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Item No. 5 This being the time and the place advertised for a public hearing for the establishment of Drainage District No. 8.

The Town Clerk presented proof that the Notice of Hearing has been duly published and posted as required by law.

The Supervisor announced that the Board would hear all persons interested in the subject of the hearing.

Ben Hoey, Union Road Insurance Man was granted the floor and appeared in opposition to the proposal as a "moral duty to the taxpayers".

Lester J. Coyle, appeared and spoke in favor of the proposal.

The Supervisor ordered the hearing closed and the following resolution was offered and adopted, to wit:

WHEREAS, Nussbaumer, Clarke and Velzy, engineers duly licensed by the State of New York, have, at the instance of the Town Board, prepared a map, plan and report providing for the establishment of a drainage district of the Town of Cheektowaga to be designated "Drainage District No. 8", and said map, plan and report has been filed in the office of the Town Clerk, in accordance with Article 12-A of the Town Law, and said map, plan and report shows the surface water drains and appurtenances suitable for their operation to be constructed within the proposed drainage district and the location of each, and

WHEREAS, said map, plan and report was duly filed in the office of the Town Clerk for public inspection on September 16, 1963, and has remained on file in said office, and

WHEREAS, the boundaries of said proposed Drainage District No. 8, as set forth in said map, plan and report, are as follows:

DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DRAINAGE DISTRICT BOUND ARIES

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, situate in the Town of Cheektowaga, County of Erie and State of New York, more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point, said point being formed by the intersection of the southerly line of the West Shore Railroad right-of-way, and the easterly right-of-way of the Ontario Section of the New York State Thruway;

Thence north along the east line of the right-of-way of the Ontario section of the New York State Thruway, to a point about 150 feet south of the south line of Cleveland Drive, said point also being located on the west line of Bixler Avenue;

Thence easterly along a straight line across Bixler Avenue, across the property of the Infant of Prague Roman Catholic Church Society, and across Foisset Avenue to a point located at the intersection of the east line of Foisset Avenue and the north line of Subdivision Lot 47 of Cover No. 1467;

Thence continuing easterly along the north line of Subdivision Lot 47 of Cover No. 1467, and along the north line of Subdivision Lot 2 of Cover No. 1752, to the west line of Flora Avenue;

Kindly present the following Change Orders to the Ten Board for their approval.

1. Credit of \$441.00 for omission of plaster and painting behind book shelving. The book shelving by the Buffalo Erie County Library System is being bid to include plywood backing and shelving.

2. Addition of \$4,398.00 for extending the foundations to solid bearing and for changing the location of the building by relocating same 10'10" to the North to clear the existing storm drains. At the time excavations were being made a layer of top

soil approximately 6" to 12" thick was encountered at a point immediately below the level of the footings. This necessitated lowering all footings from 1'0" to 2'0" to solid clay bearing. This layer of top soil was not shown in the soil investigations report made by Empire Soils Investigations, Inc., The moving of the building 10'0" to the North was to avoid having footings occur directly over the existing storm drain running thru the property. The exact location of the storm drain could not be ascertained at the time plans were being prepared.

Enclosed herewith are eight (8) copies of a report to date of the contracts for the Library. The report shows a balance of \$1,603.69, plus \$350.00 credit for payment for the bronze plaque, if said plaque is paid for by Dr. Victor Reinstein. Kindly have Mr. Hanley check as to other items such as insurance during construction that might be chargeable to this Bond Issue.

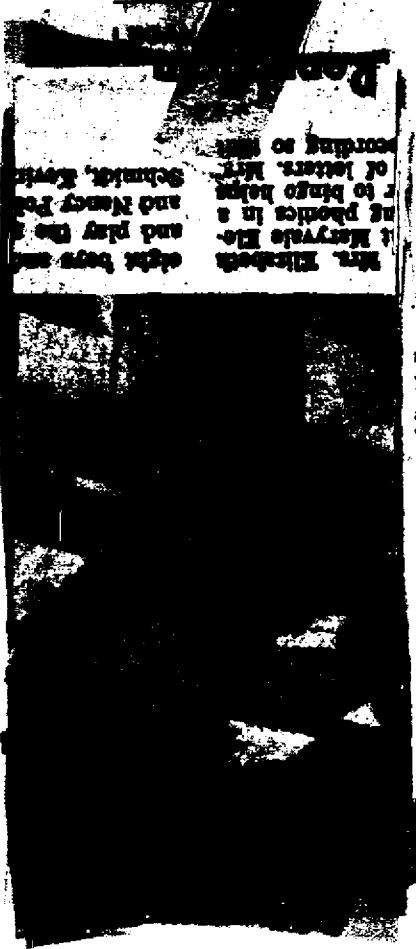

Robert Neubauer of Holloway and Company municipal for the Town of Cheektowaga, explained that the budget conforms to State requirements and listed the miscellaneous appropriation items as: Labor for snow

and ice removal, curb and ditch work, Social Security, Workmens' Compensation and group insurance, office supplies and transportation.

Councilman Kaczmarek was critical of Mr. Weber's questioning and said "I don't think you should make this budget a political issue", you sat on this board as a Councilman and should know the answers."

Mr. Weber answered by saying "I sat on this Board for one year and you have been here for four years, but since you brought politics into this, I would like to inform myself in the event that voters in the Town elect me Supervisor."

Arthur Marmoy, spokesman for the Senior Citizen Council noted "that he is hereby happy with what has been done in this budget by providing \$2400 for senior citizens."

Norman Steeger No. \_\_\_\_\_ was granted the floor and asked about the repetition of such charges as insurance and compensation in both the general fund and the department budgets.

The chairman explained that the State requires that each department fund should bear its proportioned share of insurance, compensation and other such charges. These costs, he says, are to be listed by departments and the funds then transferred to the general fund for payment.

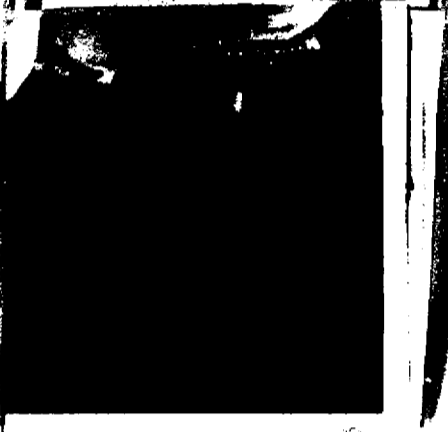
