## SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Benderson Development Co., Inc., Nathan Benderson, Delta Sonic Car Wash Systems, Inc., and other persons and entities affiliated with Nathan Benderson (all collectively hereinafter referred to as "Petitioners") have instituted proceedings under Article 7 of the Real Property Tax Law by which Petitioners seek to obtain judicial review and reduction of the assessments of certain real properties located in the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York on the tax assessment rolls for various tax years, and

WHEREAS, Petitioners have filed Complaints on Real Property Assessment for some of the same properties and others for the tax year 1987-88, and

WHEREAS, Petitioners and the Board of Assessment Review for the Town of Cheektowaga, the Assessor of the Town of Cheektowaga, and the Town of Cheektowaga, New York (all collectively hereinafter referred to as "Respondents") have had extensive settlement negotiations, and after due consideration of all material facts, Petitioners and Respondents have agreed to resolve their differences without further litigation and terminate said proceedings.

It is now stipulated and agreed:

1. There will be no adjustment in the assessments for the following properties: Nagel Drive land near 2400 Walden Avenue (SBL 102.02-3-10./F); land on Broadway (SBL 102.04-3-2); 2843 Broadway (SBL 102.04-3-3.1); land on Benbro Drive (SBL 103.10-7-15.2); 760 Dick Road

2. With respect to 600 Dick Road (SBL 103.05-3-2) and 620 Dick Road (SBL 103.05-3-1), the total assessment for the two properties shall be adjusted to \$1,273,000 for the 1986-87 tax year and to \$1,000,000 for the 1987-88 tax year. Petitioners shall be entitled to a refund based upon the adjustment in said assessment for any taxes paid respecting the tax years 1986-87 and 1987-88.

3. With respect to 3825-3875 Union Road (SBL 102.08-3-1), the assessment on the tax assessment roll for the tax years 1986-87 and 1987-88 shall be reduced from \$3,987,100 to \$2,987,100, inclusive of the new construction at the property. There will be no change in the assessment of the property for any other tax years. Petitioners shall

be entitled to a refund based upon the adjustment in said assessment for any taxes paid respecting the tax years 1986-87 and 1987-88.

4. With respect to 3637 Union Road (SBL 102.02-2-6), the tax assessment for 1984-85 and for 1985-86 will be reduced from \$212,000 to \$192,000 and the tax assessment for the years 1986-87 and 1987-88 will be reduced from \$5,039,700 to \$3,500,000. Petitioners shall be entitled to a refund based upon the adjustment in said assessment for any taxes paid respecting the tax years 1984-85 through 1987-88, inclusive.

5. With respect to 2495-2515 Walden Avenue (SBL 103.13-2-21), the assessment for the tax years 1986-87 and 1987-88 will be reduced from \$1,499,200 to \$1,200,000. There will be no adjustment in the assessment for any other tax years. Petitioners shall be entitled to a refund based upon the adjustment in said assessment for any taxes paid respecting the tax years 1986-87 and 1987-88.

6. With respect to 2510 Walden Avenue (SBL 103.13-2-6.1), the tax assessment for the tax years 1984-85 and 1985-86 will be reduced from \$332,600 to \$307,600. The tax assessment for the tax year 1986-87 will be reduced from \$4,469,200 to \$3,750,000 and for the tax year 1987-88, the assessment will be further reduced to \$3,500,000, inclusive of the new construction at the property. Petitioners shall be entitled to a tax refund based upon the adjustment in the assessment for any taxes paid respecting the tax years 1984-85 through 1987-88, inclusive.

7. With respect to the following properties, there shall be a reduction in the present assessment as indicated below for the tax year 1987-88. There shall be no adjustment in the assessment for any other tax years. The properties and the reduction in assessments for each are as follows:

Petitioners shall be entitled to a refund for any taxes paid respecting the 1984-85 and 1985-86 tax years.

9. With respect to 2285 Walden Avenue (SBL 102.16-2-8.1) the assessment for the 1987-88 tax year will be reduced from \$471,200 to \$415,000. Petitioners shall be entitled to a tax refund for the tax year 1987-88 for taxes paid, if any, with respect to the 1987-88 tax year.

10. With respect to 4207 Union Road (SBL 91.16-2-63), there will be no change in the present assessment of \$155,000.

11. All refunds to be paid pursuant to this settlement agreement shall be paid as soon as possible and shall bear interest at the statutory rate, except that any refunds to be paid by any school district need not be paid any earlier than July 1, 1988, by which date they must be paid, together with interest thereon to be computed at the

statutory rate through June 30, 1987 and at 7% per annum from July 1, 1987 through June 30, 1988.

12. The parties acknowledge that each of the assessments, as adjusted, for each of the properties specified is fair, equitable and proper for purposes of this settlement.

13. The attorneys for the parties shall enter into stipulations discontinuing any and all proceedings respecting the properties hereinbefore specified, including those for which the assessments remain unchanged pursuant to this agreement.

14. Petitioners, on their behalf and on behalf of their distributees, successors and assigns, hereby covenant and agree that they will not protest any assessment nor commence any proceeding to review any assessment in regard to the properties specified herein with respect to the assessments completed for the taxable status dates of June 1, 1987, June 1, 1988, June 1, 1989, June 1, 1990 and June 1, 1991, so long as the assessments for each of the properties for each of the tax years mentioned in this paragraph remain at the assessment specified in this agreement for the tax year of 1987-88, for that property, except in the case of any of the properties specified in paragraph 1 hereof which has experienced a 25% or more vacancy rate as measured by square footage for six months or more in any tax year, as to which such property Petitioners may protest the assessment for that particular property.

Petitioners further covenant and agree that notwithstanding anything provided herein to the contrary, if any

assessable additions, alterations or improvements are made after the date of this agreement, or if any portion of the improvements on the subject premises shall be destroyed, demolished, removed or impaired, this covenant shall not be binding and the assessment may be adjusted accordingly.

Petitioners further covenant and agree that in any instrument or agreement transferring any part or all of the subject properties or any interest therein, they shall covenant with any grantee, transferee and mortgagee and their respective distributees, successors and assigns that they shall be bound by the terms of this covenant, and that such covenant shall be deemed to run with the land for the tax periods embraced by the terms thereof.

15. Petitioners shall have the right to seek specific enforcement of the terms of this settlement agreement, and of any order entered thereupon, and to otherwise enforce such terms by whatever means provided by law.

16. It is understood and agreed by all parties that this agreement is made only for the purpose of resolving pending litigation in order to avoid the expenses incident to such litigation and for such other reasons as the parties deem material. In no event shall this agreement, or the contents thereof, be offered or admitted in any of these proceedings if prosecution thereof is carried forward or in any other proceeding by the parties or third parties as competent evidence of any fact.

17. This agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement among the parties. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to bind either party beyond the tax assessment rolls established for the 1991-92 tax year.

18. The parties authorize their attorneys to seek an order of the Supreme Court approving the terms of this Settlement Agreement, and this Settlement Agreement is conditioned upon such approval.

PROGRAMMATIC AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Town of Cheektowaga ( Town ) proposes to administer its Grant Program funded by a Community Development Block Grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, and

WHEREAS, the Town has determined that the program may have an effect upon properties included in or eligible for the National Register of Historic Places and has consulted with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (Council) and the New York State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) pursuant to Section 800.13 of the regulations (36 CFR Part 800) implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C.470f)

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town, the Council, and the New York SHPO agree that the program shall be administered in accordance with the following stipulations to satisfy the Town's Section 106 responsibilities for all individual undertakings of the program.

STIPULATIONS

The Town will ensure that the following measures are carried out.

I. Identification of National Register Listed or Eligible Properties.

- A. The Town will determine the impact area of any of the activities noted in the CDBG application to HUD and whether the activity may cause changes in the character or use of properties:
1. listed on the National Register of Historic Places, or
  2. previously determined as eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places, or
  3. identified as meeting the National Register criteria by the SHPO as a result of reconnaissance survey and subsequently identified as eligible as a result of Stipulation IB, or
  4. which are fifty years of age or older and identified by the SHPO as eligible as a result of Stipulation IB.

B. Eligibility Assessment for properties which fall under Stipulation I(A) (3) or A(4).

1. The Town                will submit to the New York SHPO for a determination of eligibility:
  - a. a completed building/structure inventory form;
  - b. a map locating the property within the                ;
  - c. original photographs of the property to be affected by the project. If the property is a structure, original photographs of all sides of the structure and any related outbuildings as well;
  - d. streetscape photographs taken of properties in all directions and across from the property to be affected.
2. The New York SHPO will review the Town's                submission and provide the Town                with a determination of eligibility in accordance with 36 CFR 800.4(c); or based upon a review of information provided, request additional information in order to make such a determination.
3. If there is not agreement concerning the eligibility of a property the Town                will submit the matter to the Secretary of the Interior for a determination of eligibility pursuant to applicable National Park Service regulations.

II. Responsibilities of the

- A. If the impact area of the proposed activity does not include properties which fall under one of the categories in Stipulation I (A) (1) or (2) or is identified as not eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places as a result of the assessment described in Stipulation IB, no further consultation is required.
- B. For all proposed activities listed in Stipulation III (B) (2), no further consultation with the SHPO is required, with the exception of the provision for monitoring, Stipulation III (B) (1).
- C. For all proposed activities not listed in Stipulation III (B) (2) below, the Town                agrees to follow the procedure outlined in Stipulation III (A) (1) and (2) or IV (A), as appropriate for all properties addressed in Stipulation I (A).
- D. For all ground disturbing activities not listed in Stipulation III (B) (2) (a) and which occur in previously undisturbed areas,                agrees to follow the procedure outlined in Stipulation V (A).

III. Review Procedure for Rehabilitation Activities.

- A. Properties Rehabilitated in Accordance with "The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation and Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings" (Standards).
1. The Town will apply the Standards in consultation with the New York SHPO on a case-by-case basis.
  2. To begin consultation with the SHPO, prior to initiating each rehabilitation project the Town will provide documentation for SHPO review which includes the following:
    - a. Original photographs, not photocopies, of the project site that completely describe existing conditions. In the case of buildings, all exterior elevations and interior spaces should be photographed. All photographs should be clearly labeled as to location of view, and keyed to existing condition floor/site plans.
    - b. Photographs (labeled) of all architectural details, keyed to existing condition floor/site plans.
    - c. Architect's floor plans or sketches of both existing and proposed conditions.
    - d. Specifications for proposed work to fully describe methods and materials proposed for repair or replacement.
    - e. Elevation drawings where exterior changes or additions are proposed. Drawings must fully describe existing and proposed conditions, materials, and finishes.
    - f. A "Survey of Architectural Conditions" to fully describe both existing and proposed conditions, where floor plan changes or removals are to occur, as outlined in Attachment 1.
  3. The SHPO will respond in accordance with Stipulation VI.
- B. Undertakings in Accordance with the Standards which require no SHPO consultation.
1. Monitoring  
Documentation including before and after photographs and work specifications of each undertaking which involves only the work items noted below will be retained and made available to the SHPO upon request.

2. Work Items

a. Site Work

1. Resurfacing of roads where no change in width, surface, vertical alignment or drainage is to occur.
2. Repairs to or replacement of existing underground utility lines.
3. Repair/replacement of existing concrete sidewalks in kind.
4. Repair or replacement of septic systems where significant site features such as older trees are not impacted.

b. Exterior

1. In kind roof repairs and replacement of asphalt shingled roofs.
2. In kind repair/replacement of gutters and downspouts using colors complementing building facades.
3. Window and door repair using in kind materials and matching original details exactly, including replacement of isolated wooden members, glazing and hardware, and replacement or addition of window screens. Replacement of entire sash or frame is specifically excluded.
4. In kind replacement of missing or broken glass.
5. Minor wood repairs of clapboard, structural elements, and isolated trim sections provided new material matches original exactly in material and detail.
6. Minor porch repair using in kind materials including jacking of porch and replacement in kind of deteriorated framing members and flooring.
7. In kind minor repairs of wheelchair ramps.
8. Pouring or repair of concrete cellar floors.

9. Repair in kind of concrete block foundations, minor repairs to parged foundations to match existing, and repointing in kind of all foundations where new mortar matches original in color, texture, hardness, joint width and profile the use of silicone sealers or other non-breathable coatings is specifically excluded. (n.b.: new parging on non-concrete block foundations must be reviewed by the SHPO).
10. Exterior painting with traditional, removable oil base or latex paint of previously painted surfaces provided that: appropriate surface preparation is undertaken, including washing, scraping, and sanding, and priming of all exposed areas with oil base primer; complementary colors are used; and painting is undertaken only when temperature is at least 50 degrees F.

c. Interior

1. Minor structural repairs including in kind repair/replacement of deteriorated floors, or floor and ceiling framing members.
2. Minor patching of flat, non-decorated interior ceilings and walls in kind. Replacement of flat, non-decorated interior walls and ceilings with sheetrock when existing conditions are irreparable, providing the new surface lies in the same plane as the original.
3. Interior painting/staining with paints matching original paint/stain finish and texture.
4. In kind repair, replacement, or upgrading of heating, plumbing and electrical systems excluding the installation of additional ducts outside of basement, attic, or other concealed spaces).
5. Installation of adequate lighting where required in kitchens, bathrooms, or public areas where installation will not damage or obscure architectural details.
6. Installation/repair/replacement of smoke alarms.
7. Repair/replacement of locksets.

d. Energy Conservation

1. Storm Windows:

- a) Exterior: New wood or aluminum exterior storm windows provided they completely fill the window opening; mullions and meeting rails match those of prime window; and color matches that of prime sash and trim. Aluminum may be used provided that: the above conditions are met; the finish is baked enamel, and units are flush mounted and do not protrude beyond face of window trim. Filler panels on aluminum or wood storm windows are not acceptable.
- b) Interior: Interior storms where: units are installed within existing opening; match interior trim color; are reversible and do not cause damage to existing trim; and have structural elements that align with those of prime window. Windows should be installed to completely fill existing opening and with a seal so as to protect prime window from condensation.

- 2. Double-glazing of existing sash: replacement of original, non-significant glazing by modifying existing sash to receive double glazing, providing original sash can withstand additional weight.
- 3. Caulking and weatherstripping.
- 4. Attic and basement ceiling insulation when a vapor barrier of two coats of vapor barrier paint are applied to the warm side of ceiling or cavity, and adequate ventilation is provided on the cold side.
- 5. Wrapping of heating pipes and ducts in basement.

IV. Review Procedure for Activities Other Than Rehabilitation.

If the proposed treatment of the property is not rehabilitation, if demolition is contemplated, or if the contemplated action could have an indirect effect on listed or eligible properties identified in Stipulation 1, prior to taking any action the Town will consult with the New York SHPO.

- A. To begin consultation with the SHPO, prior to initiating each activity, the Town will provide documentation for SHPO review which includes the following:

- 1. A description of the undertaking;

2. Original photographs, not photocopies, of the project site that completely describe existing conditions. In the case of buildings, all exterior elevations and interior spaces should be photographed. All photographs should be clearly labeled as to location of view, and keyed to existing condition floor/site plans;
3. Streetscape photographs taken of properties in both directions of the property to be affected;
4. A map locating the property/site to be affected;
5. Site plans/elevation drawings if new construction is proposed;
6. Specifications for proposed work to fully describe methods and materials proposed for repair or replacement;

B. The SHPO will respond in accordance with Stipulation VI.

V. Review Procedure for Archeology.

For all ground disturbing activities not listed in Stipulation III (B) (2) (a) and which occur in previously undisturbed areas, the agrees to notify the SHPO and request his opinion on the potential existence of archeological resources.

- A. To begin consultation with the SHPO, prior to initiating each ground disturbing activity, the Town will provide documentation for SHPO review which includes the following:
  1. A map locating the proposed activity.
  2. Photographs of the site and its surroundings keyed to the map.
  3. Information on any ground disturbance in the project area not listed in Stipulation III (B) (2) (a) should include:
    - (a) nature and date of disturbance.
    - (b) map indicating depth and location of disturbance.

B. The SHPO will respond in accordance with Stipulation VI.

VI. Responsibilities of the SHPO.

The New York SHPO will review the documentation and may:

- A. Request additional information and/or provide recommendations.
- B. Provide a project effect finding which may:

1. complete the consultation process,
2. require continued consultation with the SHPO,
3. require consultation with the Council,
4. establish conditions for project approval, one of which will require that the SHPO be informed in writing that these conditions will be incorporated into the project and that the SHPO be provided with revised documents incorporating these conditions.

VII. Renewal of Agreement.

This Programmatic Agreement will continue in force for one year. This Agreement will be reviewed annually for possible modifications, termination, or extension. At the request of any of the parties, this Agreement may be reviewed for possible modification or termination at any time.

Execution of this Programmatic Agreement and carrying out its terms evidences that the Town has satisfied its Section 106 responsibilities for all individual undertakings of the program.

Bids were reviewed by Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc., Consulting Engineers. It is recommended by Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc. and the Town Engineer that the award be granted to M. Falgiano Construction Company, Inc. for submission of the lowest price of \$214,857.30 meeting the requirements of the specifications.

It should be noted that in an effort to secure bids in line with available funds, bids were requested for both reinforced concrete and corrugated steel pipe storm sewers. Considering the bids that were received, we recommend that this project be awarded using reinforced concrete pipe storm sewers. The reinforced concrete pipe would provide us with 55% additional storm water capacity over the same size corrugated metal pipe.

WHEREAS, the Pyramid Company of Buffalo (the "Applicant") has proposed the construction of a regional shopping center in the Town of Cheektowaga known as the Walden Galleria (the "Project"), and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), an Environmental Assessment Form was submitted to the Town for the Project in January of 1987, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Cheektowaga was designated to serve as lead agency for the environmental review of the Project under SEQRA, and

WHEREAS, based upon the informal review of the government agencies and their various comments, a Draft Environmental Impact Statement with respect to the Project ("DEIS") was submitted to the Town Board, on June 8, 1987, and

WHEREAS, the Town Environmental Quality Review Advisory Committee (the "Advisory Committee"), at the request of the Town Board, independently reviewed the DEIS and on June 15, 1987 recommended that the DEIS be determined complete as to scope, content and adequacy by the Town Board in its capacity as lead agency, and

WHEREAS, at its regular meeting of June 15, 1987, the Town Board considered the DEIS and the recommendation of the Town Advisory Committee, however, in order to provide its members with additional time in which to review and consider the DEIS, the Town Board voted to postpone any action upon the DEIS until a Special Meeting scheduled for June 22, 1987, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board at its Special Meeting on June 22, 1987 determined the DEIS to be complete as to scope, content and adequacy and caused the DEIS to be filed and circulated along with a Notice of Completion of DEIS to other involved agencies and the public as required by the SEQRA regulations (6NYCRR Part 617), and

WHEREAS, the Town Board duly scheduled and published notice of a public hearing to solicit comments on the DEIS from all interested persons, which hearing was held on July 15, 1987, at which time all members of the public wishing to make statements concerning the DEIS were heard, and

WHEREAS, the public comment period on the DEIS closed on July 27, 1987 in accordance with the Town Board's previously filed and published Notice of Completion of DEIS, and

WHEREAS, the applicant, on August 31, 1987, submitted to the Town Board and other involved agencies a proposed Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") which consisted not only of the DEIS, revisions to the DEIS, an Appendix and summary of public comments on the DEIS but also comments from involved agencies and responses to the substantive comments received, together with the additional information initially requested to be included in a supplemental EIS as well as data prepared in response to the public comments received, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant after meeting with the Town Advisory Committee prepared an Addenda to the FEIS which consisted of revisions to the proposed FEIS based on the comments of involved agencies and additional indices of comments on the DEIS, and

WHEREAS, the Town Advisory Committee carefully considered the entire FEIS submitted by the Applicant and met with representatives of the Applicant on numerous occasions including September 3 and 10 to review the FEIS, Appendix and Addenda and members of the Advisory Committee discussed the FEIS with representative of other involved or concerned governmental agencies and the public and, on September 14, 1987, recommended to the Town Board that the FEIS contained an adequate discussion of all significant impacts associated with the Walden Galleria project and that the FEIS should be determined complete, and

WHEREAS, members of the Town Board not only reviewed the public comments received on the DEIS which are summarized and responded to in the FEIS but also reviewed the FEIS And public comments received by the Town Board on the issue of the completeness of the FEIS as well as the recommendations of the Town Advisory Committee, and discussed issuance of the FEIS at its Special Meeting of September 17, 1987, and regular meeting of September 21, 1987, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board at its regular meeting of September 21, 1987, determined that the FEIS, its Appendix and Addenda were complete and voted in favor of issuing a Notice of Completion of FEIS, and

WHEREAS, the FEIS and Notices of Completion were filed and circulated as required by the SEQRA Regulations, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board, in its September 21, 1987 resolution also directed that the FEIS be made available to the public for consideration and comment for a period of 30 days, and caused copies of the FEIS, Appendix and Addenda to be placed in four public libraries in the Town of Cheektowaga, as well as in the Town Clerk's Office and Town Building Inspector's Office in order to facilitate greater public consideration and review of the FEIS, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board in the exercise of its sound discretion directed that copies of the FEIS and related documentation be made available to the public at more locations than required by law; permitted public consideration and review of the FEIS for a significantly longer period than required by law; and invited full public participation in all of the various SEQRA proceedings, including opportunities to meet with the Town Advisory Committee, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has received additional comments during this 30-day period of public consideration of the FEIS, which comments have been carefully reviewed by the Town Board, and

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into as of the 1st day of January, 1987, by and between the COUNTY OF ERIE, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, with offices at 95 Franklin Street, Buffalo, New York, hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY, party of the first part, and the TOWN/VILLAGE OF CHEEKTOWAGA, a municipal corporation of the State of New York in Erie County, with offices at Broadway & Union Rds.

Cheektowaga, New York, hereinafter referred to as the MUNICIPALITY, party of the second part,

W I T N E S S E T H :

WHEREAS, the COUNTY, pursuant to the authority granted to it by Article 43-A of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, has established a special traffic options program for driving while intoxicated (STOP - DWI) and has formulated a plan thereunder for the coordination of county, town, city and village efforts to reduce alcohol-related traffic injuries and fatalities, and

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY, through its police agency, has made formal application to the Erie County STOP-DWI Coordinator for the funding of certain alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities in Erie County during the period from January 1, 1987 to December 31, 1987,

which application is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Appendix "A", and

WHEREAS, a Justice Court has been established in and for the MUNICIPALITY with jurisdiction to hear and determine cases involving alleged violations of §1192, §511(2)(a)(i) and (iii) and §511(3) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES:

FIRST: The term of this Agreement shall be the COUNTY's fiscal year commencing January 1, 1987 and ending December 31, 1987. The said term shall be divided into the following quarterly periods:

January 1 to March 31;  
April 1 to June 30;  
July 1 to September 30; and  
October 1 to December 31.

SECOND: During the term of this Agreement, the MUNICIPALITY, as an independent contractor, agrees to engage in the alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities set forth in the annexed Appendix "A".

THIRD:

A. For purposes of this paragraph:

- (i) "DWI case" shall mean a criminal action commenced in any court within Erie County wherein a person is charged with

a violation of §1192, §511(2)(a)(i) and (iii) or §511(3) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law;

- (ii) "net STOP-DWI collections" shall mean the amount of fines, penalties and forfeitures collected by any court, judge, magistrate or other judicial officer within Erie County from violations of §1192, §511(2)(a)(i) and (iii) or §511(3) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law after deducting therefrom the amount of refunds made by reason of judicial mandate (e.g., appellate reversal of conviction, reduction of fine, etc.) or pursuant to former Section 521(c) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law (e.g., upon successful completion of an alcohol and drug rehabilitation program).

B. Within thirty (30) days after the close of each of the quarterly periods of this Agreement, the COUNTY agrees to pay the MUNICIPALITY a sum not to exceed the lesser of either:

- (i) the MUNICIPALITY's actual expenses, as

certified by the MUNICIPALITY upon forms acceptable to the COUNTY, in carrying out, during such quarterly period, the alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities set forth in Appendix "A"; or

(ii) sixty-five percent (65%) of the net STOP-DWI collections actually paid over and received by the COUNTY during such quarterly period, provided that such collections have resulted from convictions obtained in DWI cases commenced by the MUNICIPALITY's police agency.

C. Where in any quarterly period, the MUNICIPALITY's actual expenses, as certified in (i) above, exceed sixty-five percent (65%) of the amount of net STOP-DWI collections attributable to the MUNICIPALITY's alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities, as calculated pursuant to (ii) above, such excess amount shall be added to the MUNICIPALITY's certified actual expenses in the next succeeding quarterly period for purposes of determining the sum payable to the MUNICIPALITY under this paragraph.

D. Where, in any quarterly period, sixty-five percent (65%) of the amount of net STOP-DWI collections attributable to the MUNICIPALITY's alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities, as calculated pursuant to (ii)

above, is a negative amount due to refunds made by or on behalf of the COUNTY, such negative amount shall be carried forward into the next succeeding quarterly period for purposes of determining the amount payable to the MUNICIPALITY under this paragraph.

E. The MUNICIPALITY agrees to allocate to any Justice Court located within Erie County, from the amounts payable to the MUNICIPALITY under this paragraph, the sum of TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) for each "DWI case" which is "finally disposed of", as such terms are defined in paragraph FOURTH hereof, in such Justice Court.

FOURTH:

A. For purposes of this paragraph:

- (i) "DWI case" shall mean a criminal action commenced in any court within Erie County wherein a person is charged with a violation, or multiple violations involving the same person and arising out of the same incident, of §1192, §511(2)(a)(i) and (iii) or §511(3) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law;
- (ii) "finally disposed of" and "final disposition" shall mean the termination of a DWI case at the trial court level by reason of a dismissal, acquittal or

conviction and imposition of sentence by the trial court, but shall not include the removal or transfer of a DWI case to another court.

B. Within thirty (30) days after the close of each of the quarterly periods of this Agreement, the COUNTY agrees to pay the MUNICIPALITY, for the services of the MUNICIPALITY's Justice court, the sum of TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) for each DWI case finally disposed of in such court during such quarterly period which was commenced by either the Erie County Sheriff's Department or the New York State Police. The said sum shall be payable by the COUNTY for each such DWI case regardless of the final disposition thereof.

FIFTH:

A. The MUNICIPALITY, through its police agency, agrees to compile information and render monthly reports to the Erie County Office of Criminal Justice Planning with respect to:

- (i) the MUNICIPALITY's actual expenses in carrying out the alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities set forth in Appendix "A". A sample copy of the STOP-DWI Monthly Fiscal Cost Report form is annexed hereto as Appendix "B";

- (ii) all alcohol-related traffic accidents investigated by the MUNICIPALITY's police agency. A sample copy of the STOP-DWI Monthly Accident Report form is annexed hereto as Appendix "C"; and
- (iii) all DWI cases [cases involving alleged violation(s) of §1192, §511(2)(a)(i) or 511(3) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law] commenced by the MUNICIPALITY's police agency in any court in Erie County. A sample copy of the STOP-DWI Monthly Arrest Report form is annexed hereto as Appendix "D".

B. The MUNICIPALITY, through its Justice Court with jurisdiction to hear and determine DWI cases, agrees to compile information and render monthly reports to the Erie County Office of Criminal Justice Planning with respect to all DWI cases finally disposed of [as those terms are defined in paragraph FOURTH (A)(i) and (ii), but including cases removed or transferred] in the MUNICIPALITY's Justice Court. A sample copy of the STOP-DWI Monthly Court Report form is annexed hereto as Appendix "E".

C. The MUNICIPALITY acknowledges that the determination by the COUNTY of the amounts payable to the MUNICIPALITY under paragraphs THIRD and FOURTH of this

Agreement is dependent upon the timely receipt by the Erie County Office of Criminal Justice Planning of accurate information from the MUNICIPALITY. Accordingly, the MUNICIPALITY agrees that, as a condition precedent to its right to payment under this Agreement, it shall fully complete and forward to the Erie County Office of Criminal Justice Planning each of the monthly reports required under this paragraph (Appendices "B", "C", "D" and "E") within 15 days after the last day of each monthly period to which such reports relate.

SIXTH: This Agreement is executory only to the extent of moneys available to the COUNTY for the performance hereof and appropriated therefor, being moneys in a separate account entitled "Special Traffic Options Program for Driving While Intoxicated" established and funded pursuant to Sections 1678-a and 1803 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, and the COUNTY shall incur no liability on account of this Agreement beyond such moneys.

SEVENTH: In the event the Erie County STOP - DWI Program, as approved by the Commissioner of the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles, is to be terminated during the term of this Agreement, the provisions of Section 1678-i of the Vehicle and Traffic Law shall govern for purposes of determining the sums available to the

COUNTY and payable to the MUNICIPALITY pursuant to this Agreement.

EIGHTH: The MUNICIPALITY shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of this Agreement or of any right, title or interest therein, nor of the power to execute the same or any extension thereof to any other person or corporation without the previous consent in writing of the COUNTY.

NINTH: The MUNICIPALITY agrees to comply with all applicable laws of the State of New York, the United States and the County of Erie, including laws against discrimination, and with all rules and regulations of pertinent authorities having jurisdiction.

TENTH: The MUNICIPALITY shall be fully accountable for its performance under this Agreement and agrees for itself and its officers to answer under oath all questions relevant to the performance thereof and to any transaction, act or omission in connection therewith if called before any Judicial, County, State or Federal agency empowered to investigate the Agreement or its performance.

ELEVENTH: The MUNICIPALITY agrees to furnish verified accounts of its disbursements hereunder, with certified or verified invoices thereto attached at such times and in such form and detail as may be required by the Erie County Comptroller, who may at her option audit the

pertinent books and records of the MUNICIPALITY, and a final account within thirty (30) days after the termination of this Agreement.

TWELFTH: The MUNICIPALITY agrees to defend, hold harmless and indemnify the COUNTY against any and all liability, claims, demands, suits and judgments arising out of the performance of the MUNICIPALITY'S obligations under this Agreement. The MUNICIPALITY further agrees to maintain insurance coverage during the term of this Agreement and to submit certificates of insurance in accordance with Vendor Classification C-"Professional Services", on Appendix "F" annexed hereto. For purposes of this Agreement, the MUNICIPALITY need not provide proof of professional liability insurance coverage. At the request of the MUNICIPALITY and with the advice of the Erie County Attorney, the Director of the Erie County Office of Criminal Justice Planning may waive the excess and/or umbrella liability insurance coverage(s), or reduce the amount(s) thereof, otherwise required under this paragraph. In lieu of proof of insurance coverage, the MUNICIPALITY may furnish evidence of a self-insurance plan acceptable to the Erie County Attorney.

THIRTEENTH: Consistent with the MUNICIPALITY's status as an independent contractor, the COUNTY shall not be responsible for Worker's Compensation benefits, Social

Security coverage or unemployment insurance benefits with respect to the MUNICIPALITY.

FOURTEENTH: This Agreement, or any renewal thereof, may be terminated by either party upon at least thirty (30) days prior notice. Such notice shall be provided in writing to the chief executive officer of the other party at the address appearing on the first page of this Agreement.


FIFTEENTH: Provided that the MUNICIPALITY shall have made formal application for the continued funding of its alcohol traffic safety law enforcement activities, this Agreement may be renewed for such additional twelve (12) month terms as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties through their respective legislative bodies.

The following is a summary of the proposals which have been reviewed by the Town Environmental Quality Review Advisory Committee at a meeting held on October 16, 1987, in the Town Hall Council Chambers.

ITEM I Dick Road and North Creek - Proposed Office Building

Applicant: Environmental Concepts

Determination: Non-Significant with stipulations - This project had been before the committee at the previous meeting. The site is located at the Northwest corner of North Creek and Dick Road. There are a number of businesses now in the area including restaurants, banquet hall, offices and retail stores. The office building will be occupied by a real estate firm and the firm has indicated the possibility of constructing a second office building sometime in the future to house mortgage offices.

A site plan was submitted which shows the first building and parking area as well as the second building and parking area. The applicant will submit a detailed drainage plan to the Town Engineer showing storm water detention on site.

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The applicant will be approaching the Traffic Safety Commission at their October 20th meeting for approval on the driveway locations. The Environmental Committee was of the opinion that this use will be consistent with the existing uses now in the area and will be an assest to the community when completed. The stipulations are as follows:

a) Traffic Safety Commission approval of driveway locations. b) the Planning Board approval of landscaping plan. c) continue sidewalk along North Creek to Dick Road.

ITEM	II	Losson Park Estates Phase I	-	Proposed Development of 11 Lot Subdivision Multiple Family Dwelling

Applicant: Bella Vista Development Corporation

Determination: Non-Significant - The applicant had submitted plans earlier in the year for this project and has revised them considerably. The original plan showed a dedicated Town highway intersecting Crab Apple Lane at 2 points. The revised plan shows a private road to the apartment complex intersecting Crab Apple Lane at the intersection of what is tentatively known as Rusford Lane. Phase I consists of 11 lots located along Crab Apple Lane. Phase II will consist of the balance of property being developed as an apartment complex privately owned and maintained. The Committee was of the opinion that Phase I will not have any adverse impacts on the area. The developer has been working closely with engineering on required specifications.

Phase II is not now in the Erie County Sewer District and will be subject to further review by this Committee when the developer seeks approvals in the future.

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ITEM III     1249 Walden Avenue     -     Proposed Self-Service Car Wash

Applicant: John Valenti

Determination:     Tabled - The site is located on the South side of Walden Avenue across from Ridge Park. This area of Walden Avenue consists primarily of residences, retail stores and offices. The Public Comment period for this item has not expired therefore the Committee decided to await public comment and to refer this item to the Traffic Safety committee.

ITEM IV     75 Industrial Parkway     -     Proposed 7,000 Square Foot Addition and New Parking Lot

Applicant: Rosina Food Products

Determination:     Non-Significant with stipulations - The present occupant of the building, Rosina Food Products, requires additional storage and processing space as well as new loading docks for their expanding business. They are located in the Gardenville Industrial Park off French Road. The addition will result in increased employment as orders increase. The Committee found no adverse impact with this proposal but the determination is subject to a) drainage plan approval by the Town Engineer and Highway Department and b) Planning Board approval of the landscaping plan.

ITEM V     3160 Union Road     -     Special Permit for Automobile Sales

Applicant: Don's Collision/Waterford Motorcar

Determination:     Tabled - The applicant's application and site plan differ greatly from his presentation before the Advisory Committee. The application calls for wholesale use as well as limited retail auto sales.

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His plan showed two (2) areas for the retail auto sales and one (1) for wholesale auto sales. In his presentation he indicated he would be having only retail sales of 10 to 15 cars in one area only. He was advised to amend his site plan to show these changes and to present them to the Traffic Safety Commission for their recommendations.

ITEM VI      French Road      -      Proposed Retail Sales/  
Beauty Salon

Applicant: Joseph Latona

Determination: Non-Significant with stipulations - This item had been before the Committee previously and the applicant had been requested to submit a new site plan. He has submitted the new plan which reflects the recommendations of the Committee, these being a wider driveway and building set back further from Slate Bottom Creek with most of the parking located in the rear. The building will have split rib block front and sides and will be consistent with existing uses in the area. This stretch of French Road, the North side between Borden Road and Transit Road is almost exclusively retail sales and personal services. The stipulations are: a) Approval of a drainage plan and creek work by the Town Engineer and b) Planning Board approval of landscaping.

ITEM VII      Dick Urban Plaza      Proposed Additions To The  
Plaza Totaling 9,375  
Square Feet

Applicant: Dick Urban Plaza Associates

Determination: Tabled - The additions are proposed for the North and South ends of the Plaza. After considerable discussion the applicant was told to revise his site plan to reflect existing conditions.

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For example: the two-way roadway along the front of the stores extends to the Bell's Supermarket and is not hindered as shown in the plans by parking area. The applicant was also informed to show curbing to better define driving lanes within the plaza complex since the biggest problem the Committee felt was with the hap-hazard flow of traffic through the site. The plan must also reflect drainage for the rear of the site as there will be a new paved road to handle traffic flow. The applicant must also approach the Planning Board for approval of landscaping plan.

ITEM VIII Genesee and Harmony Lane - Proposed Construction Of  
20,400 Square Feet Of  
Retail Sales and 10,800  
Square Feet Of Warehouse.  
Space

Applicant: Sam Tadio

Determination: Non-Significant - The applicant proposes to construct the facilities on a 3.18 site located at the Southeast corner of Genesee Street and Harmony Lane which is the entrance to the Sky Harbor Mobile Home Park. The stores would be primarily to service the parks in the way of groceries, barber shops and other personal type services facilities. The storage buildings would be utilized for park equipment and other miscellaneous items needed in the day to day maintenance of Sky Harbor. The actual styling of the construction of the has not been determined since the initial anchor store will set the trend. The applicant must submit detailed drainage plan to the Town Engineer for approval. The area is primarily a mix of mobile home parks, light industry, sales and the development as proposed would be consistent with an improved existing situations.

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ITEM IX            Kennedy Park                 -            Proposed Mobile Home Park  
For 173 One Family Units

Applicant: Benderson Development Corporation

Determination:        Tabled - The applicant wishes to establish a Mobile Home Park on a site of approximately 28 acres of land located on the South side of Broadway just West of the New York State Thruway. The public comment period has not expired and referral letters will be sent to Erie County, N.Y.S DOT, DEC, Cheektowaga Traffic Safety Commission and Forks Fire Department for their recommendations.

ITEM X      Cheektowaga Village      -      Proposed Development Of  
10-12 Unit Apartment  
Building

Applicant: Benderson Development Corporation

Determination:           Tabled - The developer has proposed to construct 10-12 Unit Apartment Buildings on a 8.3 acre parcel of property. The Planning Board is recommending denial of the site density reduction and therefore the project may consist of 9-12 Unit Apartment Buildings with building number 10 the western most building being eliminated. The Engineering Department will be working with the developer on drainage and in all probability will require a detention pond be constructed at the rear of the property. There was some discussion regarding the sanitary sewers and the Town Engineer may recommend to the Town Board abandonment of easements on the property. The developer will then be fully responsible for the sewer lines crossing this site. The site plan must be revised to show landscaping and fencing at the parking areas. 

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into the 21st day of December, 1987, by and between the TOWN OF CHEEKTOWAGA, NEW YORK, hereinafter referred to as the "Town" and the CHIEF OF POLICE AND ASSISTANT CHIEF OF POLICE, hereinafter referred to as the "Chief".

ARTICLE I

SECTION 1.01 - PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

The parties hereto desire to provide, through this Agreement: methods for orderly collective bargaining between the Town and the Chief; to secure prompt and equitable disposition of grievances that may arise; to establish fair wages, fringe benefits and working conditions for police personnel in the negotiating unit; and to promote, to the highest degree, efficiency in providing service to the public.

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements, herein contained, the Town and the Chief agree as follows:

SECTION 1.02 - APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement has been negotiated pursuant to the provisions of the Public Employees Fair Employment Act and is governed by the provisions of the New York State Law and also non-conflicting local laws of the Town.

SECTION 1.03 - LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS

IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT ANY PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT REQUIRING LEGISLATIVE ACTION TO PERMIT ITS IMPLEMENTATION BY AMENDMENT OF LAW OR BY PROVIDING THE ADDITIONAL FUNDS THEREFORE, SHALL NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE UNTIL THE APPROPRIATE LEGISLATIVE BODY HAS GIVEN APPROVAL.

ARTICLE II

SECTION 2.01 - RECOGNITION

The Town recognizes the Chief as the sole and exclusive collective bargaining agent for the Chief of Police and Assistant.

The negotiating unit is defined as all police officers holding the rank of Chief of Police or Assistant.

This recognition shall extend for the maximum period of time allowed by law and until the expiration of this Agreement, according to its terms. The Town shall not negotiate, during this Agreement, with any organization, on behalf of the police officers, defined herein, other than the Chief and, unless notified by the Town, the Chief will undertake to negotiate and represent the same unit.

### ARTICLE III

#### SECTION 3.01 - DUES CHECKOFF

Upon written authorization from the Chief of Police or Assistant on a form provided by the Chief, the Town will deduct from the salary of such police officer, from the second pay-period of each month, membership dues as the Chief or Assistant may specify, and the Town will transmit said sums, promptly to the association designated by the Chief and the Assistant within five (5) days of after the deduction has been made.

### ARTICLE IV

#### SECTION 4.01 - UNIFORM ALLOWANCE

The Chief of Police and Assistant shall be paid the sum of ~~\$450.00~~ <sup>490. RM L</sup> for the year 1988, for the purchase and maintenance of police clothing, uniforms and equipment and for the maintenance and cleaning of the same.

Uniform allowance will be paid by January 30th of each year.

The Chief of Police and Assistant will be responsible for the maintenance of his uniforms and equipment and failure to reasonably maintain the same may be the subject of disciplinary action.

### ARTICLE V.

#### SECTION 5.01 - SALARIES

January 1, 1988 - Chief \$49,069.99

Assistant Chief \$44,244.43

#### SECTION 5.02 - RATE OF PAY

The hourly rate of pay shall be obtained by dividing the annual salary by 2080.

#### SECTION 5.03 - LONGEVITY PAY

Each police officer shall be paid the following, cumulative, longevity increments, each year:

1988    ~~\$900.00~~    1,075 *PACZ*  
                                 *BAC*

Longevity pay will be paid within thirty (30) days after a Chief's or Assistant's anniversary date and will be included in salary for all purposes, including retirement purposes.

#### SECTION 5.04 - REDEMPTION OF ACCUMULATED TIME

The Town will have the right to buy back compensatory time on the books for the Chief or Assistant or any portion of such compensatory time over 120 hours.

#### SECTION 5.05 - EDUCATION INCENTIVE PAY

Effective January 1, 1982, the Chief or Assistant who attends, or has attended, approved Police Science Courses shall receive educational incentive payments annually as follows:

1. One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) a year to a police officer who has an Associate Art and Science Degree (two (2) year program); or
2. Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) a year to a police officer who has a Bachelor of Science or a Bachelor of Arts Degree (four (4) year program).

#### SECTION 5.06 - ADDITIONAL SALARIES

The Chief and Assistant Chief shall be paid pursuant to and consistent with the salary schedules set forth previously. For the responsibility of filing reports and the necessary administrative procedures required, previous and subsequent to the regularly scheduled tour of work, each member shall receive two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to be added and pro-rated with his regular salary.

### ARTICLE VI

#### SECTION 6.01 - WORK DAY AND WORK WEEK

The Chief's work day may consist of variable hours depending on the need of his duties and meetings that must be attended. The Chief and Assistant Chief will put in at least the number of hours that a member of the Police Club or Captain and Lieutenants Association member works during a year which will be documented by maintaining an attendance record.

ARTICLE VII

SECTION 7.01 - HOLIDAYS

The Chief or Assistant shall be given compensatory time-off or be paid the value of the following Holidays, whether he works the Holiday or not:

New Year's Day	Columbus Day
Lincoln's Birthday	Veteran's Day
Washington's Birthday	Election Day
Good Friday	Thanksgiving Day
Memorial Day	December 24th.
Independence Day	Christmas Day
Labor Day	January 2nd.

The Chief and Assistant shall notify the Town or their designee by December 1st. as to the Holidays he elects to be paid for and the Holidays he elects for compensatory time-off, during the following year.

ARTICLE VIII

SECTION 8.01 - VACATIONS

Each police officer shall be entitled to an annual vacation, with pay, during each calendar year as follows:

After 1 year	-----	12 working days
After 5 years	-----	18 working days
After 10 years	-----	21 working days
After 15 years	-----	25 working days
After 20 years	-----	28 working days

An officer who has at least seventeen (17) years of service may elect to be paid the value of not more than ten (10) days of accumulated vacation, each year, in lieu of leave.

SECTION 8.02 - UNUSED VACATION

Notwithstanding any provision of the law to the contrary, each member of the Association shall be entitled to be paid, at the time of his retirement from the Department, the monetary value of any unused vacation time and overtime standing to his credit on the date of his retirement. In the case of death in service of any Captain or Lieutenant, the value of such time standing to his credit shall be paid to his estate or as is otherwise provided by law.

Police officers intending to retire may notify the Town two (2) years in advance and will be permitted to accumulate time-off and vacations for one and one-half years, the value of which will be paid as salary during the final year of employment and included as wages for pension purposes.

#### SECTION 8.03 - VACATION PAY ADVANCE

Upon written request, at least two (2) weeks prior to vacation time, a police officer will be paid the estimated amount due him for his vacation period, not later than the Friday before he begins his vacation.

### ARTICLE IX

#### SECTION 9.01 - BEREAVEMENT LEAVE

Upon request of the Chief or Assistant, a leave of absence, not to exceed five (5) days shall be granted, because of death in his immediate family. Such leave shall be taken, without loss of pay or other benefits, and shall begin on the date of death. Immediate family, for the purposes of this Section, shall mean: mother, father, spouse, child, grandchild, grandparent, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, daughter-in-law and son-in-law.

In the event of the death of the Chief's or Assistant's brother-in-law or sister-in-law, and upon request, he shall be granted two (2) days off, without loss of pay or other benefits. In the event of death of a relative, not included above, the Chief or Assistant, upon request, shall be granted time-off without loss of pay or other benefits, for the day of the funeral, which time shall be charged against accumulated time-off or sick leave, at the Chief's or Assistant's choice.

### ARTICLE X

#### SECTION 10.01 - PERSONAL LEAVE

Each police officer shall be entitled to five (5) non-cumulative personal leave days. Personal leave shall be used at the police officer's discretion, except that personal leave shall not be taken on a Sunday or a Holiday, except in case of emergency.

Personal leave will not be used in less than one-half day increments.

Each officer, shall annually elect to credit unused personal leave days to vacation time or to accumulated sick leave, at the officer's option.

## ARTICLE XI

### SECTION 11.01 - SICK LEAVE

The Chief or Assistant except as otherwise provided, shall be entitled to accumulate one and one-half sick days per month to a maximum accumulation of 300 days.

A female Chief or Assistant who is incapable of performing her duties because of maternity disability may utilize accumulated sick leave credits and continue all other benefits under this Agreement during such absence.

Maternity leave shall be considered to commence on the date that the officer is no longer capable of performing her duties and shall end on the date the officer can resume the performance of her regular duties. The officer will be requested or required to bring in a doctor's note to verify the date when she is not capable of performing her duties or when she is capable of returning to work. In addition, she may be required to submit to a physical examination by a doctor of the Town's choice to verify the starting and ending date of such maternity leave.

Each member of the Association shall have the option of selling any accumulated sick leave days in excess of three hundred (300) days back to the Town at the rate of 50% in 1987 per day.

### SECTION 11.02 - CERTIFICATE OF DISABILITY

The Town may require a member's physician to file a certificate of disability within eight (8) days of the commencement of disability or sick leave in excess of six (6) days. The Town may require additional certificates in cases where future sick leave is requested.

### SECTION 11.03 - EXTENDED SICK LEAVE

If a member has exhausted his sick leave, he may be granted additional sick leave, not to exceed ninety (90) days, upon the approval of the Town Board. Said extension shall not be charged against future sick leave.

The Town may require proof of said disability, by having the member's physician submit periodic medical reports. The Board may at any time require a member to be examined by an independent physician designated by the Board at its expense.

The granting or denying of an additional sick leave, as above stated shall be the sole discretion of the Town Board. Their decision is final and binding on all parties and is not reviewable through the grievance procedure.

### SECTION 11.03 - WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION

Members who are injured in the course of their employment and receive Workmen's Compensation benefits shall receive their full pay and they assign the proceeds of the Workmen's Compensation benefits to the Town.

No part of said absence shall be charged against the member's accumulated sick leave.

#### SECTION 11.04 - ILLNESS OF FAMILY MEMBERS

Sick leave shall apply to absence due to illness of a police officer's immediate family, residing in his household.

#### SECTION 11.05 - SICK LEAVE UPON RETIREMENT

1. One year prior to retirement, the Chief or Assistant may convert his accumulated sick leave days into value by written application signifying his intention, on a form provided by the Town.

2. Upon receipt of such notification, the Town will convert such accumulated sick leave into value by taking the actual cash value of the accumulated sick days and multiplying by the rate of 50% in 1987.

The resulting sum shall be paid to the Chief or Assistant at his option exercised in writing in the following manner:

(a) The sum shall be paid to the Chief or Assistant as part of his final year's average salary by dividing the sum by the number of pay periods so as to allow for equal distribution over his last year of employment, or

(b) The sum shall be paid to the Chief or Assistant on the date of his retirement.

3. If a Chief or Assistant shall notify the Town of his intention to retire and such notice is given less than one year prior to the date of retirement, the Town will have the option of making a one-time lump sum payment or of dividing the sum by the number of pay periods, remaining, so as to allow for equal distribution during the remaining time of employment.

### ARTICLE XII

#### SECTION 12.01 - EXPENSES

A Chief or Assistant who is required to leave the Town, by reason of his employment or as part of his official duty, shall be reimbursed for all actual, reasonable, and necessary expenses incurred, including meals, if he is absent from the Town during normal mealtime.

A Chief or Assistant on official police business will be provided with transportation by the Town and if he is required to use his own vehicle on police business, the officer shall be paid at the current rate per mile for each mile driven. In no event will a Chief or Assistant be required to use his own motor vehicle during the normal course of his employment.

### ARTICLE XIII

#### SECTION 13.01 - LIFE INSURANCE

The Town will provide each officer with a \$25,000 life insurance policy insuring the officer, without cost, pursuant to the life insurance plan offered through the Police Conference of New York, and it will allow officers to exercise the options provided in that program and will comply with the requirements of the same.

SECTION - 13.02 - HEALTH INSURANCE

The Town will provide, at its own expense, the following health insurance benefits:

Blue Cross and Blue Shield Insurance, at least equivalent to the 1982 - 1983 plan;

\$1,000,000 major medical with \$50 deductible;

\$1.00 co-pay prescription rider;

Blue Cross and Blue Shield dental coverage of the high level riders A, B, C, D and No 8;

Optical coverage afforded under the Blue Cross and Blue Shield plans commonly referred to as the Vision Care Benefits;

Blue Cross and Blue Shield, Basic Rider 8 (Insuring dependents to age 23 years);

Major Medical Rider 8 (\$50.00 deductible);

Prescription Drug Rider 8 (covering dependents to age 23 years);

Option Two, Vision Care;

Blue Shield, Basic Rider 4 (covering emergency, accidents, etc.);

Blue Shield, Basic Rider 3 (in-patient visits to 365);

Blue Shield, Basic Rider 12;

Effective December 31, 1986 the following coverage will also be provided:

DENTAL PLAN NO. 3 WITH RIDER NO. 8

If an officer dies, while insured by the Town, the Town will provide health insurance benefits for the balance of the calendar year in which the death occurred. The deceased officer's surviving spouse or dependent children may remain in the health insurance program, at their own expense, upon their election.

The Town will continue to provide health insurance for officers who retired after December 31, 1982, and before June 29, 1985, up to age 65 years. Officers who retired prior to that date have the option of participating in the health insurance coverage plan, at their own expense.

The Town will continue to provide health insurance for officers who retire after June 29, 1985, including all present health insurance benefits up to age 55 years.

At age 55 years, officers who retired after June 29, 1985 will be provided, without expense, Blue Cross and Blue Shield Insurance at least equivalent to the 82-83 Plan, together with XBR, the \$250,000 Major Medical with \$50.00 deductible and \$1.00 co-pay prescription rider and Blue Cross and Blue Shield Rider No. 16 (psychiatric care), plus any additional coverage or riders provided to other Town employees.

At age 65 years retirees will be provided with Blue Cross and Blue Shield Supplemental coverage with \$1.00 co-pay prescription rider plus those riders which are provided to the retired Town employees.

The Town will also add Rider No. 8 to the Optical Coverage for those officers who require such coverage.

#### SECTION 13.03 - INDEMNIFICATION

The Town will indemnify each Chief or Assistant for claims made against him based upon false arrest, false imprisonment, civil rights violations, and other torts within indemnification coverage pursuant to the provisions of Section 50-j of the General Municipal Law and Section 1983 et seq of the United States Code.

#### ARTICLE XIV

##### SECTION 14.01 - RETIREMENT BENEFITS

The Town will provide and maintain a non-contributory retirement plan of benefits for police officers, pursuant to the following provisions of the New York State Retirement and Social Security Law:

The benefits provided in Section 384 f, g and h to provide what is commonly known as the 1/60th, 25-year retirement plan;

The benefits pursuant to Section 375(i), more commonly known as the Improved Retirement Benefits;

The benefits pursuant to Section 302, 9-d, more commonly referred to as the Final Average Salary, and Section 360-b, Death Benefit; and

The benefits pursuant to Section 384-d, more commonly known as the 20-Year Retirement Plan.

#### ARTICLE XV

##### SECTION 15.01 - DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

A Chief or Assistant will be given a copy of any warning, reprimand, suspension or disciplinary action entered into his personnel record within two (2) weeks of the action taken.

#### SECTION 15.02 - RECORD OF COMPLAINTS

No record or reference to a complaint, either departmental or external, lodged against a Chief or Assistant will be entered into his record if after investigation the complaint is decided, by the Town, to be unfounded.

#### SECTION 15.03 - SUBSTANCE OF COMPLAINTS

A Chief or Assistant who has a complaint lodged against him by a citizen shall have the substance of the complaint presented to him in writing.

### ARTICLE XVI

#### SECTION 16.01 - TUITION

The Town will pay the full costs of all tuition, books and other fees for all police officers, authorized by the Town, who attend school or seminars relating to Police Science courses.

### ARTICLE XVII - BILL OF RIGHTS

The provisions of this Article shall not apply to criminal investigations or investigations of possible criminal activity or violations.

#### SECTION 17.01 - TIME OF INTERROGATION

The interrogation of the Chief or Assistant shall be conducted at reasonable hours, preferably, when the officer is on duty and if not on duty during daylight hours, unless the exigencies of the investigation dictate otherwise.

#### SECTION 17.02 - IDENTIFICATION OF INVESTIGATING OFFICERS

A Chief or Assistant who is under investigation for a matter, which would not constitute a crime, must be informed of the name of the officer in charge of the investigation and the names of the officers who will be conducting any portion of interrogation or investigation.

#### SECTION 17.03 - INFORMATION REGARDING INVESTIGATION

An officer must be informed of the nature of an investigation before any interrogation begins. The information must be sufficient to reasonably inform him of the investigation which is being conducted.

#### SECTION 17.04 - LENGTH OF INTERROGATION

Interrogation shall be completed with reasonable dispatch. Reasonable rest periods will be allowed and time will be provided for personal necessities, meals, telephone calls and rest periods as reasonably required.

#### SECTION 17.05 - COERCION

A Chief or Assistant shall not be subjected to offensive language and shall not be threatened with transfer, dismissal, or other disciplinary punishment. No promise or reward shall be made as an inducement to answering questions. Nothing herein is to be construed as to prohibit the investigating from informing an officer that his conduct may be subject to other disciplinary action with resultant disciplinary punishment.

#### SECTION 17.06 - RIGHT TO COUNSEL

A Chief or Assistant who is under investigation has the right to the presence of an attorney, with him, during any questioning, hearing, or interrogation.

#### SECTION 17.07 - RECORDING OF INTERROGATION

Interrogation of a Chief or Assistant for any disciplinary investigation will be recorded, either mechanically or by a stenographer, and there will be no off-the-record statements.

#### SECTION 17.08 - ADVICE OF CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

If a Chief or Assistant is the subject or target of a disciplinary investigation, he shall be advised of his constitutional rights.

#### SECTION 17.09 - FURNISHING OF COPIES

A Chief or Assistant under investigation will be furnished with a copy of any statement he has signed or made, or of any proceedings that have been recorded, in any manner.

#### SECTION 17.10 - POLYGRAPH

The Chief and Assistant will not be given polygraphic examinations.

#### SECTION 17.11 - NON-WAIVER OF CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

No Chief or Assistant will be required to or requested to waive constitutional rights granted under the United States or the New York State Constitution.

#### SECTION 17.12 - HEARING OFFICER

In the event the Town elects to select a hearing officer, pursuant to Section 75 of the Civil Service Law, who is not either a Town employee or Town Official, then, in that event, the hearing officer will be mutually selected by the Town and by the Captain or Lieutenant who is charged. If the parties are unable to agree upon a hearing officer, or if the hearing officer agreed upon is, or becomes unable to or unwilling to act, then the parties shall mutually apply to Special Term of the New York State Supreme Court for the appointment of a hearing officer.

#### ARTICLE XVIII

##### SECTION 18.01 - LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Chief and Assistant may be granted leave of absence, with or without pay, as provided for in the Civil Service Law of the State of New York.

##### SECTION 18.02 - NON-DISCRIMINATION

There will be no discrimination with respect to the race, color, creed, sex, political persuasion. The Chief and Assistant shall receive the full protection of all of the provisions herein.

##### SECTION 18.03 - PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS

The Town will provide a payroll savings and U.S. Savings Bond deduction plan and make it available for the Chief and Assistant who desire the same.

#### ARTICLE XIX

##### SECTION 19.01 - MANAGEMENT RIGHTS

All of the authority, rights and responsibilities possessed by the Board and not covered by this Agreement are retained by it, including, but not limited to, the right to determine the mission, purposes, objectives, and policies of the Board; to determine the facilities, methods, means, and number of personnel required for conduct of Board programs; to administer the examination, selection, recruitment, hiring, appraisal, training, retention, promotions, assignments or transfer of employees, pursuant to law; to direct, deploy and utilize the work force; to establish specifications for each class of positions, and to classify or reclassify and to allocate or reallocate new or existing positions, in accordance with law; and to discipline or discharge employees, in accordance with law, and within the provisions of this Agreement.

##### SECTION 19.02 - CONFORMITY TO LAW

If any section, sub-section, sentence, clause, phrase, or any portion of this Agreement is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Agreement.

SECTION 19.03 - TERMS OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement, except as may be hereafter modified in writing by both parties, shall become effective January 1, 1988 and remain in force until December 31, 1988.

ARTICLE XX

SECTION 20.01 - ELIMINATION OF NEGOTIATIONS

The Agreement of the parties was to establish a contract which would eliminate any major negotiations concerning subsequent contracts.

All future agreements, if any, shall be adjusted to reflect any changes in the Town of Cheektowaga Captains and Lieutenants Association contract. These adjustments shall not include any changes exclusively omitted from this agreement.

SECTION 20.02 - PAST PRACTICE


This agreement shall supersede conflicting rules, regulations, or practices heretofore existing. Established practices, not specifically covered herein, shall continue in force and effect.

SECTION 20.04 - ENTIRE AGREEMENT


