I. PUBLIC HEARING

Item No. 2 This being the time and place advertised for a public hearing to consider the advisability of adopting an amendment to Chapter 76 of the Code of the said Town of Cheektowaga, (Vehicle and Traffic), hereinafter more particularly described, the Supervisor directed the Town Clerk to present proof of the publication and posting of the notice of hearing. The Town Clerk presented proof that such notice has been duly published and posted, and upon the order of the Supervisor such proof was duly filed. Said amendment being as follows:

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ARTICLE X

Parking, Standing and Stopping

Section 76-102. Parking prohibited in designated locations shall be amended by adding thereto the following:

B. No Parking Anytime

CLOVERDALE ROAD	South Side	from the west curblineline of Mayfair Court to a point 70 plus or minus feet west of curblineline of Mayfair Court.
COMMUNITY ROAD	South Side	from the east curblineline of Donlen Drive to a point 145 plus or minus feet east of the east curblineline of Donlen Drive.
COMMUNITY ROAD	West and North Sides	from the south curblineline of Maryvale Drive to the east curblineline of Cedargrove Circle.
COLDEN COURT	East Side	from the north curblineline of Genesee Street to the north property line of 157 Colden Court (a distance of 315 plus or minus feet).

Section 76-102. Parking prohibited in designated locations shall be amended by deleting therefrom the following:

C. No Parking Here to Corner

COLDEN COURT                      East Side                      from north curb of Genesee Street to No. 167 Colden Court.

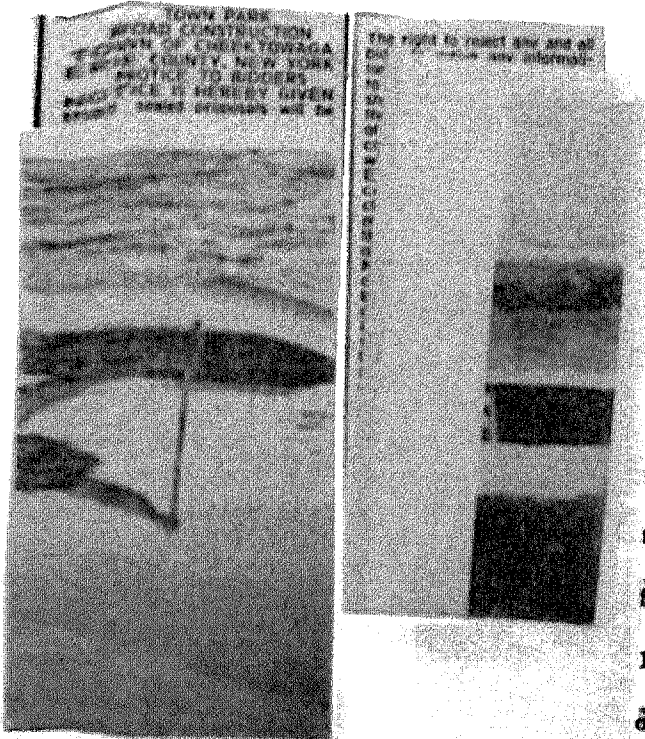

RESOLVED that upon completion of the preparation of agreements and related documents relative to Town participation, and review of same by the Office of Town Attorney and the Town Board, the Supervisor shall be authorized to execute same on behalf of the town, without further action by the Town Board, and to obligate and pay over such sums as required under the terms of such agreements, in accordance with applicable rules, regulations, and procedures.

AMENDED RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Town has received an application from the Buffalo Airport Center Associates, a limited partnership with the Buffalo Airport Center Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Snyder Corporation, as general partner, seeking the Town's participation in the redevelopment of the Westinghouse Plant facility at 4454 Genesee Street, in the Town, to the level of \$2,000,000.00; and

WHEREAS, by resolution of February 3, 1986, the Supervisor was authorized to execute, on the Town's behalf, a funding approval and grant agreement and loan guarantee acceptance provisions with the Department of Housing and Urban Development to commit acceptance of a loan from that Department under the Section 108 Guaranteed Loan Program in the sum of \$2,000,000.00 to the Town and has so executed such documents, securing for the Town a commitment for such loan funds; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has fully reviewed the partnership's request for Town participation and is of the judgment that the project will serve to protect the tax base of the town in the property, to the benefit of the Town and its inhabitants, and that town participation in the redevelopment is necessary in order to fully effectuate such redevelopment and to achieve full benefit to the town; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and hereby is directed to execute on the Town's behalf and forward to the partnership an offer to commit the Town to participation in the redevelopment of the Westinghouse Plant facility upon the general terms and conditions as set forth in a Synopsis of such general terms and conditions of Town Participation in the redevelopment project, which is attached to and made part of this resolution, up to a level of \$2,000,000.00 upon the partnership's acceptance of such offer within 15 days of its tender by the Town, the partnership's

compliance with all terms and conditions of such synopsis relative to applicable conditions to be met as conditions precedent to final execution of agreements relative to Town participation, and execution of an agreement for payments in-lieu-of taxes, previously negotiated between representatives of the Town and the partnership, and set forth in a written agreement, which is annexed to and made part of this resolution; further conditioned upon the amendment of the existing agreement between the partnership and the Erie County Industrial Development Agency setting payments in lieu of taxes for the Westinghouse plant premises, to substitute therefor, for the full effective term of the agreements between the partnership and the Erie County Industrial Development Agency concerning such premises, the terms, conditions and amounts of payments in lieu of taxes as negotiated between the partnership and the Town, as reflected in the annexed written agreement; AND IT IS FURTHER

RESOLVED that upon acceptance of the Town's offer to commit to participation in the redevelopment by the partnership, James F. Mietlicki, Counsel to the Cheektowaga Economic Development Corporation, shall be immediately designated and authorized to act as the representative of the Town relative to all legal matters involved in the preparation of the agreements and related documentation between the Town, the partnership and the Erie County Development Agency as current recorded titleholder to the redevelopment site, and the closing of such agreements relative to Town participation subject to oversight by the Office of the Town Attorney and the Town Board, with his compensation for services rendered on the Town's behalf to be fixed in accordance with the terms of the aforesaid synopsis, which compensation shall, under the terms of such synopsis, constitute a cost of Town participation to the partnership, and which shall be reimbursed to the Town by the partnership; AND IT IS FURTHER

RESOLVED that upon completion of the preparation of agreements and related documents relative to Town participation, and review of same by the Office of Town Attorney and the Town Board, the Supervisor shall be authorized to execute same on behalf of the town, without further action by the Town Board, and to obligate and pay over such sums as required under the terms of such agreements, in accordance with applicable rules, regulations, and procedures.

## SYNOPSIS

### Terms of Town Participation in Acquisition of the Westinghouse Site through Buffalo Airport Center, Inc.

The following shall constitute the general terms upon which the Town of Cheektowaga shall agree in principal to participation in the acquisition of the former Westinghouse site and the development of such site as an industrial-commercial development by the Buffalo Airport Center Associates and the Buffalo Airport Center, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the "partnership")

- A. The Town shall participate in acquisition of the property to a level of \$ 2,000,000.00.
- B. The Town's portion of acquisition funding shall be repaid to the Town by the partnership with interest at an annual rate equal to the rate of interest of a loan to be made to the Town from H.U.D. under the Section 108 Guaranteed Loan Program, the proceeds of which would be used to fund Town participation in the project, which rate shall be determined at the closing of such loan, plus 0.5% additional annual interest.
- C. Repayment of the Town's portion of acquisition funding shall be over a 6 year term, amortised over a 10 year schedule.
- D. The partnership shall secure repayment to the Town by providing the Town with an irrevocable letter of credit in the sum of \$ 2,000,000.00, naming the Town as beneficiary, drawn upon a federally chartered or state chartered bank, which letter shall provide that in the event of default, the Town may elect to draw upon such letter for payment of any and all unpaid principal and accrued interest upon the remaining balance of the acquisition funding not repaid by the partnership, including principal and interest due as the result of acceleration. Such letter shall be in a form acceptable to the Town, and shall not require the Town to exhaust its remedies against the partnership, any partner or subsidiary of the partnership prior to the exercise of its right to draw against same in case of default. In the event that the Town shall be required to provide H.U.D. with its own letter of credit as security for the Section 108 Guaranteed Loan funding Town participation in the acquisition, the letter of credit to the Town from the partnership shall provide that such letter may serve as the basis of and security for the issuance of a letter of credit from the Town to H.U.D. In the event that such letter of credit to the Town shall be renewable or terminable by the issuing bank on an annual or other basis, such letter shall provide that same shall not be terminated or revoked except at the close of such annual or other term, and shall be terminable or revocable only after a minimum of 30 days notice of intention of the issuing bank to terminate or revoke such letter to the Town as beneficiary, which notice may be effected only in writing, by personal delivery or registered mail to the Town Community Development Director. In the event of such termination or revocation by the issuing bank of such letter, the insolvency of the issuing bank, or other event relative to the issuing bank or partnership which would affect the validity of the letter or the Town's ability to draw against same, the

partnership shall be in default of its obligations under the acquisition agreement, and shall have 5 business days after such termination or revocation, or such other event, to arrange for and provide the Town with a letter of credit complying with the terms and conditions of this paragraph. Should such substituted letter of credit not be provided within such period, the whole amount of unpaid principal and interest accrued to be paid under the agreement shall be immediately due and owing by acceleration. However, it is specifically understood by the partnership that any letter of credit provided to the Town pursuant to the requirement of this paragraph must first be approved by H.U.D., as such approval is a condition of the Town's ability to borrow funds necessary to its participation in the project.

- E. Funds provided by the Town are to be used exclusively for its acquisition of an interest in the Westinghouse site, and shall be drawn down from the proceeds of the Town's Section 108 Guaranteed Loan from H.U.D. in accordance with federal requirements applicable to such loans.
  - F. The partnership agrees that it shall comply with all requirements imposed by H.U.D. and all other federal requirements in relation to federally funded projects.
  - G. The partnership shall use its best efforts to cause a minimum of 200 new jobs to be created through the development of the site and subletting of portions of the property to tenants for use as on-going businesses. For purposes of this provision, new jobs shall be defined as follows:
    - 1. Jobs developed since the commencement of redevelopment of the site in the fall of 1985, and remaining in place at closing of the loan between the Town and H.U.D. and/or of the acquisition agreement; and
    - 2. Jobs developed thereafter by the partnership remaining in place for a minimum of one year, or by a tenant who shall be a lessee at the site for at least one year from such time;
    - 3. To be considered as a new job, the job must be a full time job position, but part time positions may be aggregated to full time job equivalents (e.g. 2 positions of 20 hours per week which would otherwise comply shall equal one full time job.)
    - 4. Jobs brought to the site as relocation of existing jobs from within the Buffalo Standard Metropolitan area shall not be taken into account in meeting this requirement.
- In the event that this job creation commitment is not achieved within 2 years following closing of the acquisition agreement, the Town shall have the option to accelerate and call in full all principal and accrued interest remaining for payment under the agreement.
- H. Relative to any transfer of the site or a portion thereof during the term of the acquisition agreement, the following shall apply:
    - 1. Lands north of the north access roadway in the rear parking lot (now unimproved) may be transferred without restriction;

2. The partnership shall be prohibited from transferring title to the site or any portion thereof to the Niagara Frontier Transportation Authority or any other governmental or tax exempt entity for the period of Town participation in the project. The partnership further agrees that it shall not attempt to circumvent this prohibition by transfer to a third party who would then consummate the prohibited transaction. However, the partnership may negotiate a transfer of the site or portion thereof to the N.F.T.A. or other governmental or tax exempt entity under circumstances in which such entity is actively threatening condemnation by eminent domain, and the Town shall not withhold consent to such a sale in lieu of condemnation providing that, as a condition of such sale, the acquiring entity shall agree that it shall fully assume the obligations of the partnership for the making of payment to the Town and other taxing authorities covered by the agreement for payment in lieu of taxes between the partnership and the Town to the same levels as set forth in such agreement. It shall be the responsibility of the partnership to negotiate the inclusion of such provisions for payment in lieu of taxes with such entity in relation to sale in lieu of condemnation. In the event that the partnership is unable to obtain such agreement from such entity concerning payment in lieu of taxes, the Town shall have no obligation to consent to such sale.
  3. In the event of transfer to any other third party, the amounts to be paid the Town under the acquisition agreement shall be immediately due and payable upon transfer, absent permission from the Town for assumption of the obligation by the third party purchaser.
- I. The partnership agrees that it shall co-operate with and/or undertake, as appropriate, all necessary compliance procedures relative to federally imposed requirements concerning the project to the satisfaction of the agency or authority charged with enforcement of such requirements.
  - J. Repayment of acquisition funding shall be made in equal monthly installments on 10 year amortisation, applied first to accrued interest and then to principal reduction, with all unpaid principal and interest accrued to be payable as a balloon payment at the end of the 6 year term. The amount of such monthly payments shall be determined subject to the rate of interest imposed under paragraph "B", supra.
  - K. The terms of the acquisition agreement shall be in accordance with the terms required by H.U.S., and shall cover the same basic provisions normally required in loan agreements relative to economic development loans made in the Town of Cheektowaga by the Cheektowaga Economic Development Corporation, but reflecting the peculiarities of the acquisition of legal title to the premises by the Town. Such provisions shall include but are not limited to insurance requirements, default and acceleration, conditions of assumability, modification, waiver and construction. In addition, such agreement shall reflect and provide for Payment in Lieu of Taxes, in accordance with terms previously negotiated between the parties and embodied in prior resolution of the Town Board. All such provisions shall be subject to approval of the Town Board, Town Attorney and H.U.D.

- L. The acquisition agreement shall be made contingent upon the following:
1. Town ability to obtain the H,U.D. Section 108 Guaranteed Loan in the amount of \$ 2,000,000.00;
  2. Partnership compliance with any conditions imposed by H.U.D. relative to such loan, or the project itself;
  3. Transfer of record title to the site to the Town by E.C.I.D.A.;
  4. The partnership having obtained necessary modifications to the existing E.C.I.D.A. agreements so as to protect the interests of E.C.I.D.A. and allow the partnership's continuing development of the project.
- M. Upon full compliance with the provisions of the agreement, and repayment in full of acquisition funds to the Town by the partnership, the Town shall reconvey the site to the E.C.I.D.A., or, in the event of repayment of outstanding Industrial Revenue Bonds at such time, to the partnership.
- N. The taking of the site, or such portion thereof as will result in destruction of a substantial portion of the existing structures at the site, meaning demolition of all or any portion of the main building at the site, by eminent domain, shall be deemed a condition of acceleration of the repayment due hereunder. However, the Town may, in the event that such taking does not impair the viability of the site as an industrial-commercial development site which is in private ownership, elect, in its absolute discretion, to waive acceleration.
- O. As a condition of the loan, the partnership shall be responsible for the payment of any and all fees and charges imposed by H.U.D. in relation to the Town's Section 108 Guaranteed Loan, or required to satisfy any H.U.D. requirement, and all filing fees, costs, fees taxes and other charges, including attorney's fees in accordance with the rate of fee charged relative to Town economic development loans (0.75% of funding involved, which is the full and total amount of such attorney's fees) incurred by the Town or for services on its behalf in relation to Town involvement in acquisition of the project site.
- P. Assumption of the agreement by any third party purchaser of the partnership's interest in the premises may only be permitted as allowed under H.U.D. regulations, upon compliance by the partnership and the proposed purchaser with any requirements as may be imposed by H.U.D. or other federal agencies having a regulatory interest relating to the proposed purchase and assumption, and by permission of the Town. In the event of an assumption, the partnership shall be responsible for payment of all costs and fees, including attorney's fees, involved in the processing of documentation necessary for such assumption, which responsibility may be assumed by the assuming party.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this      day of 1986, by and between:

THE TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA (Hereinafter called the Town) a municipality located in the County of Erie and State of New York, with offices at the Cheektowaga Town Hall, Cheektowaga, New York; and

BUFFALO AIRPORT CENTER ASSOCIATES (Hereinafter called B.A.C.A.) a New York limited partnership with offices at 690 Delaware Avenue, Buffalo, New York; and

THE ERIE COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY, (Hereinafter called E.C.I.D.A.) a New York Public Benefit Corporation with offices at 424 Main Street, Buffalo, New York.

RECITALS

By various agreements dated August 1, 1985, involving as parties B.A.C.A., E.C.I.D.A., and certain other parties, the E.C.I.D.A. took record title to certain premises located at and commonly known as 4454 Genesee Street, Cheektowaga, New York, more fully described in Schedule "A" annexed hereto, and did enter into an agreement to lease the said premises to the B.A.C.A., for purposes of the industrial development of the premises by the B.A.C.A.

Under the said Lease Agreement, and specifically under Section 4.3 thereof, the B.A.C.A. is obligated to make certain payments in lieu of taxes on account of the said premises to the taxing authorities having assessment and tax levying powers relating to the premises for the duration of such lease, including to the Town.

There is currently pending with the Town an application from the B.A.C.A. seeking the Town's participation in relation to the acquisition and/or rehabilitation and development of the premises in the sum of \$ 2,000,000.00, which participation would be funded through the Town's entitlement to obtain funding under the Section 108 Loan Program of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Pursuant to resolution of the Town Board of the Town, and as a condition precedent to further negotiations concerning the terms of the Town's participation as aforesaid, adopted at a regular meeting of the said Town Board on March      , 1986, it is necessary that the parties enter into this Agreement to provide for certain other provisions concerning payments in lieu of taxes on account of the premises by B.A.C.A. to the Town, and other taxing authorities as set forth in Schedule "B" hereof, as have been negotiated between the Town and B.A.C.A., which other conditions are acceptable to E.C.I.D.A. due to and as a result of the substantial participation of the Town in the development of the premises which is anticipated by the parties, and conditioned upon such substantial participation by the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. During the period in which this Agreement is effective, B.A.C.A. agrees that it shall be responsible for the making of an annual payment in lieu of taxes to the Town of \$ 400,000.00, for and on account of the taxes which would be imposed and collected by the taxing authorities set forth in Schedule "B" hereof except for the public ownership of the premises.
2. Unless this agreement is otherwise sooner terminated, as set forth herein, this agreement shall run from and cover payments in lieu of taxes from the first tax status date covered in the payment in lieu of taxes agreement between B.A.C.A. and E.C.I.D.A (Section 4.3. of the said Lease between such parties) to the end of the 1995 tax year in relation to payments in lieu of taxes collected as general Town taxes and special district taxes other than school taxes, and to the end of the 1995-96 tax year in relation to payments in lieu of school taxes.
3. The aforesaid payment in lieu of taxes is intended to apply only to existing conditions at the premises. In the event of any new construction at the premises, which shall include any new buildings on the premises with the exception of appurtenances to existing structures at the premises in the nature of loading docks and bays, entranceway enclosures, and such other appurtenances constructed to provide access and movement for tenants of existing structures, B.A.C.A. agrees that it shall be responsible during the periods for which this agreement shall remain in effect for making an additional annual payment in lieu of taxes on account of such new construction, which additional payment shall be determined annually by the process of the assessment of such new construction by the Town Assessor in the same manner as privately owned real properties in the Town are assessed, and the application to such assessment of the tax rate applicable annually for such taxes as are set forth in Schedule "B" hereof. Such additional payment in lieu of taxes shall be determined on an annual basis with reference to such assessment level and rate of taxes as are applicable for such annual taxing year during the continuance of this agreement, and in relation to all taxes considered hereunder. Such additional payment in lieu of taxes shall be paid by B.A.C.A to the Town at the same time as the payment set forth in Paragraph 1 is to be due and owing hereunder, as set forth below.
4. The agreed payment in lieu of taxes to the Town shall be due and payable from B.A.C.A to the Town on or before the 15th day of February of every year during which this agreement shall be in effect, and such payment shall include both the base payment required under Paragraph 1, and any additional payment determined under Paragraph 3, above.

5. The parties agree that the provisions of this agreement concerning payments in lieu of taxes shall not be subject to diminution as the result of any adverse changes at the premises while such agreement remains in effect.
6. The B.A.C.A. agrees that it hereby waives any benefit which might accrue to it during the term of this agreement as the result of the outcome of pending proceedings commenced by the Westinghouse Corporation, former owners of the premises, against the Town and its Assessor relative to the level of tax assessment applicable to the premises.
7. In the event that the premises cease to be used in accordance with the provisions of New York State Industrial Development Agency Act, or the existing agreements between the B.A.C.A. and E.C.I.D.A., or in accordance with the provisions of a loan agreement to be entered into between the Town and B.A.C.A. relative to Town participation in the project as aforesaid, the Town may elect to terminate this agreement by the giving of notice of such election to B.A.C.A. at its offices personally or by certified mail, which termination shall become effective 30 days after the giving of such notice.
8. In the event of termination under Paragraph 7 of this agreement, the existing provisions of the Lease between B.A.C.A. and E.C.I.D.A., as applicable, shall come into and remain in force and effect in relation to payments in lieu of taxes.
9. In the event that B.A.C.A. shall fail to pay any payment in lieu of taxes due under this agreement, or any part thereof, when same comes due, the amount or amounts so due shall then be considered as in default, shall continue as an obligation of B.A.C.A. until fully paid, and shall accrue interest at the same rate as if such obligations were delinquent taxes under applicable laws.
10. The B.A.C.A. agrees that it shall be responsible for the payment of all legal costs and fees incurred in relation to the representation of the Town relative to the preparation and entry of this agreement.
11. THIS AGREEMENT IS WHOLLY CONTINGENT UPON THE TOWN'S SUBSTANTIAL PARTICIPATION IN THE DEVELOPMENT PROJECT UNDERTAKEN BY THE REMAINING PARTIES TO THIS AGREEMENT AT THE PREMISES. IN THE EVENT THAT THE TOWN SHOULD FAIL TO ENTER INTO SUCH PARTICIPATION, FOR WHATEVER REASON, THE PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE OF NO EFFECT, AND SUCH AGREEMENT SHALL BE VOID.

WHEREAS, Derrick Manufacturing Corp. and other businesses located on Duke Road have contributed \$35,000 to the Town to effectuate the opening of such roadway as a public highway, and

WHEREAS, the opening of such roadway to the public will solve numerous traffic congestion and safety problems and is in the best interests of the Town and its residents, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and hereby is authorized to execute the attached agreement and contract of sale relating to the above, and BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED that the \$35,000 contributed by Derrick Manufacturing Corp., et al. be placed in trust to be used solely for the purpose of obtaining the aforementioned roadway.

## AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into as of this 16th day of October, 1986 by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the State of New York, having its principal place of business at Broadway and Union Road, Cheektowaga, New York (hereinafter, "THE TOWN"); SORRENTO INC., a domestic corporation organized under the laws of the State of New York, having its principal place of business at 2375 South Park Avenue, Buffalo, New York (hereinafter, "SORRENTO"); and BUFFALO FORGE COMPANY, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Delaware and authorized to do business in the State of New York, having a place of business at 490 Broadway, Buffalo, New York (hereinafter, "BUFFALO FORGE").

### W I T N E S S E T H :

WHEREAS, THE TOWN is desirous of having a public highway between Duke Road and Walden Avenue at the East boundary lines of properties owned by SORRENTO and BUFFALO FORGE, and

WHEREAS, SORRENTO is desirous of acquiring title to certain land to the South of its existing property on Walden

Avenue from BUFFALO FORGE for expansion purposes; and

WHEREAS, BUFFALO FORGE is desirous of having THE TOWN abandon or convey a portion of Duke Road which crosses its property,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. BUFFALO FORGE and SORRENTO have, simultaneously with the execution of this Agreement, entered into a contract for SORRENTO to purchase from BUFFALO FORGE approximately 6-1/2 acres of land for an agreed price.

2. SORRENTO and THE TOWN have, simultaneously with the execution of this Agreement, entered into a contract for THE TOWN to purchase a fifty (50) foot strip of land from SORRENTO which strip is along the east line of parcels presently owned by SORRENTO and BUFFALO FORGE, respectively, as well as certain land owned by SORRENTO north of Walden Avenue containing a turn around along with a traffic signal device, after SORRENTO completes its purchase from BUFFALO FORGE pursuant to paragraph one (1) of this Agreement, for an agreed price.

3. THE TOWN will abandon or convey a portion of the

existing Duke Road right of way to BUFFALO FORGE; which portion can generally be described as the portion of Duke Road beginning Fifty (50) Feet west of the east bound property line of BUFFALO FORGE and extending to the New York State Thruway.

4. This Agreement is contingent upon the conveyances described in paragraph one (1) and paragraph two (2) of this Agreement. It is also contingent upon THE TOWN abandoning, or conveying the property as described in paragraph three (3) of this Agreement.

5. BUFFALO FORGE will grant easements for existing gas and water lines within the above described Duke Road right of way to National Fuel Gas and the Erie County Water Authority or will take title subject to such easements presently on record.

6. THE TOWN agrees to fully cooperate with SORRENTO and BUFFALO FORGE in the application by either or both for any variances before the Town of Cheektowaga Zoning Board and will further assist SORRENTO and BUFFALO FORGE in any way possible.

7. BUFFALO FORGE and SORRENTO agree that subsequent to the closing of the subject transactions each will cooperate with the other in any application for a reasonable variance and will not oppose any variance sought by the other party as it relates to the land which is the subject of this Agreement provided said variance is reasonable. Specifically, each agrees to give such



permission as may be necessary for the other to obtain a variance as to the normal building set-back requirements along this resulting common boundary line.

8. This writing and the Contracts referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, contain the entire Agreement between THE TOWN, SORRENTO and BUFFALO FORGE as to the subject matter and nothing is binding on any of them which is not contained in this Agreement or the referenced Contracts. This Agreement is intended to bind THE TOWN, SORRENTO and BUFFALO FORGE and those who succeed to their interest.

event that this stipulation is not so implemented, such discontinuances shall be null and void and the petitioner may try the proceedings for the 1984/85 and 1985/86 tax years.

2. 1986/87 Assessment and Apportionment

a. The 1986/87 assessment shall be reduced from \$10,732,000 to \$4,444,000.

b. Provided that petitioner timely and properly submits surveys and metes and bounds descriptions, and/or deeds as may be required by the Erie County Tax Department, the 1986/87 assessments, and those for subsequent tax years, shall be apportioned into four separate tax lots as follows:

3. Covenant Not to Sue for Future Tax Reductions

a. Petitioner shall not file a complaint pursuant to RPRL Article 5, or commence a special proceeding pursuant to RPTL Article 7 to review the 1987/88 to 1990/91 real property tax assessments of the property which is the subject of this stipulation, provided that the assessment of such property is not increased from that provided in this stipulation. If a portion of the property is demolished or destroyed by fire or other casualty loss, the Assessor shall reduce the assessment in accordance with statutory provisions; if no such reduction is made, petitioner may commence an RPTL Article 7 action for such relief.

b. Notwithstanding anything provided herein to the contrary, the assessment may be increased

(i) to reflect the construction of any additions alterations or improvements

(ii) in the event that occupancy levels of the main mall are increased, the Assessor may increase the assessment or the portion of the assessment allocated to the main mall as provided in paragraph 2(b) as follows:

In computing occupancy levels, temporary (one year or less) or below market rentals will not be considered occupied. On or before February 15th of 1987 to 1990, petitioner shall furnish the Assessor with the rent roll as of the preceding January, which period shall be used for calculating occupancy levels.

c. In the event that survey, metes and bounds descriptions and deeds cannot or are not timely submitted, and there is no formal apportionment, the parties agree that:

(i) this reduction in assessment is solely because of the vacancies in the main mall;  
and

- (ii) the assessed value of the entire tax lot (Sec. 113.12, Block 2, Lot 28) is allocated as set forth in paragraph 2(b), supra
- (iii) If requested, the Assessor will furnish petitioner with a letter to such effect.

4. Refund for 1986/87 Tax Year

a. The officer or officers having custody of the assessment roll or the tax roll upon which the above-mentioned assessments and any taxes levied thereon have been entered shall forthwith correct said entries in conformity to this stipulation and shall note upon the official records that the same have been corrected by the authority of this stipulation.

b. 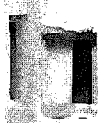



THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into as of the 1st day of September, 1986 by and between the COUNTY OF ERIE, a municipal corporation organized under the Laws of the State of New York, maintaining its offices at 95 Franklin Street, Buffalo, New York, hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY, and the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, maintaining its offices at Broadway and Union Road, Cheektowaga, New York 14227, a municipal corporation of the State of New York in Erie County, hereinafter referred to as MUNICIPALITY.

COUNTY OF ERIE — DEPARTMENT OF LAW

W I T N E S S E T H :

FIRST: The Municipality hereby agrees to remove snow, to sand, and to control ice and snow on certain county roads, hereinafter defined; and, in implementing such removal and control, to erect and remove its own snow fences where it deems desirable, all at an annual rate per lane mile as established by the Erie County Legislature in the annual budget.

SECOND: The County agrees to pay the Municipality on an annual basis as determined by the County, Department of Public Works-Highways, at the rate per lane mile as established by the Erie County Legislature for the number of miles as detailed on the applicable year's Exhibits A and B. In no event shall payment be made to any Municipality until current certificates of insurance

meeting municipal requirements in accordance with the attached Exhibit IC, Category G are submitted and approved by the Erie County Director of Insurance, except that the Municipality shall not be required to provide excess umbrella liability insurance.

THIRD: A "Lane Mile" is defined as a portion of any county road identified on Exhibits A and B, attached hereto and hereby made a part hereof, which is one mile long and of sufficient width to allow the safe passage of a vehicle. Shoulders, median strips and short widened sections designed for intersection turning lanes shall not be considered in the calculation of the number of Lane Miles to be maintained under this Agreement. All county roads shall be considered to be at least two lanes wide for such purposes. The number of Lane Miles for which compensation shall be paid hereunder is as set forth on Exhibit A.

FOURTH: The schedule and map of county roads which are affected by this Agreement are attached hereto and marked Exhibit A and Exhibit B respectively. Exhibits A and B, and the annual rate per lane mile, are subject to modification for each year under the contract. Any modification made shall apply to the current winter season and be for the period of one year from the previous September 1 through the following August 31. It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that notice of any modification or change shall be mailed by the Department of Public Works-Highways to the Municipality and shall be deemed to be accepted by the

Municipality and made a part hereof, except that in the event that the Municipality does not agree with the modification, the Municipality may by its chief elected officer submit a letter of dispute to the Department of Public Works-Highways within ten (10) days after receipt of the notice. The Municipality and the Department of Public Works-Highways shall try to resolve the matter. The Department of Public Works-Highways after attempts to resolve the matter may unilaterally impose the modification and the

Municipality shall comply. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. Solely in the event of a price modification, the Municipality may terminate this Agreement upon twenty (20) days written notice to the County.

FIFTH: The Municipality hereby agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County of Erie from all claims, demands, suits and judgments for bodily injury or property damage arising out of the performance of the Municipality's obligations under this Agreement. The Municipality further agrees to maintain insurance coverage during the term of this Agreement and submit certificates of insurance meeting municipal requirements in accordance with paragraph SECOND hereinabove. In lieu thereof, the Municipality may furnish satisfactory evidence of self-insurance plan acceptable to the Erie County Director of Insurance and the Erie County Attorney.

SIXTH: The County hereby agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Municipality from all claims, demands, suits and judgments arising out of the performance of the County's obligations under the agreement.

SEVENTH: The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years beginning on the 1st day of September, 1986 through August 31, 1989 to include yearly winter seasons. This Agreement shall be reviewed annually in accordance with paragraph three, and any modifications shall be effective during such year. This Agreement may be extended at the request of the County with the approval of the Municipality.

EIGHTH: It is understood by the parties that this Agreement shall be executory only to the extent of the monies available to the County of Erie and appropriated therefor, and no liability on account thereof shall be incurred by the County beyond the monies available and appropriated for these purposes.

NINTH: This Agreement shall bind the successors, assigns and representatives of the parties hereto.

TENTH: This Agreement shall not be assigned without the written permission of the County.

ELEVENTH: This Agreement is made pursuant to resolution of the Erie County Legislature adopted November 20 , 1986, being Committee Reference 20D-27 of the 1986 Legislative Proceedings, and pursuant



to a resolution of the Legislative Board of the undersigned

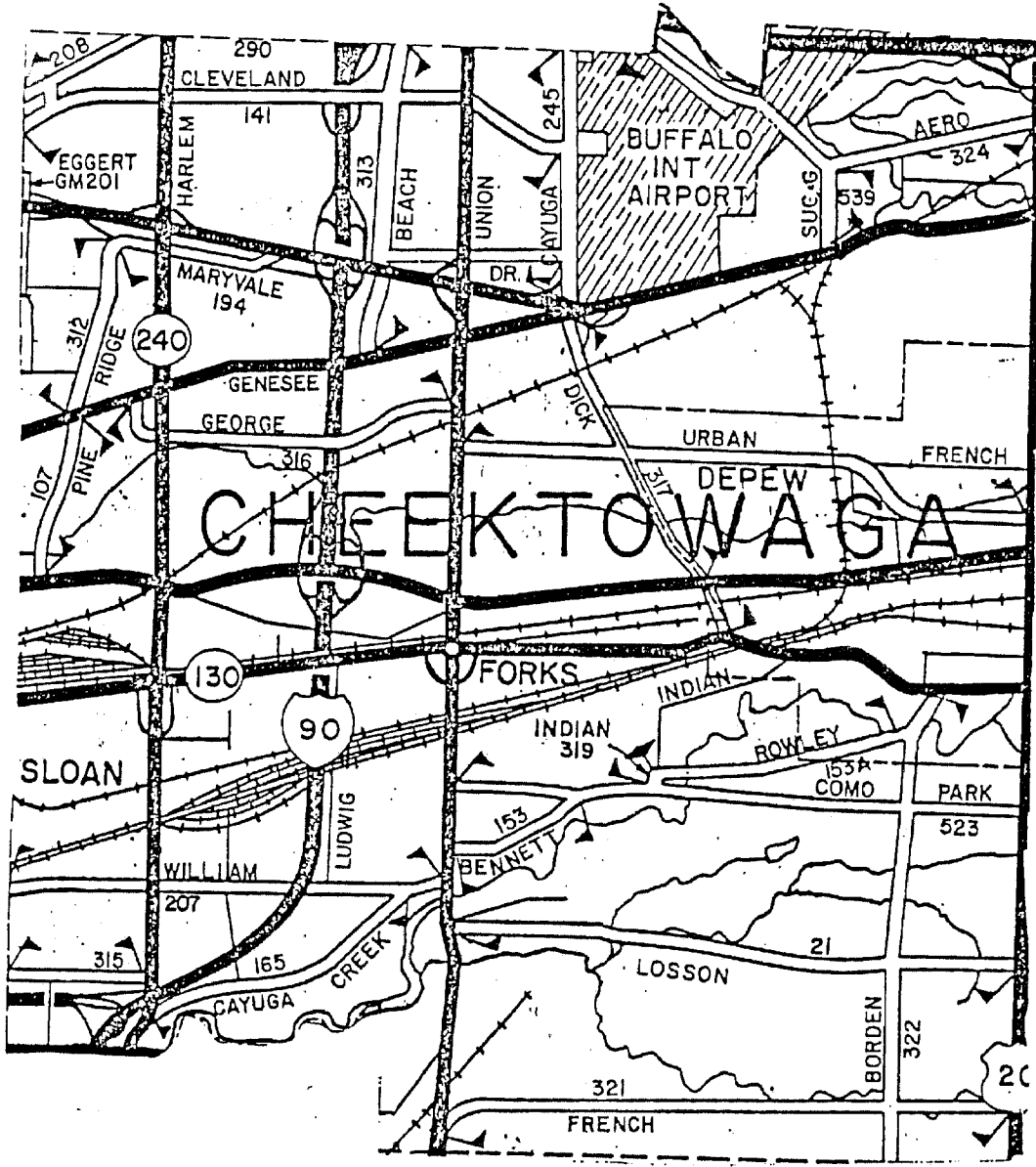
