Item No. 7 Councilman Wroblewski offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

BOND RESOLUTION, DATED JULY 6, 1964, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$46,750 SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW, TO FINANCE THE CONSTRUCTION OF LATERAL SEWER.

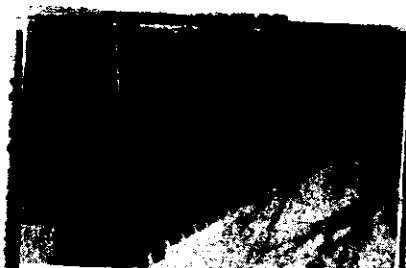

The Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign any Serial Bonds issued pursuant to this resolution and any Bond Anticipation Notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of said Serial Bonds, and the Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to affix the corporate seal of said Town to any of said Serial Bonds or any Bond Anticipation Notes and to attest such seal. Each interest coupon representing interest payable on such Serial Bonds shall be authenticated by the facsimile signature of the Town Supervisor.

Section 8. This resolution is subject to the permissive referendum and shall take effect at the time and in the manner prescribed by Section 91 of the Town Law.

ORDINANCE NO. 37
TAXICAB ORDINANCE

Section 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS:

It is hereby declared that the taxicab business is a vital part of the transportation facilities of the Town of Cheektowaga, and that its regulation is necessary to preserve peace, good order and safety for the inhabitants of the Town.

Section 2. DEFINITIONS:

a) Town - The Town of Cheektowaga, not including the Villages of Depew and Sloan.

b) Taxicab - A vehicle engaged in the business of carrying passengers for hire, having a seating capacity of less than eight (8) persons and not operated on a fixed route.

c) Person - Includes an individual, a partnership, any unincorporated association, a corporation, and any other legal entity.

d) Owner - A person owning or controlling one or more taxicabs and driving or causing any such vehicle to be driven upon the highway for hire.

e) Driver - Any person driving a taxicab upon the public highways for hire.

Item No. 25 Cont'd

f) Taximeter - A mechanical instrument or device by which the charge for hire of a taxicab may be mechanically calculated either for the distance traveled or waiting time or both and upon which such charge is indicated by means of figures.

Section 3. OWNER'S LICENSES:

a) It shall be unlawful for any owner of any taxicab to permit the same to be operated upon the public highways of the Town without having first obtained, and having then in force the owner's license, as hereinafter provided.

b) Every owner's license issued hereunder shall be issued as of the first day of October or subsequent date of issue and shall expire on the 30th day of September next succeeding.

c) Every person who desires to operate a taxicab or taxicabs, owned or controlled by him upon the public highways within the Town, shall file with the Town Clerk a written application, verified under oath stating:

1. The name and address of the applicant, specifying in the case of any unincorporated association the names and addresses of each member thereof, and in the case of any corporation the names and addresses of each officer, director and stockholder thereof.

2. A complete statement by the applicant, specifying the amounts of all unpaid judgments against the applicant and the nature of the transaction or acts giving rise to said judgments and the name and location of the court in which and the date on which each was entered.

3. All misdemeanors or felonies of which the applicant and any member thereof, if an unincorporated association, and any officer, director and stockholder thereof, if a corporation, has been convicted, stating the name and location of the court in which and the date on which such convictions were held and the penalties imposed therefor.

4. The experience of the applicant and each member thereof, if an unincorporated association, and each officer, director, and stockholder thereof, if a corporation, in the transportation of passengers.

5. Any facts which the applicant believes tend to prove that the public convenience and necessity require the granting of a license.

6. The number of vehicles to be operated by the applicant and a description of each such vehicle, including the make, model, passenger seating capacity, year of manufacture, and motor number thereof, and the size of the tires, the make, type and number or other descriptive designation of the taximeter, together with an accurate and complete statement of the color of each taxicab.

7. The age and citizenship of the applicant and each member thereof, if an unincorporated association, and each officer, director and stockholder thereof, if a corporation.

8. The location of any and all depots and terminals proposed to be used by the applicant.

d) If the Town Clerk shall find that the applicant is

Item No. 25 Cont'd

qualified and able to perform such public transportation and to conform to the provisions of this ordinance, then the Town Clerk, upon receipt of certificates for each taxicab issued by an approved testing agency certifying that the taximeter is in proper working condition and correct, and upon the furnishing by the applicant of proof of insurance against public liability in the limits of \$5,000.00 for personal injuries to each person, and \$10,000.00 for personal injuries for each accident and \$5,000.00 for property damage for each taxicab, which insurance shall be maintained in force during the period covered by the license, and the payment of the proper fee, shall issue a license stating the name and address of the applicant, and the date of the issuance thereof, the number of vehicles the applicant is authorized to operate, and the numbers of the license plates assigned to each vehicle.

e) Every owner licensed here, who shall desire to add to the number of taxicabs, he is then operating shall file with the Town Clerk a written application under oath stating:

1. The names and address of the applicant.
2. The applicant's owner's license number.
3. Any facts which the applicant believes tend to prove that the public convenience and necessity require such addition.
4. A description of each such additional taxicab including the make, model, passenger seating capacity, year of manufacture, State registration number and motor number.
5. If the Town Clerk shall find that the addition of such taxicab or taxicabs meets all requirements, then he shall issue a supplementary owners license stating the name and address of the applicant, the numbers of the license plate assigned to such vehicles and the date of issuance thereof.

f) Any license issued here, may be renewed annually for additional periods of one year each from the date of expiration upon the filing of an application containing all the information required by Section 3-c hereof.

g) The owner's license issued hereunder shall not be transferable.

Section 4. FEES FOR OWNER'S LICENSES:

The fee for a taxicab owner's license shall be the sum of \$20.00 per year for each vehicle. For replacing a lost plate the fee shall be \$10.00. In case of the sale or disuse for taxicab purposes of any licensed taxicab, the holder of the taxicab license may have the same transferred to another vehicle owned by him, with the approval of the Town Clerk, and the payment of a transfer fee of \$5.00.

A fleet operator may pay a license fee of \$100.00 per year, which shall entitle him to licenses for five (5) taxicabs, and licenses for additional taxicabs shall be at a rate of \$15.00 each per year.

Section 5. LICENSES FOR TAXICAB DRIVERS.

a) No person shall operate any taxicab upon the public highways of the Town without having first obtained and having then in force a New York chauffeur's license and a driver's license, issued

as hereinafter provided. No person shall operate a taxicab on the public highways of the Town unless such taxicab shall be duly licensed as herein provided.

b) Every driver's license issued here, shall be issued as of the date of the granting thereof and shall expire on the 30th day of September next succeeding, unless sooner revoked by the Town Board.

c) Every person desiring to drive a taxicab for hire upon the streets of the Town shall file an application for license so to drive, with the Town Clerk, which application shall be in writing, and verified under oath and shall state:

1. The name, address and age of the applicant.
2. A full description of the applicant including his color, height, weight, color of eyes and hair, and scars or marks and the nature of any physical infirmity from which he may suffer.
3. Recommendation by two residents of Erie County, not related to the applicant, who have known the applicant for a period of one (1) years or more and who will vouch for the applicant's sobriety honesty and general good character.
4. Whether or not he is a citizen of the United States.
5. The names and addresses of the applicant's employers during the last ten years prior to his application.
6. All violations of any traffic law, ordinance or regulation for which the applicant has been arrested or convicted within 18 months prior to the date of application and all crimes of which the applicant has ever been arrested or convicted, stating the date and place of each such arrest and the name and location of the Court in which and the date on which each such conviction was had and the penalty imposed therefor.
7. The number and date of issuance of the applicant's New York chauffer's license.
8. Whether or not any operator's or chauffeur's license held by the applicant has ever been revoked or suspended by the State of New York or any other State, and if so, by what court or other authority, on what date, for what cause, and if suspended, the period of such suspension.
9. Any other relevant information which the Town Clerk may require.

d) Every applicant for a driver's license shall, at the time of submitting his application, also:

1. Submit two individual photographs of the applicant, taken within thirty days prior to the date of the application, $1\frac{1}{2}$ x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " in size and such pictures must be a true likeness of the applicant and must show only neck, shoulders and uncovered head.

2. Submit a certificate from a physician, duly licensed to practice in the State of New York, certifying that, in his opinion the applicant is not afflicted with any physical or mental disease or infirmity which might make him an unsafe or unsatisfactory driver.

Item No. 25 Cont'd

3. Exhibit his current New York State chauffeur's license for inspection.

4. Be fingerprinted under the direction and supervision of the Town Clerk.

e) Upon receipt of any application, the Town Clerk shall refer the same to the Cheektowaga Police Dept. for such investigation as it shall deem necessary or desirable and report thereon.

f) Upon the receipt of the report provided for, the Town Clerk shall issue a taxicab driver's license to the applicant if he shall find that the applicant holds a New York State Chauffeur's license and is a fit and proper person to drive such vehicle considering his age, experience, police and accident records, character and driving ability; otherwise such application shall be denied.

g) At the time of issuance of such license the Town Clerk shall also furnish to the applicant a numbered badge and photograph, which must be conspicuously displayed in his taxicab. Such badges shall be returned to the Town Clerk upon suspension or revocation of the taxicab's Driver's license.

h) The driver's license issued hereunder shall not be transferable.

i) The fee for a driver's license shall be the sum of \$5.00 per year. To replace a lost or misplaced license the fee shall be \$2.00.

Section 6. RATES:

No person shall charge a greater sum for the use of a taxicab than the maximum rates of \$.55 for the first half mile, \$.05 for each additional sixth of a mile, and not more than \$.05 for each minute of waiting time. A copy of the legal rates shall at all times be displayed in each vehicle in such a manner that it is easily visible from the rear seat of the vehicle. Upon demand the driver of a taxicab shall furnish to the passenger a receipt for the fare paid, showing the name and badge number of the driver.

Section 7. OPERATION OF TAXIMETERS:

No taxicab shall be used for hire unless it has a taximeter in good operating condition.

No taximeter shall be operated from either rear wheel of such vehicle and the figures thereon shall be illuminated and visible to the passenger from the rear seat of the vehicle.

No taximeter shall be operated unless said taximeter and speedometer is in proper working condition.

It shall be unlawful to change the size of the front wheels or tires of a taxicab or the gears operating the taximeters, or to change said instrument from one vehicle to another without a reinspection and approval of the Town Clerk.

No Person shall use or permit to be used a taximeter on which the seal has been broken, nor unless its cover and gears are intact.

Item No. 25 Cont'd**Section 8. APPLICATIONS TO TOWN BOARD:**

Any applicant who shall have been denied a license under this Ordinance may apply to the Town Board for a review of the action of the Town Clerk as hereinafter provided:

a) Such application to the Town Board shall be in writing, signed and acknowledged by the applicant and shall state the ground or grounds on which the applicant claims that the determination of the Town Clerk was erroneous.

b) Such application shall be filed with the Town Clerk by the applicant within twenty days after notice of denial of his application by the Town Clerk has been mailed to him or delivered to him in person.

c) Upon the filing of such application, the Town Board shall hold a hearing thereon pursuant to the provisions of Section 9 hereof.

d) At such hearing the Town Board shall consider the applicant's application upon the record before the Town Clerk in connection with the Town Clerk's consideration thereof and in its discretion may receive new or additional evidence in support thereof or in opposition thereto.

e) The Town Board after such hearing, may affirm the action of the Town Clerk or direct the Town Clerk to issue a proper license, pursuant to this ordinance.

Section 9. HEARINGS:

Whenever it shall be provided herein that a hearing shall or may be held by the Town Board with respect to any matter:

a) Such hearing shall be held on a date and at a place and hour designated by the Town Board.

b) The Town Clerk shall give notice thereof, stating the name and address of the applicant or license holder concerned, the subject matter of the hearing and the date, place and hour thereof designated therefor by mailing a copy thereof to the applicant or license holder concerned at the address shown upon the most recent application of such applicant or licensee, at least ten (10) days before such hearing.

c) The applicant or license holder involved shall be entitled to be represented by legal counsel and to present such competent and material testimony or other evidence in his own behalf as may be relevant to the subject matter of the hearing.

d) All witnesses shall be sworn and examined under oath.

Section 10. TAXI STANDS:

The Town Board may from time to time by resolution establish stands at such locations upon the streets or other public places of the Town as it deems necessary for the use of taxicabs operated and driven by the persons licensed hereunder and prescribe the number of taxicabs that may occupy each such stand, provided that it shall find that such stands are required by the public convenience and necessity and will not tend to create a traffic hazard.

Item No. 25 Cont'd

All taxi stands may be used by any taxicab licensed hereunder and driven by any driver licensed hereunder, provided there is a vacant space available therefor.

No vehicle other than a taxicab, duly licensed hereunder and driven by a person duly licensed hereunder, shall at any time occupy any space established as a taxi stand.

Section 11. GENERAL RULES OR OPERATION:

1. No taxicab driver shall leave his vehicle without shutting off the radio.

2. No driver shall blow his horn, shout or use a loud tone voice to solicit a fare.

3. No driver shall idle the motor of his car excessively at any time.

4. No plate attached to a taxicab shall be transferred from one vehicle to another except as otherwise herein permitted.

5. It shall be the duty of each driver to keep a record of the point of origin and point of destination of all trips made and the charge made therefor, and to file the same with the owner of the taxicab, and such records shall be preserved for at least six (6) months and shall be made available for inspection by the Police Department during said period.

6. The numbered license plate assigned to each vehicle by the Town Clerk must be affixed to the vehicle in a conspicuous place adjacent to the rear license plate.

7. Each taxicab operated hereunder shall have a permanently affixed roof light with the word "TAXI" imprinted thereon in such manner that it shall be visible at all times and shall bear on the outside of each front door, the word "TAXI" and the name and address of the owner in letters not less than two (2) inches and not more than four (4) inches in height, either painted thereon or otherwise securely affixed thereto.

No taxicab driver shall solicit passengers, except while parked or standing at a taxi stand and except when sitting in the driver's compartment of such taxicab or while standing immediately adjacent thereto, nor in a loud or annoying tone or voice nor by sign nor in any manner annoy, obstruct the movement of, or follow any person for the purpose of soliciting patronage.

No taxicab driver shall cruise in search of passengers.

No taxicab driver shall stop to pick up any additional passengers while proceeding to the destination of any passenger then occupying the taxicab without the consent of all such passengers.

No taxicab driver shall permit more persons to be carried in his taxicab than the number for which he has seating facilities.

If a taxicab is carrying two or more persons to different destinations, the driver shall be the sole judge of the order in which such persons shall be delivered to their destination and the route which shall be followed in so delivering them.

Item No. 25 Cont'd

All accidents in which any taxicab shall be involved, shall be reported to the Cheektowaga Police Department within twenty four (24) hours, after the happening thereof.

Every taxicab driver, as soon as practicable after his taxicab is emptied of passengers, shall carefully search his vehicle for any property left there by any passenger, and, if he shall find any such property he shall immediately deliver it to the Police Department in Cheektowaga.

Section 12. PENALTIES:

The violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be an offense against the ordinance, which shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment for a period not exceeding 20 days for each such offense, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

In addition the licensee shall be liable to suspension or revocation of any license hereunder held by him.

Section 13. SEVERABILITY AND EFFECTIVE DATE:

If any clause, sentence, section, paragraph or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, section, paragraph or provision directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

This Ordinance shall take effect as provided by law.


