'd.

4. It is agreed that the party of the second part will enter into a contract with the Erie County Water Authority for water and hydrant rental, and the party of the first part agrees to reimburse the party of the second part any amount it may be required to pay to the Erie County Water Authority for water and hydrant rental.

5. It is understood and agreed that the party of the first part shall have the right to terminate this contract at the end of any year providing in the meantime a fire district is created to include the property of Fire Protection District No. 2 of the Town of Cheektowaga, New York.

6. It is further agreed that in the event of a cancellation, that written notice of four (4) months will be given the party of the second part by the party of the first part.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this instrument to be signed by their duly authorized officers and their corporate seals affixed thereto this 3 day of October, 1960.

CAPITAL NOTE RESOLUTION DATED OCTOBER 3, 1960, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$9,025.52 LIGHTING DISTRICT CAPITAL NOTES OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, as follows:

Section 1. In order to finance the specific object or purpose hereinafter described, the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, shall issue its Capital Notes of the aggregate principal amount of \$9,025.52, pursuant to the Local Finance Law of New York.

Section 2. The specific object or purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") to be financed pursuant to this resolution, is the purchase and installation of street lighting equipment pursuant to Section 198 of the Town Law of New York, along the highways as hereinafter set forth, to serve properties on both sides of said highways, to wit:

- a) Ceil Drive from William Street to end of street.
- b) Cathedral Lane from McNaughton Avenue to McNaughton Avenue.
- c) Harris Court from Dick Road to Dick Road.
- d) Trudy Lane from Ceil Drive to Ceil Drive.
- e) Ruth Drive from Cathedral Lane to Cathedral Lane.
- f) Darwin Drive from Cleveland Drive north to the Amherst Town Line.
- g) Wallace Avenue from Broadway to Grunner Road.
- h) Tudor Road from S1. 35 to S1. 177/178 inclusive.

Item No. 9-Cont'd

Section 3. It is hereby stated that:

a) The maximum cost of said purpose as estimated by the Town Board is \$9,025.52.

b) No money has heretofore been applied to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

c) The Town Board plans to finance the cost of said purpose from funds raised by the issuance of said Capital Notes.

d) All of such cost is to be paid by assessments upon benefited real property in an area less than the area of said Town.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in Subdivision 35 of Paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is five years.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will not be later than April 1, 1962.

Section 6. This resolution shall be published in full by the Town Clerk of said Town, together with a notice in substantially the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of said Local Finance Law, and such publication shall be in the DEPEW HERALD AND CHEEKTOWAGA NEWS, a newspaper published in the Town of Cheektowaga and having a general circulation in said Town. The validity of said Capital Notes may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to spend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution were not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication; or if said obligations were authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

WHEREAS, the Capital Note resolution hereinafter referred to has taken effect in accordance with law and the Town Board desires to make provision for the issuance of the notes authorized by said Capital Note resolution; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, as follows:

Item No. 9-Cont'd.

(1) Capital Notes of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, of the aggregate principal amount of \$9,025.52, shall be issued pursuant to the Capital Note resolution entitled "Capital Note Resolution Dated October 3, 1960, Authorizing the Issuance of \$9,025.52 Lighting District Capital Notes of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, Pursuant to the Local Finance Law". Said Capital Notes shall be designated "Lighting District Capital Notes, Series A of 1960". Said Capital Notes shall consist of two notes of the denomination of \$4,512.76 each, numbered 1 and 2, in the order of their maturity, and shall constitute an issue of Capital Notes payable in annual installments on April 1 in each of the Years 1961 and 1962.

(2) Each of said Capital Notes shall be dated as of a date subsequent to October 3, 1960, and shall bear interest from their date at the rate of Three Percent (3%) per annum. The interest on the Capital Notes shall be payable April 1, 1961, and thereafter on October 1 and April 1.

(3) Both principal of and interest on said Capital Notes shall be payable at the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company of Buffalo, in Buffalo, New York, in any coin or currency of the United States of America which at the time of payment is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.

(4) Each of said Capital Notes shall be payable to bearer and shall be convertible into a registered Capital Note. Each of said Capital Notes shall be executed by the Town Supervisor of said Town and shall be attested by the Town Clerk of said Town. Each of said Capital Notes shall be sealed with the seal of said Town.

(5) The power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said Capital Notes, subject to the provisions of this resolution, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor. Said Capital Notes shall be sold to the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company of Buffalo, New York, at private sale, and shall bear an interest rate of 3% per annum.

(6) The faith and credit of the Town are hereby pledged to the payment of said notes and the interest thereon as the same become due and payable.

BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE RESOLUTION, DATED OCTOBER 3, 1960, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$19,000 BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE, IN ANTICIPATION OF THE SALE OF SERIAL BONDS AUTHORIZED TO FINANCE PARK AND PLAYGROUND IMPROVEMENTS

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, as follows:

Section 1. The Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, shall issue its Bond Anticipation Notes of the aggregate principal amount of \$19,000, pursuant to the Local Finance Law of New York, in order to finance the specific purpose hereinafter described, in anticipation of the issuance of \$19,000 Serial Bonds authorized by the bond resolution entitled "Bond Resolution, Dated July 11, 1960, Authorizing the Issuance of \$19,000 Serial Bonds and \$1,000 Capital Notes of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, Pursuant to the Local Finance Law, for Park and Playground Improvements", adopted by the Town Board on July 11, 1960.

Section 2. The specific object or purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") to be financed pursuant to this resolution, is the improvement of the public park or playground which is located on Dingens Street near Harlem Road in the Town of Cheektowaga and is maintained by said Town as a public park or playground, by constructing thereon a Class "B" (fire-resistant) building, as defined in Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, for use as a comfort station, and installing therein the equipment needed for its use, and the grading or other improvement of its site.

Item No. 10-Cont'd.

Section 3. As required by said Local Finance Law, it is hereby stated that (a) there are no outstanding Bond Anticipation Notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said Serial Bonds, and (b) the notes authorized by this resolution are not renewal notes, and (c) the notes authorized by this resolution shall mature within one year from the date of their issue, and (d) such notes are not issued in anticipation of bonds for an assessable improvement.

Section 4. The power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said Bond Anticipation Notes, subject to the provisions of this resolution, and to sell and deliver said Bond Anticipation Notes, is hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor. The Town Supervisor is hereby directed to sign any Bond Anticipation Notes issued pursuant to this resolution and the Town Clerk is hereby directed to affix to such notes the corporate seal of the Town of Cheektowaga and to attest such seal.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Item No. 5 Ordered received and filed communication from the Town Park Home Owners Association relating to odors emanating from Disposal Plant No. 5.

Item No. 6 Petition presented bearing the signatures of approximately 125 persons complaining about foul odors emanating from Disposal Plant No. 5.

James Hartzell of No. 33 Eastland Parkway was granted the floor and spoke in regard to same petition.

Mr. Boje of No. 65 Eastland Parkway also spoke.

Mr. Newell Nussbaumer of Nussbaumer, Clarke and Velzy of the Town of Cheektowaga spoke on the situation and filed the attached communication with the Board:

Town of Cheektowaga, New York - Sewer District No. 5  
Sewage Treatment Plant Operation Comments  
October 17, 1960

Requested to attend a Town Board Meeting on October 17, 1960. Had a meeting with Frank Lunz, Plant Superintendent, and Albert Kamm, Town Engineer. They stated that several residents in houses to the west of the Plant and also to the north, near George Urban Boulevard, have complained about the operation of the waste gas burner, the escape of gases, noise from the pumping station at night and miscellaneous odors. We find that the operators have had trouble with the escape of gases from the digesters, because the excess gas cannot be burned fast enough in the waste gas burner. This may be caused by some stoppage in the piping. A contributory cause may be the overloading of the digesters because the sludge cannot be dried fast enough on the open beds. The glass covered bed is not in good operating condition and the vacuum filter has not been operated for some time. When transferring sludge at the sludge well, some odor also occurs. The procedure is now being studied to avoid this situation. In any case, a solution is being investigated.

Item No. 6-Cont'd.

The proposed expansion of the Plant includes some additional open sludge drying beds, an additional digester, vacuum filters and a small sludge incinerator.

There is a noticeable odor from the sprinkling filters in the summer, when pre-chlorination is omitted. Recently, due to a breakdown, chlorination could not be applied for several days. This situation will not continue.

We are now investigating the possibility of installing a second waste gas burner at a different location and the use of a deodorant to be used on the settling tanks. Experiments in the use of the deodorants are now being conducted at a Plant in Nassau County, on Long Island, where we are now doing work. A report on this will be made in the near future.

Some people have suggested moving the Plant. It should be pointed out that the Plant was built in 1926, originally, and has been successively enlarged at various times. The people who are now complaining are relatively few as compared with the 55,000 people being served by the Plant. The Town has an investment in the Plant of about \$4,000,000, which on a replacement basis would probably cost over \$5,000,000, making some allowance for economies in rebuilding the Plant all at one time. The location is further determined by a stream into which the effluent can be discharged. Even though the Plant were moved to some other location, it would still be necessary to retain the pumping facilities at the Plant site and probably the chlorination facilities. In addition to the cost of a new Plant on a new site, there would also be required, a forcemain from the present site to the new site and probably the installation of a higher horsepower motor to pump the flow to the Plant at a greater distance. A total expenditure of between \$5,000,000 and \$6,000,000 would probably be required, which would be paid by the taxpayers in District No. 5. In terms of homes costing \$20,000 each, this would equal about 250 to 300 homes.

The proposed improvements to the Plant, now being made in a report to the Town Board, should correct some of the difficulties mentioned and permit satisfactory Plant operation. The other procedures being investigated should also improve the situation. We hope that the combination of the two will create conditions acceptable to the people now experiencing inconvenience.

Tests of the Plant effluent and a review of the operation procedure at the Plant indicate that the Plant is well run, according to accepted standards, and that there is little nuisance created by its operation, generally. The Town Board and the staff in charge of the Plant are cognizant of public relations and they try to keep them as pleasant as possible.

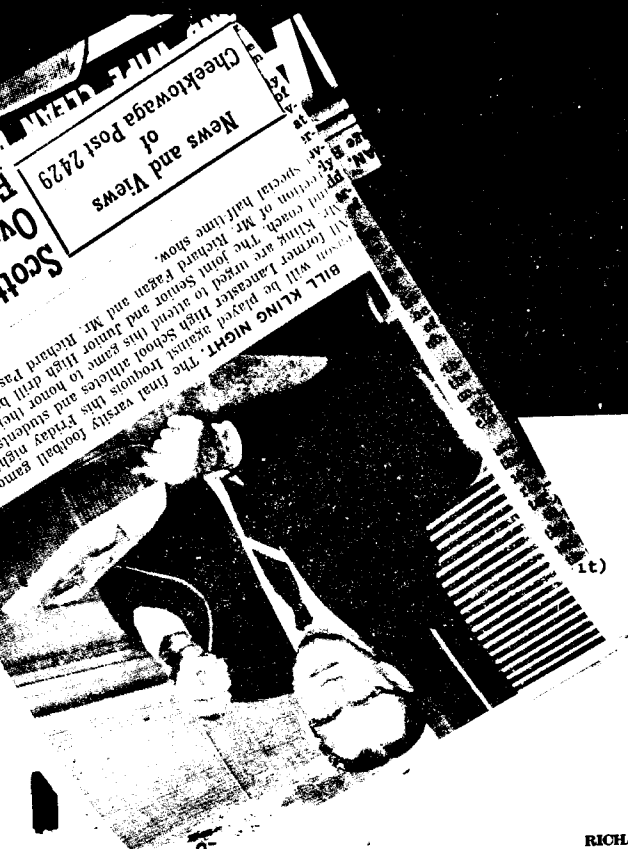

CAPITAL NOTE RESOLUTION DATED NOVEMBER 21, 1960, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,563.20 CAPITAL NOTES OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW, TO FINANCE THE ACQUISITION OF HIGHWAY MACHINERY.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, as follows:

Section 1. The Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, shall issue its Capital Notes of the aggregate principal amount of \$4,563.20, pursuant to the Local Finance Law of New York, in order to finance the specific purpose hereinafter described.

Section 2. The specific purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") to be financed by the issuance of such Capital Notes is the acquisition of machinery or apparatus for highway construction or maintenance, and consists of two (2) cinder and salt spreaders, one at a maximum cost of \$2,090.00, the other at a maximum cost of \$2,892.00.

Section 3. It is hereby stated that (a) the maximum cost of said purpose as estimated by the Town Board, is \$4,982.00, and (b) no money has heretofore been authorized to be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, and (c) the Town Board plans to finance the cost of said purpose entirely from funds raised by the issuance of said Capital Notes and trade-in of used truck and used cinder and salt spreader for \$418.80.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in Subdivision 28 of Paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is five years.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will not be in excess of five years.

Section 6. This resolution shall be published in full by the Town Clerk of said Town, together with a notice in substantially the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of said Local Finance Law, and such publication shall be in the DEPEW HERALD AND CHEEKTOWAGA NEWS, a newspaper published and having a general circulation in said Town. The validity of said Capital Notes may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution were not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication or if said obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

(3) Both principal of and interest on said Capital Notes shall be payable at the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company of Buffalo, in Buffalo, New York, in any coin or currency of the United States of America which at the time of payment is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.

(4) Each of said Capital Notes shall be payable to bearer and shall be convertible into a registered capital Note. Each of said Capital Notes shall be executed by the Town Supervisor of said Town and shall be attested by the Town Clerk of said Town. Each of said Capital Notes shall be sealed with the seal of said Town.

(5) The power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said Capital Notes, subject to the provisions of this resolution, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor. Said Capital Notes shall be sold to the Manufacturers and Traders Trust Company of Buffalo, in Buffalo, New York, at private sale and shall bear an interest rate of Three Per Cent (3%) per annum.

(6) The faith and credit of the Town are hereby pledged to the payment of said Notes and the interest thereon as the same become due and payable.
