"Bond Resolution, dated February 4, 1971, authorizing the issuance of \$200,000 serial bonds of the Town of Cheektowaga, in the County of Erie, pursuant to the Local Finance Law, for the reconstruction of the existing Town Hall building located at Broadway and Union Road in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York,"

The amount of \$10,000 now available in the budget of the Town for the current fiscal year which commenced January 1, 1971, under the heading "General Fund Accounty-Surplus Moneys," is hereby appropriated to the specific object or purpose authorized and described in the bond resolution duly adopted by the Town Board on February 4, 1971, subject to permissive referendum, said amount being at least five per centum (5%) of the estimated cost of such specific object or purpose, all as hereinabove referred to in the Recitals of this resolution.

Section 2. It is hereby determined that to the extent that said current funds are applied to said specific object or purpose, serial bonds shall not be issued and the plan of financing of said specific object or purpose is hereby determined to be the use of such current funds and the issuance of \$190,000 serial bonds of the Town and the levy of a tax upon all the taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT entered into this _____ day of October, 1971, by

SOUTH OGDEN LAND DEVELOPMENT CORP., 609 Indian Church Road, Gardenville, New York, hereinafter referred to as "OPERATOR"

and

THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, a municipal corporation of the State of New York with its office located at Broadway and Union Road, Cheektowaga, New York, hereinafter referred to as "THE TOWN"

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Operator operates a refuse disposal site on Indian Road, in the Town of Cheektowaga, New York, and

WHEREAS, the Operator is desirous of servicing the Town for its total refuse disposal needs, and

WHEREAS, The Town is desirous of utilizing the Operator's landfill site and refuse disposal services for its total refuse disposal, and

whereas The Town has discontinued its incinerator operations prior to June 1, 1971 and said additional refuse has been deposited on the aforementioned refuse disposal site and the Town has been paying an additional sum for the increased services and operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual premises, covenants and conditions as hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

First: That during the term of this agreement, The Town hereby agrees to deposit or dump any and all of its refuse, rubbish or other waste materials so long as the same are not violative of any existing laws, collected by its municipal vehicles on those premises operated by the Operator on Indian Road, in the Fown of Cheektowaga, New York.

Second: That during the term of this agreement, The Town agrees to pay to the Operator for handling all of its refuse,

rubbish or other waste materials, an annual sum in the amount of \$198,000.00, commencing the date of this agreement for the first full year. For the remaining two (2) years of the term of this agreement the base price shall be increased by the sum of twenty (20%) percent for each year, namely, the sum of \$237,600.00 for the second year of operation and the sum of \$277.200.00 for the third year of operation. Said fees shall be paid by the Town to the Operator in twelve (12) equal monthly installments; said payments shall be due and payable on or before the tenth day of each succeeding month of service.

Third:

a) The Operator agrees to accept all such loads of such refuse, rubbish and waste materials delivered by The Town at the Indian Road site provided that said loads at no time violate applicable Statutes. Ordinances and Codes governing such operations.

5) This contract and permit to operate a sanitary landfill site within the Town of Cheektowaga and/or the Village of Depew is not transferable.

Fourth: It is mutually agreed by the parties hereto that in the event the operator's permit to utilize said premises as a refuse disposal site is suspended or revoked for more than ten (10) days by any action of the State of New York, Town of Cheektowaga or the County of Erie beyond the control of the Operator, this agreement may be terminated by the Operator and this said agreement shall then become null and void without any further liability on either parties' part.

Fifth: Nothing contained herein would in any way restrict the right of the Operator to utilize said site to handle the refuse, rubbish or waste material of any other municipal or private corporation or person.

Sixth: The Operator shall not be reaponsible for any damages which may in caused to vehicles owned and/or operated by

The Town in using said site, provided that the damages were incurred without any fault on the part of the Operator, its employees, agents or subcontractors.

Seventh: The parties hereto covenant and agree that this contract shall be for a term of three (3) years, commencing June 1st, 1971 and terminating May 31, 1974. The Town shall have the first option to renew this agreement for an additional three (3) year period on terms and fees to be mutually agreed upon provided that the Town notifies the Operator by written notice one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the expiration of the prime term herein and provided that the terms and fees are mutually agreed upon within ninety (90) days of the expiration of the prime term herein.

Eighth: The Town agrees that the Operator shall be permitted to accept and dispose of the refuse of the Town at any site which is approved by the Erie County Health Department, the Cheektowaga Town Board, the Town Engineer provided said refuse disposal site complies with Part 19 of the State Sanitary Code, established by the Public Health Council of the State of New York and operated in conformance with the requirements of Part 19 of the State Sanitary Code and all State, Local and Municipal laws, ordinances, codes, rules and regulations.

Ninth: The Town agrees that any permits it may issue for refuse disposal to private or public operators wherein the Operator's refuse disposal site will be utilized, that it shall charge for the said permit a rate equivalent to sixth (\$.60) cents per cubic yard of refuse material.

Tenth: The Town further agrees that it will issue to the Operator any and all permits if and when the same are required so as to permit the Operator to operate at the Indian Road dump site presently in use.

Eleventh: The Operator further agrees that it will do all that it can to reasonably keep Broadway and Indian Road clean from flying papers and debris and free of mud to the best of its ability. Carclessness and continued violations of this paragraph shall, after written or personal notice has been given to the operator, and it sails to remedy the complaint within fifteen (15) days, be absolute grounds for cancellation of this agreement and the Operator's permit to operate a sanitary landfill site and operation in the Town of Cheektowaga.

Twelfth: The Town further agrees to allow the Operator to excavate for the purposes of cover material on the site being utilized by the Operator.

Thirteenth: No buildings or temporary structures will be placed or erected in the landfill site without prior approval of the Town Board. The Operator will continually supply, during the term of this agreement, to the Town Clerk, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all of its operating officials and personnel connected with said site operation. In the event of any change in operating officers of the said Operator, the Town Clerk shall be notified within 48 hours of said change.

Fourteenth: If, after due notice to the Operator, it fails to comply within fitteen (15) days, with the reasonable requests of the Town Board and its officials to remedy and correct nuisances caused by the landfill operation, will be grounds for the cancellation of this agreement by the Town and the revocation of the permit to maintain a sanitary landfill operation at this site.

refuse to another site and to another operator if in the opinion of the Town Engineer and the Board it is unsafe or impossible to continue to deliver their refuse to the site of the said Operator.

Sixteenth: In the event said landfill site shall be closed down for any reason during the term of this agreement for a period of twenty (20) consecutive days The Town may give written notice to the Operator after the expiration of the twenty (20) day period that it intends to terminate said agreement unless the Operator reopens and resumes the landfill operation for the benefit of The Town within seven (7) days from the date of said notice. The failure of the Operator to open the landfill site and resume operations upon the expiration of the seven (7) day period shall constitute legal grounds for the termination of this agreement and The Town shall have the legal right to take their refuse elsewhere and this agreement shall become null and void.

Whenever the said landfill site of the Operator is closed down during the term of this agreement and The Town takes its refuse elsewhere, the Operator shall be obligated to reimburse The Town for all actual and reasonable costs and expenses incurred by The Town for using such other refuse disposal sites and facilities.

Seventeenth: The Operator shall secure and furnish to the Town a permit to operate a sanitary landfill at this site or any other approved Town site from the County of Eric annually during the term of this agreement.

Eighteenth: The Operator shall obtain and furnish to the Town Clerk during the term of this agreement all mandated Workmens Compensation coverage for its employees, public liability policy covering itself and the Town in the amount of \$300,000 to \$500,000 for its sanitary landfill operations within the Town of Cheektowaga or the Village of Depew.

Nineteenth: The Operator agrees to indemnify and save the Town harmless for and against all liability, penalties, damages, expenses, judgments or injury including legal fees and expenses from any injury during the term hereof, to persons or property, occasioned in whole or in part by the Operator's use of the site

herein as a landfill area or the act of omission of any of the persons or invitees of the Operator who are lawfully upon its premises. The operator shall furnish the Town with a performance bond guaranteeing performance on its part of this agreement in sufficient amounts to be approved by the Town Engineer and the Town accounting tirm. In the event the Operator fails to carry out the provisions of this agreement then the aforesaid bond shall be forfeited to the Town and the proceeds of said bond shall be used by the Town to compensate it for any damages sustained as a result of the Operator's failure or refusal to comply with the provisions of this agreement on its part.

Twentieth: The Operator represents and guarantees to the Town that the real property used for said landfill operations does not contain any restriction or covenants that would prohibit the use of said property for a sanitary landfill operation by deed privisions, agreements or otherwise.

Twenty-first: The Operator hereby represents that all the right, title and interest of Wilfred E. Schultz, Inc. in a refuse disposal agreement between Schultz and the Town of Cheektowaga dated on or about August 17, 1970 has been assigned and transferred to the Operator by Schultz and which the parties hereto agree is now null and void and cancelled and of no future legal effect.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF CAPTURED AMERICAN AND ALLIED FIGHTING MEN AND THOSE MISSING IN ACTION IN THE VIETNAM CONFLICT.

Item No. 44 cont'd WHEREAS article VI of the United States Constitution specifically states that provisions of treaties ratified by the United States Government become the "supreme law of the land", notwithstanding contrary limitations of the WHEREAS notwithstanding solemn promises rartified at the international conference at Geneva that all prisoners of war captured would be given the respect of humane treatment; that Article 2 of the convention provides that it "shall apply to all cases of declared war or any other armed conflict which may arise between two or more of the High Contracting parties, even if the state of war is not recognized by WHEREAS the government of North Vietnam acceded to the convention on June 28, 1957, and the government of South Vietnam acceded to the convention on November 14, 1953, and the government of the United States acceded to the Convention on August 2, 1955; no pretense of compliance has been advanced by North Vietnam or the National Liberation Front (Viet Cong) despite a request to do so on June 11, 1965, by Jacques Freymond, Vice President of the International Committee of the Red Cross and numerous appeals by international humanitarian organizations subsequently, and WHEREAS repeated appeals on the part of wives, parents, relatives, and dependents of those unfortunate victims of Communist inhumanity have proven ineffective through diplomatic, military and humanitarian channels. NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT We, representing people condemn in the strongest terms the repressive and cruel treatment of American and Allied prisoners

and petition that the government of North Vietnam act as follows to:

1. Observe the international accords of the Geneva Convention in the same manner the government of South Vietnam accords to captured troops of the North Vietnam government and their allies.

- 2. Release names and physical condition of all prisoners held.
- 3. Immediately release sick and wounded prisoners.
- 4. Provide for impartial inspections of prisoner or war facilities by international humanitarian organizations.
- 5. Provide for medical treatment of all prisoners.
- 6. Provide for regular flow of mail, food and comfort items.
- 7. Cease using prisoners for purposes of public degradation, political propaganda and mental torture of prisoners and their innocent families.
- 8. Agree to immediately negotiate through international humanitarian organizations for the fair and equitable exchange of prisoners of both sides.

- (a) This Amendment shall take effect immediately except those parts, if any, which are subject to approval under Section 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.
- (b) Any part or parts of this Amendment which is subject to approval under Section 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall take effect from and after the day on which approval in writing is received from the New York State Traffic Commission.

Section 3. Territorial Application

This Amendment shall apply to all of the Town of Cheektowaga Erie County, New York, outside of the Villages of Depew and Sloan.

Section 4. Publication and Posting






