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Item No. 11 Councilman Kaczmarek offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the taxpayers of the Town of Cheektowaga have suffered grievous financial loss by the New York State Railroad Relief Act, which has resulted in removing from the tax rolls almost \$4,000,000 in assessed valuation of railroad properties, and

WHEREAS, the excuse for such legislation was to improve the economic condition of the railroads, thereby enabling them, among other things, to maintain and expand their labor forces, but in fact the labor forces have been contracted, and

WHEREAS, the proposed merger of the New York Central Railroad and the Pennsylvania Railroad will lead to further elimination of facilities and decreases in railroad employment in this Town, and

WHEREAS, any further reduction in railroad trackage, equipment and employment will place the United States in a precarious position in case of national emergency, and in any event will further contract the amount of consumer spending to the end of adding significantly to the worsening of economic conditions, and

WHEREAS, the philosophy of contraction practiced by railroad management and inherent in railroad mergers is antipodal to the American spirit of growth and expansion; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that

1. This Town Board memorialize the United States Congress and Interstate Commerce Commission to halt any consideration of the proposed merger of the New York Central and Pennsylvania Railroads at this time, and

2. That the Congress cause to be made an unbiased, expert study to determine (a) the true economic condition of the railroads, (b) the need for Federal subsidy, and (c) an overall program for expansion of and improvement in railroad facilities, including those for passenger transportation and the attendant increase in railroad employment.

3. That the Town Attorneys prepare an application to the Interstate Commerce Commission to permit the Town's position on the proposed merger of the New York Central and Pennsylvania Railroads to be presented at local hearings, and that the Town be given due notice of any contemplated action by the Commission.

4. That certified copies of this resolution be sent by the Town Clerk to all local congressmen and to U. S. Senators Javits and Keating.

WHEREAS, the Federal Government has enacted an emergency public works law making available Nine Hundred Million Dollars for public improvement projects which are in such planning stages as to permit bidding within approximately six months, and

WHEREAS, there are several projects for which this Town Board has caused plans to be drawn which can be progressed so as to permit the receipt of bids within the required time limit, including drainage systems for each and west of the New York State Thruway, the enlargement of the sewage treatment plant of Sewer District No. 5, public libraries and swimming pools, and

WHEREAS, the construction of these projects will substantially contribute to the welfare of the residents of this Town and the alleviation of unemployment, therein; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that this Town Board shall immediately investigate the eligibility of the aforementioned public works for participation in the Federal program, and such applications shall be made, trips undertaken, and whatever else may be required of and by Town officials as shall expedite the Town's obtaining the maximum amount of Federal funds to which it is entitled, all expenses of travel and otherwise necessarily incurred, to be paid by the Town.

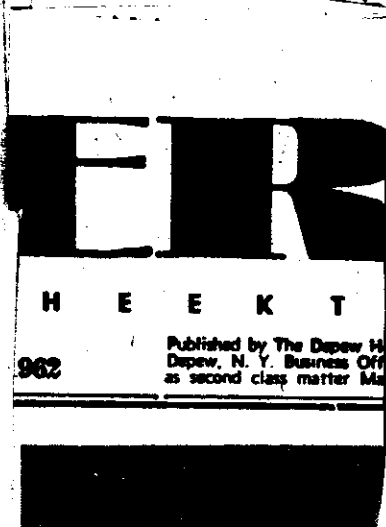

The additional facilities hereinbefore referred to are described in a map and plan dated October 22, 1962, prepared at the request of the Town Board by Nussbaumer, Clarke and Velzy, Consulting Engineers, now on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, and consist of the following:

#### Primary Settling Tank Units

It is proposed to add three primary settling tanks, each 33 feet wide by 100 feet long and having an average side water depth of 12 feet. Sludge and scum removal facilities will be provided. Two new sludge pumps will be installed in a new brick enclosure under the existing grit chambers. These pumps will be used to pump sludge and scum from the Primary Settling Tanks back to a sludge receiving well at the sludge digestion tank assembly. Space will also be provided in this area for the winter storage of the sludge bed loader.

#### Final Settling Tanks

It is proposed to add three final settling tanks each 37 feet wide by 110 feet long and having an average side water depth of 8 feet. Sludge removal facilities will be provided. A few piping changes will be required to connect the present sludge pump piping to the hoppers of the new tanks. All final tank sludge will be returned to the plant influent preceding the primary settling tanks.

Sludge Digestion Facilities

There are at present four 40 foot diameter tanks and one 75 foot diameter tank. It is proposed to add two new 75 foot diameter tanks each equal in volume to the present 75 foot tank. The side water depth of all tanks is about 24 feet.

Two of the 75 foot tanks will be used as Primary Sludge Digestion Tanks and the third as a Secondary Tank with gas holder. The four 40 foot tanks will also be used as secondary units.

The area between the three 75 foot tanks will be enclosed and will house equipment for treating the sludge. This equipment will consist of such major items as three plunger sludge pumps, three sludge recirculation pumps and two sludge heaters. There will also be the necessary interconnecting piping, valves, etc. within this structure.

Sludge Disposal Building

It is proposed to construct a new Sludge Disposal Building to house two 8 foot diameter by 8 foot long vacuum filters. The dried sludge will discharge onto a horizontal belt conveyor, the direction of travel of which can be reversed. At one end of the belt, the dried sludge will discharge into a closed conveyor which will elevate the sludge to a point where it will discharge into an incinerator to be burned. By reversing the belt, the dried sludge can be discharged into a hopper and then into a truck at the lower level. Necessary space and equipment will be provided for chemical storage and treatment of the sludge prior to filtration.

In addition, the Sludge Disposal Building will provide space for truck storage and other miscellaneous equipment used by the sewer crews in the Town. Office space, toilet and locker facilities, and lunch rooms, will also be provided.

High Rate Trickling Filters

Two 150 foot diameter high rate stone filters will be constructed. These new filters will operate in conjunction with the existing 100 foot diameter unit to treat the primary tank effluent in proportion to the relative size of the filter units. Pumping facilities for recirculating the filter effluent in proportion to the inflow will be increased proportionately.

Miscellaneous Remodeling of Existing Structures

Under this heading, there are several items of work to be undertaken as follows:

a) Existing Vacuum Filter Building

This building will be remodeled to include a larger laboratory on the second floor, office space for the Plant Superintendent on the ground floor, and space for telemetering instruments to receive operational signals from outlying pump stations and various instruments throughout the plant. The existing vacuum filter will be removed from this building.

b) Existing Sludge Control Building

It is intended to renovate the basement of this structure particularly in regard to the piping and valve arrangement.

c) Existing Pump Station

It will be necessary to increase the pumping facilities in this structure to meet the increased hydraulic capacity of the plant. This will involve some piping changes and pump control alteration. It is also proposed to add screening equipment in the wet well portion of the structure.

Miscellaneous Items of Work

There will also be included in the construction program outside and inside piping, site improvement work as required by the new construction above outlined, and the appurtenant electrical and mechanical work for the entire project. Also, the existing glass-covered sludge bed will be

demolished and enclosures over the primary tank sludge wells will be constructed; also, a plant water supply will be provided, as will a pipe tunnel, sclorination additions, grit inlet revisions, and an increase in outfall capacity.

The estimated expense of constructing such additional facilities is Two Million, Seventy Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$2,750,000).

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie and State of New York, will meet at the Town Hall, corner of Broadway and Union Road in said Town, on the 19th day of November, 1962, at 7:30 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, and hold a public hearing for the purpose of considering a map and plan describing additional facilities for the sanitary sewer system maintained by Sewer District No. 5 of the Town of Cheektowaga, and an estimate of the cost thereof, and that the Town Board will, at said time and place, hear all persons interested in the subject of such hearing and will receive all evidence offered which will enable the Town Board to determine, pursuant to the provisions of the Town Law of New York, whether it is in the public interest to make the improvement described in said map and plan and estimate, either in whole or in part, and whether the property located within the boundaries of said District will be benefited by the construction of such additional facilities.

The additional facilities heretofore referred to are described in a map and plan dated October 22, 1962, prepared at the request of the Town Board by Stussbaumer, Clarke and Vohay, Consulting Engineers, now on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Cheektowaga, and consist of the following:

**Primary Settling Tank Units**

It is proposed to add three primary settling tanks, each 33 feet wide by 100 feet long and having an average side water depth of 12 feet. Sludge and scum removal facilities will be provided. Two new sludge pumps will be installed in a new brick enclosure under the existing grit chambers. These pumps will be used to pump sludge and scum from the Primary Settling Tanks back to a sludge receiving well at the sludge digestion tank assembly. Space will also be provided in this area for the winter storage of the sludge bed loader.

**Final Settling Tanks**

It is proposed to add three final settling tanks each 37 feet wide by 110 feet long and having an average side water depth of 8 feet. Sludge removal facilities will be provided. A few piping changes will be required to connect the present sludge pump piping to the hoppers of the new tanks. All final tank sludge will be returned to the plant influent preceding the primary settling tanks.

**Sludge Digestion Facilities**

There are at present four 40 foot diameter tanks and one 75 foot diameter tank. It is proposed to add two new 75 foot diameter tanks each equal in volume to the present 75 foot tank. The side water depth of all tanks is about 24 feet.

Two of the 75 foot tanks will

be used as Primary Sludge Digestion Tanks and the third as a Secondary Tank with gas holder. The four 40 foot tanks will also be used as secondary units.

The area between the three 75 foot tanks will be enclosed and will house equipment for treating the sludge. This equipment will consist of such major items as three plunger sludge pumps, three sludge recirculation pumps and two sludge heaters. There will also be the necessary interconnecting piping, valves, etc. within this structure.

**Sludge Disposal Building**

It is proposed to construct a new Sludge Disposal Building to house two 8 foot diameter by 8 foot long vacuum filters. The dried sludge will discharge onto a horizontal belt conveyor, the direction of travel of which can be reversed. At one end of the belt, the dried sludge will discharge into a closed conveyor which will elevate the sludge to a point where it will discharge into an incinerator to be burned. By reversing the belt, the dried sludge can be discharged into a hopper and then into a truck at the lower level. Necessary space and equipment will be provided for chemical storage and treatment of the sludge prior to filtration.

In addition, the Sludge Disposal Building will provide space for truck storage and other miscellaneous equipment used by the sewer crews in the Town. Office space, toilet and locker facilities, and lunch room, will also be provided.

**High Rate Trickling Filters**

Two 150 foot diameter high rate stone filters will be constructed. These new filters will operate in conjunction with the existing 100 foot diameter unit to treat the primary tank effluent in proportion to the relative size of the filter units. Pumping facilities for recirculating the filter effluent in proportion to the inflow will be increased proportionately.

**Miscellaneous Remodeling of Existing Structures**

Under this heading, there are several items of work to be undertaken as follows:

**a) Existing Vacuum Filter Building**

This building will be remodeled to include a larger laboratory on the second floor, office space for the Plant Superintendent on the ground floor, and space for telemetering instruments to receive operational signals from outlying pump stations and various instruments throughout the plant. The existing vacuum filter will be removed from this building.

**b) Existing Sludge Control Building**

It is intended to renovate the basement of this structure particularly in regard to the piping and valve arrangement.

**c) Existing Pump Station**

It will be necessary to increase the pumping facilities in this structure to meet the increased hydraulic capacity of

the plant. This will involve some piping changes and pump control alterations. It is also proposed to add screening equipment in the wet well portion of the structure.

**Miscellaneous Items of Work**

There will also be included in the construction program outside and inside piping, site improvement work as required by the new construction above outlined, and the appurtenant electrical and mechanical work for the entire project. Also, the existing glass-covered sludge bed will be demolished and enclosures over the primary tank sludge wells will be constructed; also, a plant water supply will be provided, as will a pipe tunnel, chlorination additions, grit chamber inlet revisions, and an increase in outfall capacity.

The estimated expense of constructing such additional facilities is Two Million, Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,750,000).

The Supervisor announced that the Town Board would hear all persons interested in the subject of the hearing.

Communication read from Theodore Wierzbic, president of Local 1581 International Union of Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers, requesting the Town Boards support in the matter.

Charles Light, executive vice president of the Buffalo area Chamber of Commerce was granted the floor and related to the Board as follows: "I would question the need of this particular ordinance at this time. We are prejudice against this ordinance on the books. Would wait until the need is necessary. I think the town would suffer with such an ordinance and would be to the towns disadvantage."

Councilman Kaczmarek; "Ordinance would protect the citizens of the Town."

Councilman Kornecki; "We are thinking of the people who work in the town."

Clifford Meidenbauer of Firewell Company; "Not good for labor or management relations."

Ralph Brighton of Clement and Company; "Would be hard to entice plants to come to town. When there is a need for such an ordinance the Board can act then."

The chairman advised Mr. Brighton that the law would not affect his plant due to the fact that it is located in the Village of Depew.

Carl Maundrell, of Twin Industries Corporation; "Can see no need for this ordinance. The New York City Ordinance was only passed ten days ago. It is far more reaching than you believe. The Police Force can handle the strike situation. You do not need this ordinance. Wait and see how it works in New York City. You will not be able to enforce it."

Councilman Kornecki; "Why are you worried about this proposed ordinance?"

Mr. Maundrell; "To keep industry here. High class industry such as we have now. This is nuisance legislation."

Councilman Kornecki; "What about industry going over-seas. I am talking about the little people."

Councilman Trojanoski; "How do you poll people in your plant?"

Mr. Maundrell; "I said if we could poll the people in the plant."

The following spoke in favor of the proposed ordinance:

Theodore Wierzbic, president of the Westinghouse Local Union; "No argument between management and labor. There is no problem here. We

are concerned about strike breakers. We have proof on this situation. They are hired by management. They are paid \$300 to \$400 a week to strike-break. Concerns are employment office for strike breakers. I do work for a living. New York City found it wise to adopt this ordinance. It has been a problem in New York City, and we don't want it here. We want no strikes and we do not want people to foment strikes. The ordinance is impartial. We want matters settled among ourselves, not by outsiders."

Councilman Kaczmarek; "Would this ordinance deter new industry to come into the town."

Mr. Wierzbic; "I cannot answer this. Perhaps this is up to management."

Councilman Kornecki; "We do not want outsiders in who would cause trouble."

Mr. Wierzbic; "We should settle our troubles in our own backyard."

Councilman Wroblewski; "Were other cities and towns asked to adopt this ordinance?"

Robert Russell, representing the Buffalo Typographical Union No. 9 was granted the floor:

"This ordinance is being sponosed through out the country not only by the Typographical Union. A similar ordinance is now pending in Buffalo. Other towns in the area are considering this legislation. Rochester N.Y. had this ordinance since last spring. Do we want trouble before we do anything about it. No one wants to see a professional strike breaker come into town. No labor man wants a strike breaker to take his place. People in the community endorse this legislation. We want the right to preserve peace in our town. Jamestown N.Y. and Herkimer N.Y. have strike breakers working now. What is wrong with this ordinance? We don't want professional strike breakers to come in and take a local man's job. Eight cities in the U.S.A. have this ordinance."

Earl Barneby, representing the Associated Welders of Western New York; "We don't want strikes, only want to protect our jobs when out on strike."

Walter Przyzabl, representing Buffalo Employees of Westinghouse Corporation; "I think this is progressive thinking. It is for the people who have jobs."

REBUTTAL

Mr. Maundrell; "Please deal in facts. When did anyone loose their job in town on account of strike breakers. This ordinance does not belong in the town. It will deter business from coming into this town."

Peter Schmidt representing Peter Schmidt and Company; "Union leaders cannot guarantee you a job."

Albert Dold of the Buffalo Chamber of Commerce; "Should be no ordinance against management or against unions. Put in a ordinance against outside picketing. We ought to know cities and companies where strike breakers have been brought in. Put in a provision against strangers picketing."

Mr. Light; "I would like to get some information from Rochester and New York City."

Mr. Wierzbic; "Here are the facts from the State Department (read communication) relating to strike breakers salary."

Councilman Kornecki; "Can we enforce this ordinance?"

Mr. Russell; "Any union does not ask for any jobs. Please consider the facts."

Mr. Dold; "Has the Town Attorney done any research on this proposed ordinance?"

Town Attorney Kitzinger; "This is a legal question. Town Board can pass ordinances for the benefit of the town. I think the ordinance can be sustained. I think the ordinance would be sustained."

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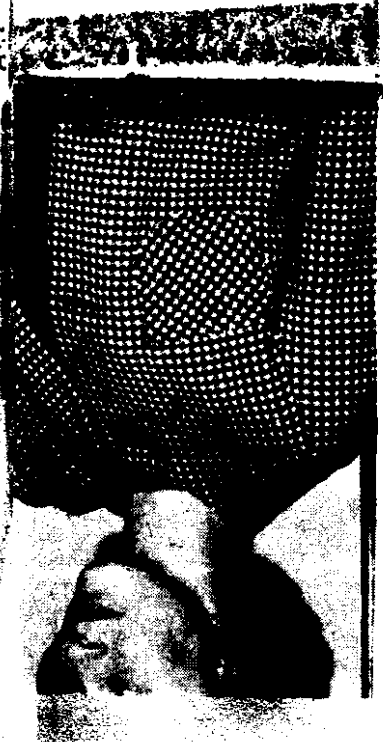

4—Any person, partnership, agency, firm or corporation violating any provision of this act is guilty of an offense, and shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment for not more than six months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

5—The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to any area of the Town within the Villages of Depew or Sloan.

Item No. 12 Councilman Bystrak presented the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, deems it advisable that additional facilities be provided for the sewage disposal system maintained by Sewer District No. 5 of the Town of Cheektowaga, and has caused Nussbaumer, Clarke and Velzy, who are competent engineers duly licensed by the State of New York, to prepare a map and plan of such additional facilities, together with an estimate of the cost thereof, and said map and plan and estimate are dated October 22, 1962, and have been presented to the Town Board and have been filed in the office of the Town Clerk, and

WHEREAS, the additional facilities hereinbefore referred to consist of the following:

Primary Settling Tank Units

It is proposed to add three primary settling tanks, each 33 feet wide by 100 feet long and having an average side water depth of 12 feet. Sludge and scum removal facilities will be provided. Two new sludge pumps will be installed in a new brick enclosure under the existing grit chambers. These pumps will be used to pump sludge and scum from the Primary Settling Tanks, back to a sludge receiving well at the sludge digestion tank assembly. Space will also be provided in this area for the winter storage of the sludge bed loader.

Final Settling Tanks

It is proposed to add three final settling tanks each 37 feet

wide by 110 feet long and having an average side water depth of 8 feet. Sludge removal facilities will be provided. A few piping changes will be required to connect the present sludge pump piping to the hoppers of the new tanks. All final tank sludge will be returned to the plant influent preceding the primary settling tanks.

Sludge Digestion Facilities

There are at present four 40 foot diameter tanks and one 75 foot diameter tank. It is proposed to add two new 75 foot diameter tanks each equal in volume to the present 75 foot tank. The side water depth of all tanks is about 24 feet.

Two of the 75 foot tanks will be used as Primary Sludge Digestion Tanks and the third as a Secondary Tank with gas holder. The four 40 foot tanks will also be used as secondary units.

The area between the three 75 foot tanks will be enclosed and will house equipment for treating the sludge. This equipment will consist of such major items as three plunger sludge pumps, three sludge recirculation pumps and two sludge heaters. There will also be the necessary interconnecting piping, valves, etc. within this structure.

Sludge Disposal Building

It is proposed to construct a new Sludge Disposal Building to house two 8 foot diameter by 8 foot long vacuum filters. The dried sludge will discharge onto a horizontal belt conveyor, the direction of travel of which can be reversed. At one end of the belt, the dried sludge will discharge into a closed conveyor which will elevate the sludge to a point where it will discharge into an incinerator to be burned. By reversing the belt, the dried sludge can be discharged into a hopper and then into a truck at the lower level. Necessary space and equipment will be provided for chemical storage and treatment of the sludge prior to filtration.

In addition, the Sludge Disposal Building will provide space for truck storage and other miscellaneous equipment used by the sewer crews in the Town. Office space, toilet and locker facilities, and lunch room, will also be provided.

High Rate Trickling Filters

Two 150 foot diameter high rate stone filters will be constructed. These new filters will operate in conjunction with the existing 100 foot diameter unit to treat the primary tank effluent in proportion to the relative size of the filter units. Pumping facilities for recirculating the filter effluent in proportion to the inflow will be increased proportionately.

Miscellaneous Remodeling of Existing Structures

Under this heading, there are several items of work to be undertaken as follows:

a) Existing Vacuum Filter Building

This building will be remodeled to include a larger laboratory on the second floor, office space for the Plant Superintendent on the ground floor, and space for telemetering instruments to receive operational signals from outlying pump stations and various instruments throughout the plant. The existing vacuum filter will be removed from this building.

b) Existing Sludge Control Building

It is intended to renovate the basement of this structure particularly in regard to the piping and valve arrangement.



Item No. 12 Cont'dc) Existing Pump Station

It will be necessary to increase the pumping facilities in this structure to meet the increased hydraulic capacity of the plant. This will involve some piping changes and pump control alterations. It is also proposed to add screening equipment in the wet well portion of the structure.

Miscellaneous Items of Work

There will also be included in the construction program outside and inside piping, site improvement work as required by the new construction above outlined, and the appurtenant electrical and mechanical work for the entire project. Also, the existing glass-covered sludge bed will be demolished and enclosures over the primary tank sludge wells will be constructed; also, a plant water supply will be provided, as will a pipe tunnel, chlorination additions, grit chamber inlet revisions, and an increase in outfall capacity, and the estimated expense of constructing such additional facilities is Two Million, Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,750,000.00), and

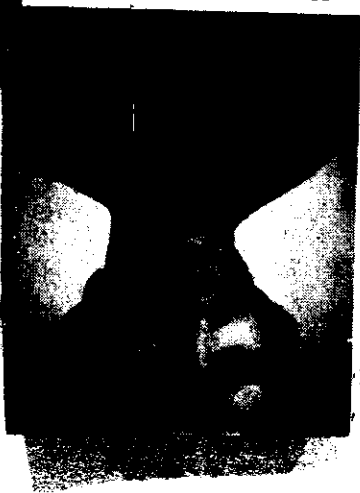
