The applicant intends to use the premises for construction and maintenance of an automobile Trailer Court.

The petition in opposition to the rezoning signed by approximately 90 residents in the area was presented to the Board. The Central School District filed a communication in opposition to the rezoning. The Bellevue Fire District Chairman appeared in opposition. The Bellevue Fire Company appeared in opposition. Approximately 31 people appeared in person against the application.

The members of the Zoning Board of Appeals subsequently inspected the premises and other premises in the vicinity and being of the opinion that an approval of the rezoning would be detrimental and harmful to the entire area, recommend that the application be denied.
