AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of October, 1974, by and between the TOWN OF CHEektowaga, Erie County, New York, a municipal corporation, with offices at Broadway and Union Road, Cheektowaga, New York, hereinafter referred to as the "TOWN", and CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF BUFFALO, N.Y., INC., a civic and charitable organization, with offices at 525 Washington Street, Buffalo, New York, hereinafter referred to as the "AGENCY".

W I T N E S S E T H :

WHEREAS, the AGENCY, in cooperation with the TOWN, is desirous of operating and maintaining a "Youth Services Project" whereby school drop-outs and potential school drop-outs within the TOWN will receive vocational, educational, and personal adjustment counseling; and

WHEREAS, the TOWN is a municipality eligible to receive state aid and reimbursement of expenditures from the State of New York for sponsoring a "Youth Services Project" and

WHEREAS, the TOWN will appropriate the sum of \$25,540.00 for said "Youth Services Project",

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

1. The TOWN will sponsor a Youth Services Project and pay to the AGENCY a sum not to exceed \$25,540.00 during the term of this Agreement for the operation and maintenance of a family oriented counseling program for school drop-outs and potential school drop-outs. The anticipated costs and expenses of said project are specified on the Proposed Budget which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. The amount paid by the TOWN, in accordance with paragraph 1., constitutes the TOWN's full and complete obligation with regard to this Agreement and all consequences arising therefrom, except the TOWN shall be entitled to apply for state aid and reimbursement of expenditures as sponsor of the project in accordance with the applicable provisions of

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the Executive Law of the State of New York.

The amount paid by the TOWN will be paid as follows:

The AGENCY will submit expenses incurred on a quarterly basis on duly authorized vouchers to the TOWN. Upon receipt of the vouchers, the TOWN will pay the AGENCY for services rendered during the quarter.

3. The AGENCY's share of the project expenses will be twenty-five (25) per cent of the total costs and expenses incurred, not to exceed \$6,305.00. The TOWN will bill the AGENCY for the AGENCY's share of the project expenses upon payment by the TOWN of expenses incurred during the final quarter.

4. The AGENCY agrees to operate a Youth Service Project whereby school drop-outs and potential school drop-outs within the TOWN, regardless of race, color or creed, will receive vocational, educational and personal adjustment counseling.

5. The AGENCY agrees to carry out the terms of this agreement in accordance with the Division for Youth Act and the rules and regulations of the Cheektowaga Youth Board and the State Division for Youth; and the project will be operated in compliance with all laws and the Constitution of the State of New York.

6. The AGENCY agrees to hire as its own employees any and all personnel required to implement and effectuate the operation of the Youth Services Project.

7. Except with relation to the duties normally accepted and imposed upon the AGENCY, this Agreement shall constitute the full and complete obligation of the parties hereto.

8. This Agreement is contingent and conditioned upon approval of required renewal applications and acceptance by the New York State Division for Youth.

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9. This agreement will cover the period from January 1, 1975 to December 31, 1975.

A PROPOSAL TO CHEEKTOWAGA YOUTH BOARD

FAMILY ORIENTED COUNSELING PROGRAM FOR SCHOOL DROP-OUTS

PROBLEM:

There are a significant number of Cheektowaga youth who have dropped out of school. According to the New York State Department of Education, 389 drop-outs were recorded for the three school years between 1970 - 1972. The New York State Department of Education defines "drop-out" as a student who has left school for any reason and is not known to be enrolled in any school district. In addition, the 1970 census indentifies 784 Cheektowaga youth who are not high school graduates and not enrolled in school.

PROPOSAL:

The object of this proposal is to provide expanded opportunities for the youth of Cheektowaga who have dropped out of school. We intend to utilize a reach out and family oriented approach, using resources and influences existing within both the family and community structures. The youth to be served will be under 21 years of age.

PROGRAM:

- 1.) The Drop-Out Program will serve Cheektowaga youth who have dropped out from the school system.
- 2.) Method will focus on the family and the individual.

Current practice concentrates on individual diagnosis and treatment. We believe that each member of the family affects every other member - positively or negatively. Services to youth will meet only with every limited success if other negative factors in the family are ignored. However, when the needs and circumstances of a youth indicate that the family approach is not appropriate, individual needs will be met.

3.) Approach will be non-traditional. The Social Worker will reach out to each school drop-out and his family.

4.) After identification, an attempt will be made to secure all available information relating to the circumstances surrounding each youth's separation from school.

5.) Each youth's circumstances will be evaluated and a plan of action will be developed with his family.

6.) Where appropriate, the Social Worker will attempt to return the youth to his regular school program.

7.) If referral to other community resource is indicated, regular follow-up counseling will continue in the family setting.

8.) Individual confidential records will be maintained in order to measure the movement and progress of the family.

9.) Additional data will be maintained in order to measure the parameters of the School Drop-Out problem and to feedback appropriate information to the School System.

ANTICIPATED RESULTS:

1.) Identification and location of each school drop-out within the Town of Cheektowaga.

2.) Determination of reasons for discontinuance of education.

3.) Identification of needs for educational, vocational, and personal adjustment counseling for each drop-out.

4.) Development of methods for working with drop-outs and potential drop-outs through a family approach.

5.) Short term and long term intensive counseling and to an estimated 110 - 150 youth and there families.

6.) Gain knowledge needed to make recommendations for preventive programs.

7.) Achieve substantial success in meeting needs of drop - outs and their families.

ADMINISTRATION:

This program will be supervised and administered by Catholic Charities of Buffalo, N.Y., according to the terms specified in the contractual agreement signed by the Director of Catholic Charities of Buffalo, N.Y. and the appropriate official of the Town of Cheektowaga, N.Y.

Department established prior to January 1, 1960: Amounts in accordance with an agreement made between the town and a village within the town which maintains a full-time police department of four or more policemen.

Joint Police Department (General Municipal Law, Section 121-a)

Recreation (Article 13, General Municipal Law)

Amounts for parks, playgrounds and recreation centers established under the provisions of Article 13 of the General Municipal Law.

Refuse and Garbage (Section 120-v, General Municipal Law)

The share of the cost to be paid by the town in accordance with an agreement between the town and one or more villages for joint refuse and garbage collection and disposal, unless otherwise provided.

- (3) Revenues estimated to be received from any of the functions or activities for which taxes are levied in the town outside the village must be applied to the estimate of expenditures for such function or activity (Town Law, Section 112(1)).

Non-property tax distributed by a county must be credited to the town area outside of village if the village receives a cash distribution of non-property taxes from the county.

W I T N E S S E T H

FIRST: The Municipality hereby agrees to remove snow, to sand, and to control ice and snow on certain County Roads, hereinafter defined; and, in implementing such removal and control, to erect and remove its own snow fences where it deems desirable, all at an annual rate and for the agreed consideration of Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per Lane Mile.
