Attached for Town Board consideration and approval is a resolution approving an increase in the contract of M.C. Morgan Contractors, Inc. for sanitary sewer rehabilitation in the total amount of \$53,895.10.

The original contract for the rehabilitation project along Maryvale Drive, between Unionvale East and Unionvale West, was to replace approximately 560' of 18" pipe and manholes from Unionvale East 560' to the west. Subsequent T.V. inspection of the last 500' revealed additional defects. This sewer is under the curb on the north side of Maryvale Drive and would require cutting the pavement. Maryvale Drive is a County Road and the County requires that if you replace a complete reach of sewers in the pavement, you must replace the pavement to the center of the road.

It was determined to relocate the sewer from under the pavement to a point under the sidewalk in the right-of-way for the original contract portion at no increase in contract cost as stated by M.C. Morgan Contractors, Inc. Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc. then recommended that the additional 500' to Unionvale West, where additional defects were found, also be replaced under the sidewalk. The additional portion would be approximately equal to the pavement replacement of the original portion. This pavement replacement to the center of the road was not included in the original bid price.







WHEREAS, an Agreement by and between the Town and the Church for the use by the Town of the Church's facilities for a nutrition program for Senior Citizens is authorized by Article 13-D of the General Municipal Law

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Town agrees to sponsor and operate a nutrition program for Senior Citizens wherein and whereby Senior Citizens who are residents of the County of Erie who are sixty (60) years of age or over, regardless of race, color or creed, will be eligible to participate in the daily hot meals program offered by Town sponsorship, through the Erie County Department of Senior Services.
2. The Church hereby grants to the Town, subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed, the right to use and occupy its facilities, free of charge, for the conducting of said nutrition program for Senior Citizens.
3. The Church hereby agrees to allow the use and occupancy of its facilities, for the conducting of said program Monday through Friday, including school holidays and vacation periods, but excepting those legal County of Erie holidays as are specified in Article XII of the currently effective collective bargaining agreement between the County of Erie and the Erie County Chapter of the Civil Service Employees Association, Inc.

4. The Town agrees to hire, as its own employee, a Site Manager who will be responsible for the general operation of said program; and, in addition thereto, the Town will secure the services of a sufficient number of volunteers in order to implement and effectuate the operation of said program.

5. The Town agrees that its Site Manager and volunteers will be responsible for the ordering and receiving of the food for the said program when it is delivered to the cafeteria facilities in the morning; the preparing and serving of all meals for the said program; and the cleaning up of all equipment, plates, eating utensils and like items used for said program.

6. The Church agrees to assist the Town in publicizing the said program among its parishioners and to assist in recruiting volunteers for the said program by way of notices and/or announcements in the Church Bulletin.

7. The parties agree to comply with all Federal, State and County laws, rules and regulations applicable to the operation and administration of the said program.

8. The Town agrees to carry public liability insurance, indemnifying and holding harmless the Church against loss by reason of the negligence of the Town, its agents, servants and/or employees, in the operation of the said program; and said liability insurance is to include "Products Liability" coverage.

9. The term of this Agreement shall be one (1) year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1982 and terminating on the 31st December, 1982 but subject to the following:

a. This agreement shall be renewable year to year after the aforementioned termination date upon the mutual agreement of the parties hereto.

b. Either party may by notice in writing to the other terminate this Agreement, and sixty (60) days after the receipt of such notice this Agreement shall terminate.

THIRD: The schedule and map of County Roads which are affected by this Agreement are attached hereto and marked Exhibit A and Exhibit B respectively.

FOURTH: The Municipality hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County of Erie from all claims, demands, suits and judgments for personal injury or property damage arising out of the performance of the Municipality's obligations under this Agreement. The Municipality further agrees to maintain insurance coverage during the term of this Agreement and submit certificates of insurance in accordance with Exhibit C attached hereto. In lieu thereof, the Municipality may furnish satisfactory evidence of a self-insurance plan acceptable to the Erie County Director of Insurance and the Erie County Attorney.

FIFTH: The term of this Agreement shall be for a period beginning on the 1st day of November, 1981 through August 31, 1982, and shall include the entire 1981-1982 winter season.

SIXTH: This Agreement is made pursuant to resolution of the Erie County Legislature adopted December 17, 1981, being Item , Resolution , Resolve of the 1981 Legislative Proceedings, and pursuant to a resolution of the Legislative Board of the undersigned municipality, adopted at a Meeting of said Board on February 16, 1982

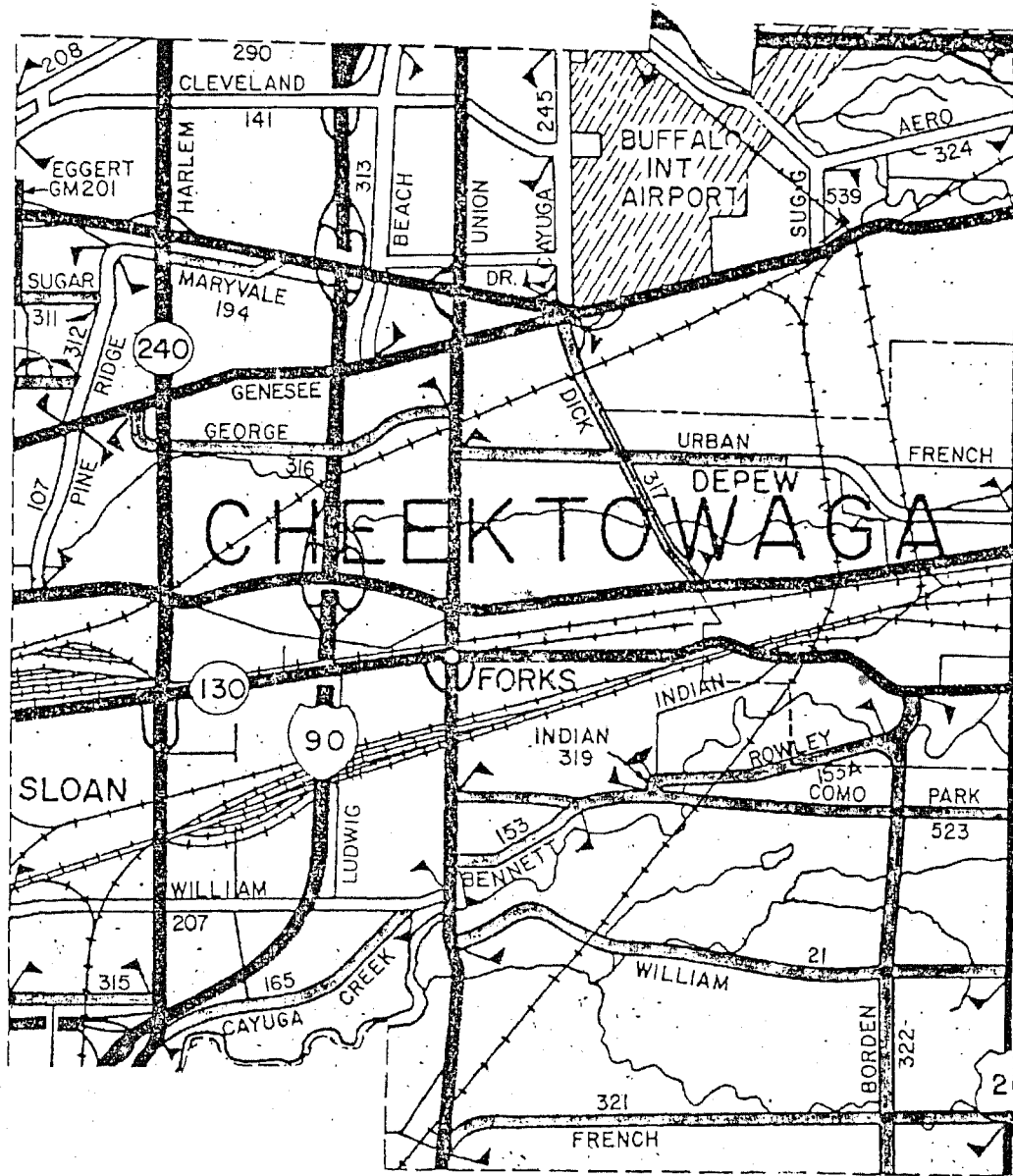

MEMORANDUM AGREEMENT

This Memorandum, when accepted and agreed to by the Town of Cheektowaga, will constitute the Agreement between the Town of Cheektowaga, Broadway and Union, Cheektowaga, New York, hereinafter called the "Town" and Harvmor Waste & Scrap Equipment Sales Corporation, a New York corporation with offices at 510 Brisbane Building, Buffalo, New York, hereinafter called "Harvmor".

For good and valuable consideration, the Parties hereto agree:

1. The term of this Agreement will be for six (6) months, and said term will commence on the date of the acceptance and agreement by the Town;
2. This Agreement can be renewed for additional six (6) month terms by the Town at its sole option;
3. It is agreed that Harvmor will act as the Town's Consultant during the term of this Agreement in the capacity of Advisor, in the Town's new garbage and trash recycling program;
4. The Town will collect, separate and prepare for sale the various items of trash and garbage that are to be sold separately for purposes of recycling;
5. Harvmor will be the exclusive broker for the sale of these trash and garbage materials;
6. Harvmor will receive as its compensation:
 - a) five (5%) percent of the sale price of the

- materials (not including freight), or
- b) two dollars (\$2.00) per net ton, whichever is the greater amount;

7. Harvmor, in its capacity as Broker for the Town, will use its best efforts to submit competitive bids in locating and obtaining purchasers for the Town's various items of trash and garbage;

8. Harvmor will also use its best efforts to obtain (by loan) the necessary equipment for the Town's recycling program. Such equipment, however, is to be installed, maintained and insured at the sole expense of the Town.

9. It is further understood that in some instances Harvmor, in its good judgment, may recommend the Town's purchase of some recycling equipment. (The Parties acknowledge that Harvmor may itself bid for the sale of some such equipment to the Town);

10. For twenty-four (24) months after the termination of this Agreement (or any renewals thereof) and as a further inducement to Harvmor's entering into this Agreement, the Town agrees that it will not sell its trash and garbage for purposes of recycling, to any of the persons, firms or corporations that purchased such materials during the term of this Agreement (or its renewals);

11. If the Town elects not to abide by the above restriction in Paragraph "10.", then in that event, the Town will pay Harvmor the same brokerage fees for such sales as described in Paragraph "6." above.

12. This Agreement may be terminated by either party

upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to such other.

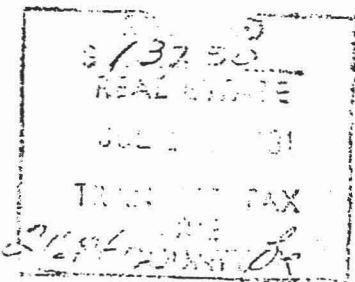



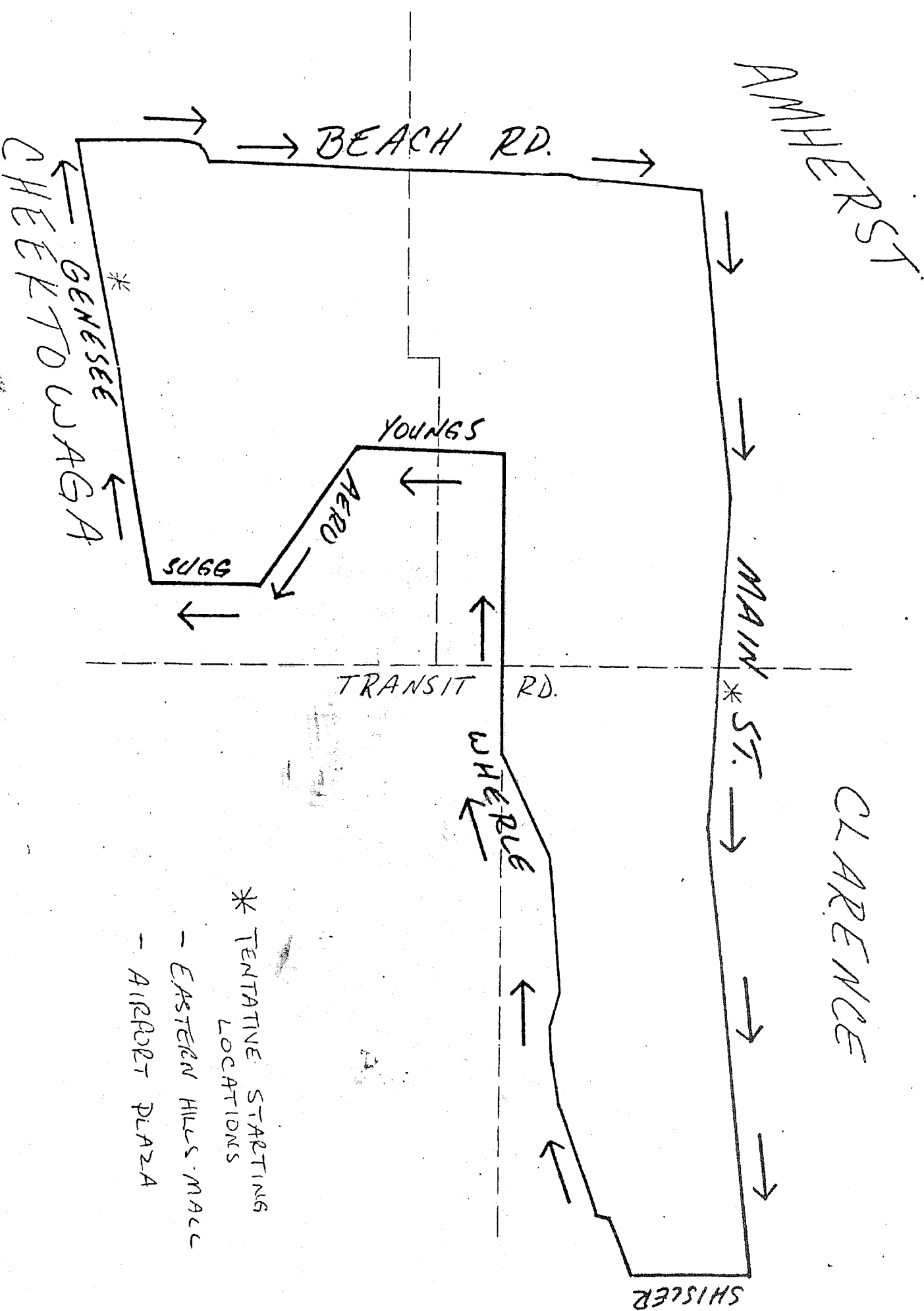

Dear Mr. Ormsby:

This letter is in response to our telephone conversation of February 25, 1982 concerning the above-mentioned proposed water district.

In your letter of December 10, 1981, you advised that the proposal could not be approved since the projected annual average cost of the proposed district to the typical homeowner is extremely high, i.e. \$588.05.

Upon reflection and reconsideration of all aspects of this project, I find that the figure of \$588.05 submitted to you represents the projected annual cost to a typical landowner, as opposed to a typical homeowner.

The projected annual cost to the average homeowner, as requested in your letter of May 28, 1981, at 9%, amounts to \$270.93. This figure is based on the average assessed valuation of the homes in the district (\$2,211.54) and the average assessment per \$1,000.00 assessed valuation (\$122.51).

The Town believes that this revised cost represents a reasonable figure and does not amount to an "unreasonable burden" upon any average homeowner.

Based upon the above information, the Town of Cheektowaga respectfully requests that your Office approves the proposal for Water District No. 8.

The applicant, Mr. Russo, has removed only a small percentage of the topsoil currently stockpiled on his property located at 4878 Transit Road under permits issued for the previous two (2) years. This stockpile is located adjacent to the Madeira Retention Basin and the applicant has conducted previous years activities in a responsible manner. The removal of this topsoil stockpile should not cause any local drainage problems due to the existing topography and the neighboring retention basin.

The following is recommended as a condition of permit issuance:

- 1) Access to site shall be only from Transit Road.
- 2) The area shall be reseeded in accordance with the attached letter from Merriman Conservation Consultants Inc.
- 3) All debris (i.e. brush, small trees associated with this stockpile) shall be removed from the site and be properly disposed of.

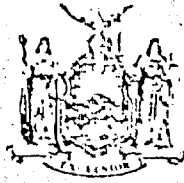

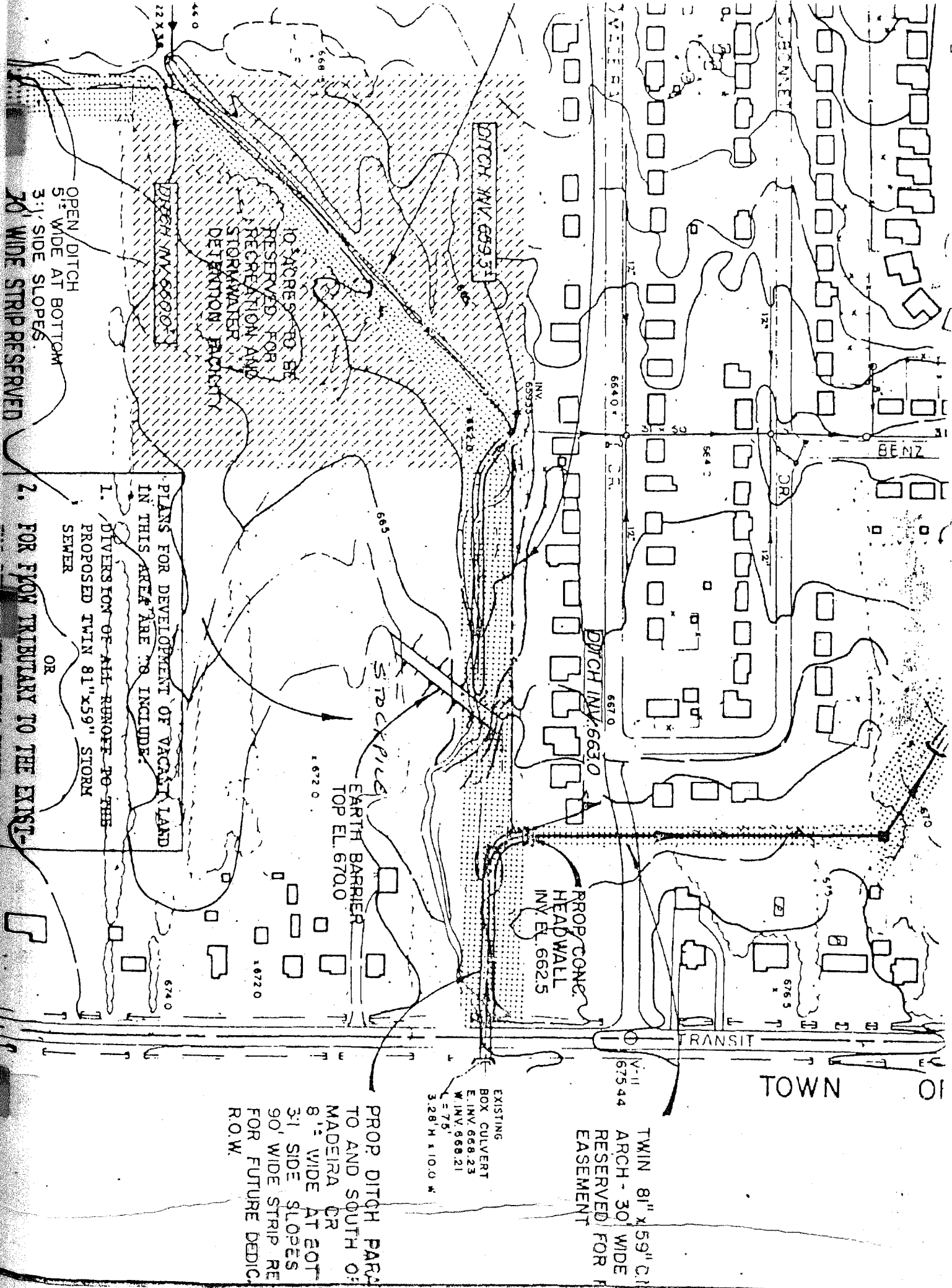

Comments on Drainage Area South Of

Madiera Subdivision
for the
Town of Cheektowaga

The soils of this area are deep and somewhat poorly to poorly drained. They are classified as Madalin and Niagara silt loam soils with silty glacial till subsoils or shaley glacial till subsoils. In either case, water percolation is very slow and drainage is usually a critical factor.

The good depth of these soils however, usually provides a fair to good source of topsoil if it is stripped carefully leaving at least six inches in place and if adequate provision is made for proper drainage.

A tour of the site with a soil auger indicates that most of the area has been left with sufficient topsoil to support a good grass cover. The only exception is a small area in the easterly quarter of the temporary impoundment basin where the shaley glacial till substratum is exposed. This should be recovered with topsoil because the bare till has a very poor water handling capacity. (Saturated during wet seasons and parched dry during summer periods.) In addition, frost action in the bare till shifts the shale particles significantly and tends to shear through tender grass roots if indeed grass does become established.

The best time to seed such an area is as early in the season as possible. This helps assure that the usual spring rains will help germinate the seed and a good ground cover is established before the dry summer months. Usually this can be accomplished without mulching but mulch is a good form of insurance especially if the seeding is done later in the season. These calcareous soils do not require additional lime but 500 lbs. of a 5-10-5 fertilizer or its equivalent per acre should be worked into the soil prior to seeding.

A good seeding mixture for this site would consist of the following per acre:

- 10 lbs. Creeping red fescue
- 20 lbs. Pennfire perennial ryegrass
- 10 lbs. Pennlawn red fescue
- 5 lbs. Garrison creeping foxtail
- 5 lbs. Kentucky bluegrass






