WHEREAS, it appears from legal research that under the present status of the Law under Section 136 of the Highway Law, the County of Erie may not have the legal right to assume the cost of such utility relocation or removal on its County road projects, and

WHEREAS, under the present status of the law, in the original permit to place water mains, sewer lines or similar facilities and appurtenances by water and sewer districts in the County road rights-of-way, every Town and Village in Erie County must submit a permit application to the County Department of Public Works under said Section 136 of the Highway Law, which permit is condition, in Paragraph 2 thereof, as follows:

"Any cost involved in the removal or relocation of installations made overhead, on the surface or underground as a result of this permit, due to highway reconstruction or maintenance work, shall be borne by the owner. Driveways may be excepted by the County's option."

WHEREAS, the County of Erie should equitably and morally assume the costs of such removal or relocation of water mains, sewer lines or similar facilities and appurtenances thereto maintained in the County rights-of-way as a general cost of the County road improvement, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 969 of the Laws of 1969 authorizes Monroe County to pay a portion or all of expenses for the removal or relocation of water mains, sewer lines or similar facilities and appurtenances thereto maintained for public use within the rights-of-way of any County road where the County Superintendent deems such County roads necessary to be repaired, constructed, reconstructed or relocated,

RESOLVED, as follows:

Section 1. That the Town Clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to contact Alan J. Justin, 146th District Assemblyman, and Thomas F. McGowan, 54th District Senator, to introduce and seek enactment of legislation authorizing Erie County to pay for removal and/or relocation of water mains, sewer lines or similar facilities and appurtenances thereto within rights-of-way of County roads in the County of Erie, based upon an act of the Legislature known as Chapter 969 of the Laws of 1969, which authorized such costs to be paid by the County of Monroe.

Section 2. That every Town and Village in Erie County be strongly urged to adopt a resolution similar to this resolution and that the official body of each such municipality be urged to contact each Assemblyman and State Senator in their particular district, urging enactment of the foregoing enabling legislation.

CHAPTER 969 - LAWS OF 1969

Monroe County - Water Mains, Etc. - Removal - Relocation - Payment

An Act authorizing the County of Monroe to pay for removal and/or relocation of water mains, sewer lines, or similar facilities within rights-of-way of county roads in County of Monroe.

Approved and effective May 29, 1969.

Section 1. Notwithstanding any general, special or local law or charter provision to the contrary, the county legislature of the county of Monroe, upon recommendation of the county manager, may provide that the county shall pay a portion of or all expenses for the removal or relocation of any water mains, sewer lines or similar facilities and appurtenances thereto that are maintained for public use within the right-of-way of any county road and where the county superintendent of highways deems such county road necessary to be repaired, constructed, reconstructed or relocated in the interest of public health and safety. Ownership of these facilities shall be restricted to cities, towns, villages in Monroe county or publicly owned authorities or town or county improvement districts. The provisions of this act shall not apply to payment of expenses for removal of such facilities that are owned by private utility corporations.

The Monroe county superintendent of highways shall notify the owner or owners of facilities to be removed or relocated and request them to prepare the necessary plans and specifications, which shall be subject to his approval. The county manager, on behalf of the county, may contract for the removal or relocation of the facilities as a part of the county road highway construction contract. Such action, however, must be preceded by county receipt of a written resolution of

consent from the owner or owners of the facilities. However, the removal of the facilities may be made by the owner of the facility with its own equipment and personnel or pursuant to contract entered into by the owner of the facility with other individuals, firms, companies or corporations. Whichever method is followed, all plans and specifications for the work must be approved by the Monroe county superintendent of highways together with the costs of said work, in order to assure conformance with the county's road project and to determine the amount of cost to the county. Reimbursement by the county of Monroe for advances in the course of the work shall be made by the county superintendent of highways upon examination and audit of construction and cost records. The county superintendent of highways shall have the right to inspect all work or removal or relocation of the facilities.

The expense to the county of such removal and/or relocation of water mains, sewer lines or similar facilities and appurtenances thereto, as provided herein, shall be a proper charge against funds available for the repair, construction, reconstruction or relocation of county roads within Monroe county.

The County of Monroe and cities, towns, villages, publicly owned authorities and town or county improvement districts which operate within the scope of the provisions of this act are hereby authorized to enter into contract for the state purposes and in accordance with this legislation.

The expenditure of moneys by the county for Monroe for any project undertaken by the county, pursuant to the provisions of this act, shall be deemed a lawful county purpose.

The maintenance of the facilities after relocation shall be the responsibility of the owner or owners thereof.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

under Section 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall take effect from and after the day on which approval in writing is received from the New York State Traffic Commission.

Section 3. Territorial Application.

This Amendment shall apply to all of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York, outside of the Villages of Depew and Sloan.

Section 4. Publication and Posting

This Amendment to said Traffic Ordinance shall be entered in the minutes of this Town Board and shall be published in the DEPEW HERALD AND CHEEKTOWAGA NEWS, a newspaper published in this Town, and a printed copy thereof shall be posted on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk pursuant to Subdivision 6 of Section 20 of the Town Law of New York, and affidavits of such publication and posting shall be filed with the Town Clerk, and the Town Clerk shall likewise enter in the Ordinance Book a copy of this Amendment specifying the date of adoption thereof.

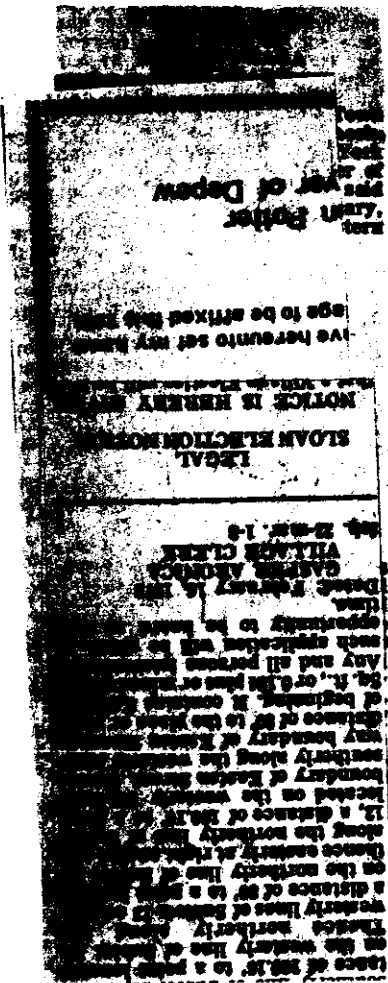

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THIS AGREEMENT, made this 12th day of January, 1973, by and between Daniel E. Weber, Supervisor of the Town of Cheektowaga, on and behalf of the Town Board of Cheektowaga, hereinafter referred to as the "Board", and the Supervisory Unit, hereinafter referred to as the "Unit".

WHEREAS, it is the intent and purpose of the parties to set forth herein the basic agreement covering wages and terms and conditions of employment to be observed between the parties hereto.

"IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT ANY PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT REQUIRING LEGISLATIVE ACTION TO PERMIT THE IMPLEMENTATION BY AMENDMENT OF LAW OR PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDS THEREFOR, SHALL NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE UNTIL THE APPROPRIATE LEGISLATIVE BODY HAS GIVEN ITS APPROVAL."

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed as follows:

ARTICLE 1

Section 1.01 Recognition

The Board recognizes the Unit as the "exclusive" bargaining agent for the Superintendent of the Disposal Plant, all working and assistant-working Foremen, except the working Foremen in the Sanitation Department. Such recognition shall extend to the maximum period allowed by law.

ARTICLE 2

Section 2.01 Dues Checkoff and Authorization

Upon the written request of an employee, the Board will deduct from the said salary of said employee, such amounts for membership dues as the employee may specify and will transmit said sums to the Unit on a monthly basis.

ARTICLE 3

Section 3.01 Salaries

All members of the Unit shall be paid pursuant to and consistent with the salary schedule set forth in Appendix A.

All members of the Unit shall be paid time and one-half (1 1/2) of their regular rate of pay for all work performed in excess of eight (8) hours per day or forty (40) hours in any work week. When computing overtime, paid holidays shall be considered as if the employee had worked.

Section 4.01 Holidays

ARTICLE 5

Section 5.01 Vacations

All employees covered by this agreement shall be entitled each year to the following vacations:

After 1 year	10 working days
After 5 years	15 working days
After 10 years	17 working days
After 15 years	22 working days
After 20 years	25 working days
After 25 years	30 working days

Each member of the Unit shall be entitled to and paid at the time of his retirement the monetary value of unused vacation time outstanding to his credit at the date of his retirement. In the event of death while employed, payment shall be made to his estate.

ARTICLE 6

Section 6.01 Longevity

All employees shall, on the anniversary date of the completion of ten (10) years of service, receive an additional one hundred (\$100) dollars; upon the completion of fifteen (15) years of service, an additional one hundred fifty (\$150) dollars; upon the completion of twenty (20) years of service, an additional two hundred fifty (\$250) dollars. Said sums shall be paid to the employee on the final pay period of the month in which his anniversary occurs.

ARTICLE 7

Section 7.01 Sick Leave

Each member of the Unit shall be entitled to the following paid sick leave:

After 1 year	7 days
2 to 10 years	15 days
After 10 years	18 days

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Each member of the Unit may accumulate a maximum of two hundred sixty-two (262) sick days.

Section 7.02 Personal Leave

Each employee shall be granted five (5) personal days per year. Personal leave is non-cumulative. The arrangement for the use of time off shall be made by the member of the Unit at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance, except in cases of emergency. Where such leave is granted, it shall be with pay and shall not be deducted from vacations, or other accrued benefits.

Section 7.03 Jury Duty

Members of the Unit who are required to report for jury duty shall be paid their full salary; they shall, however, assign to the Board all fees, except those sums received as reimbursement for actual expenses, such as mileage, meals, lodging and the like.

Section 7.04 Death in the Family

In the event of a death in the family of an employee's spouse, parents, children, sisters, brothers, grandparents, father-in-law or mother-in-law, the member of the Unit may be granted five (5) consecutive days without loss of pay. The day of the funeral only shall be granted for the death of a brother-in-law or sister-in-law.

ARTICLE 8

Section 8.01 Health Insurance

The Board will continue the 50-51 Blue Cross and Blue Shield Plan and pay the full premium, at the current rate, at the time the Board adopts its budget, including the XBR one (\$1) dollar co-pay rider.

ARTICLE 9

Section 9.01 Life Insurance

The Board will provide a twenty thousand (\$20,000) dollar life insurance policy for each member of the Unit at no cost to the member.

ARTICLE 10

Section 10.01 Retirement

The Board will provide each member of the Unit with the New York State Retirement Plan as provided for in Section 75 g of the Retirement and Social Security Law, commonly known as the 25 Year Half-Pay Retirement Plan, at no cost to the employees.

Section 10.02 Payment for Unused Sick Leave

Employees who retire shall be compensated for accumulated sick leave at the time

These payments may be paid over the last twelve (12) months of employment, and the employee must give at least twelve (12) months notice of his intention to retire. If the employee elects to have this payment made in a lump sum, he must give at least six (6) months notice of his intention to retire.

ARTICLE 11

Section 11.01 Grievance Procedure

A grievance is the complaint by a member of the Unit of an alleged violation of any of the terms and conditions of this agreement between the Board and the Unit.

No alleged violation shall be entertained and shall be deemed waived unless presented at the first available stage within five (5) working days after the aggrieved party knew or should have known of the act and conditions upon which the alleged grievance is based.

Any member of the Unit having a grievance will discuss it with his immediate supervisor, directly or through a representative of the Unit, with the view of settling the grievance informally.

If the grievance is not resolved informally, it may be reduced to writing and submitted to the supervisor, who shall render his decision within ten (10) working days.

If the grievance is not resolved within ten (10) working days, it shall be submitted to the Town Board for resolution at its next meeting.

If the grievance is not resolved by the Board at its next meeting or within ten (10) days thereafter, it may be submitted to binding arbitration. That said request must be made within fifteen (15) working days after the Board has rendered its decision.

Section 11.02 Arbitration

The arbitrator shall be selected by mutual agreement of the parties. If the parties are unable to agree upon an arbitrator, a request for a list of arbitrators may be made to the Public Employment Relations Board, by either party, within ten (10) days and in writing.

The parties shall be bound by the rules and procedures of the Public Employment Relations Board.

The cost for the services of the arbitrator, including expenses, if any, shall be borne equally by the Board and the Unit.

ARTICLE 12

In the event any provision of this agreement is or shall be contrary to law, all other provisions of this agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

THIS AGREEMENT shall become effective on the first day of January, 1973, and shall remain in full force and effect until midnight, December 31, 1974, and shall be automatically renewed on a year to year basis unless either party shall notify the other, in writing, on or before June 1, 1974, of its intention to negotiate for the successive year or years. The parties shall meet no later than fifteen (15) days after the receipt of said notice.

THIS AGREEMENT constitutes the entire agreement between the parties.

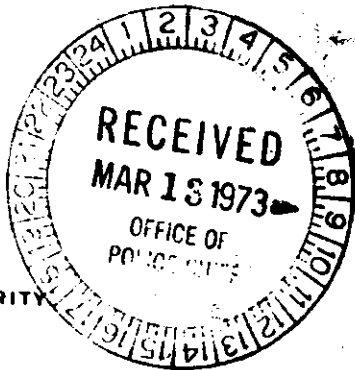

Dear Chief Kostrezewski:

Thank you for your letter of March 9 to Mr. Balme relative to the closing March 19, for about three months, of the ramp at Interchange 50. Please proceed with your plans as outlined in your letter.

To reiterate, these are to provide an additional patrol totaling two men in either one or two cars, as needed, in the Cleveland Drive area for not more than three hours per man per day. We believe that the extra men are needed only on weekdays for commuter traffic, but we will defer to your judgment on the weekend situation.

The Thruway Authority agrees, in return for this police traffic control, to compensate the Town of Cheektowaga at the rate of \$5.54 per hour per man and a fringe benefit rate of 40.75%, as you proposed. In addition, the Thruway will pay 11 cents per mile for the use of vehicles which is the standard for the State of New York.

Please be certain to itemize all charges, including the names of the men, the dates and the hours worked. We suggest that you send us an itemized statement, and we will prepare a standard state voucher which will be returned to you for signature. All Thruway fiscal matters are audited by the State Department of Audit & Control.


