RESOLVED, that, effective immediately, the head of each department which is requesting a Notice to Bidders for purchases over \$10,000 or public works projects over \$20,000 shall supply the names of at least three (3) prospective bidders for such item to the Town Clerk when it submits the resolution authorizing said Notice to Bidders, and BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and hereby is directed to mail a copy of the Notice to Bidders for such items to the three (3) prospective bidders identified by such department head, and BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED, that, in the event the department head cannot identify three (3) or more prospective bidders for a purchase or public works project, he/she shall submit a letter to such effect to the Town Clerk and this Town Board explaining the reason(s) why, and BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and hereby is directed to forward a copy of this resolution to each Town Department Head.

#### **II. PUBLIC HEARINGS**

Item No. 5 This being the time and place advertised for a public hearing to consider the advisability of adopting amendments to the Chapter 76 of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga, (Vehicle and Traffic) hereinafter more particularly described, the Supervisor directed the Town Clerk to present proof of the publication and posting of the notice of hearing. The Town Clerk presented proof that such notice has been duly published and posted, and upon the order of the Supervisor such proof was duly filed. Said amendments being as follows:

# **ARTICLE XVI**

#### **Penalties**

76-160. Penalties for offenses shall be amended to read as follows:

A. Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a Violation of any provision of this Part, except for sections 76-130.1 or 76-150, which is not a violation of any provision of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall, for a first conviction thereof be punished by a fine or not more than fifty dollars (\$50.) or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second such conviction within eighteen (18) months thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine or not more than one hundred (\$100.) or by imprisonment of not more than forty-five (45) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; upon a third or subsequent conviction within eighteen (18) months after the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.) or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

B. Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of the provisions of Section 76-130.1 or 76-150 of this Part shall, for a first conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more then two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second or subsequent conviction within eighteen (18) months after the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine or not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.) or by imprisonment of not more than forty-five (45) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

The Supervisor announced that the Town Board would hear all persons interested in the subject of the hearing. Comments were heard, after which the Supervisor declared the hearing closed; decision was reserved.

WHEREAS, the Town's Amusement Arcades Ordinance mandates that a license may not be granted for any premises to be used as an amusement arcade if such premises is located within 500 feet of a school, church or R-District boundary, AND

WHEREAS, Section 12 of such ordinance authorizes an applicant to appeal to this Town Board to vary or modify this requirement if an applicant can attest to and prove certain matters, AND

WHEREAS, Barbara and Gary Boughton have appealed to this Town Board from a decision of the Town Clerk to not approve an Amusement Arcade License for property located at the Garden Village Plaza in the Town, AND

WHEREAS, a hearing on this appeal/variance was held before this Town Board on the 15th day of May, 1995 at 6:30 p.m., AND

WHEREAS, the applicant has shown to the satisfaction of this Town Board the following with respect to its application:

- 1. Strict application of the Amusement Arcade Ordinance would produce an excessive and unreasonable economic burden and would be physically or legally impracticable because arcade games are critical to the operation of the business.
- 2. There are unique circumstances or conditions peculiar with the property or type of amusement arcade because the arcade is in a plaza and the types of games/activities are activity-oriented.
- 3. The issuance of a variance would not affect the character of the nearby residential neighborhood because the property is sufficiently screened from the adjacent neighbors.
- 4. The issuance of a variance will not tend to depreciate the value of adjacent property because the arcade entrance and parking lot are a distance away from residential properties.
- 5. The issuance of a variance would not be contrary to protecting the morals and welfare of minors or other members of the community because the business has safety and security measures to protect children.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the application of Barbara Boughton for a variance to allow it to obtain an Amusement Arcade License for premises located at the Garden Village Plaza be and hereby is granted and the Town Clerk be and hereby is directed to issue the applicant an Amusement Arcades License subject to the following conditions:

- 1. No more than 20 amusement devices may be located on the premises.
- 2. Applicant shall comply with all other provisions of the Amusement Arcade Ordinance.

### Section 1.

### **ARTICLE XVI**

#### **Penalties**

76-160. Penalties for offenses, shall be amended to read as follows:

A. Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of any provision of this Part, except for Sections 76-130.1 or 76-150, which is not a violation of any provision of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall, for a first conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.) or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second such conviction within eighteen (18) months thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred (\$100.) or by imprisonment of not more than forty-five (45) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; upon a third or subsequent conviction within eighteen (18) months after the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.) or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

B. Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of the provisions of Section 76-130.1 or 76-150 of this Part shall, for a first conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second or subsequent conviction within eighteen (18) months after the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.) or by imprisonment of not more than forty-five (45) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

# Section 2. Time to take effect.

- (a) These amendments shall take effect when properly posted within a reasonable time except those parts, if any, which are subject to approval under Section 1684 of the vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.
- (b) Any part or parts of these amendments which are subject to approval under Section 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall take effect from and after the day on which approval in writing is received from the New York State Traffic Commission.

# Section 3. Territorial Application

These amendments shall apply to all of the Town of Cheektowaga, Erie County, New York outside of the villages of Depew and Sloan.

### Section 4. Publication.

That these amendments to Chapter 76 of the Code of the Town of Cheektowaga shall be entered in the minutes of this Town Board and shall be published in the CHEEKTOWAGA TIMES, a newspaper published in this Town, and affidavits of such publication shall be filed with the Town Clerk and the Town Clerk shall likewise enter in the Ordinance Book a copy of said amendments specifying the date of adoption thereof.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Environmental Impact Review Ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga, the Environmental Advisory Committee ("EAC") reviews various applications for building permits, rezoning permits, etc. and renders its recommendation concerning the environmental significance of such application, AND

WHEREAS, the Town Board, pursuant to the Environmental Impact Review Ordinance of the Town of Cheektowaga, is designated the Lead Agency in most instances, AND

WHEREAS, an application was submitted by NB.DS Associates to construct 124,000 square feet of retail/restaurant building at 1746 Walden Avenue, to be known as the Walden Galleria Plaza, AND

WHEREAS, the applicant has met numerous times with various advisory groups and committees to review the project, AND

WHEREAS, as a result of the meetings the applicant has reduced the project from 124,000 square feet to 117,000 square feet located within one (1) building at the north end of the site, AND

WHEREAS, the applicant, as a result of the meetings with the Town of Cheektowaga Planning Board, has increased the amount of landscaping on the site, AND

WHEREAS, the applicant will construct sidewalks along Walden Avenue, and the applicant has agreed to construct sidewalks along Galleria Drive at a future date when so requested by the Town of Cheektowaga, AND

WHEREAS, the applicant has agreed to provide the Town with an agreement to maintain property and landscaping in good condition, and to ensure snow removal from sidewalks and at intersections with public roadways, AND

WHEREAS, as a result of meetings with the Traffic Safety Commission, the applicant has agreed to road construction along Galleria Drive to create a turning lane into the plaza, AND

WHEREAS, as a result of the road work the street lights must be moved, the applicant further agreed to perform such work at his expense and to grant the Town a five (5) foot lights/utility easement along that stretch of Galleria Drive, AND

WHEREAS, the applicant has submitted the attached letter of commitments addressing a variety of Town and environmental concerns, AND





A license will not be granted to a driver/attendant convicted of a felony, any offense relating to theft, insurance fraud, offenses or a series of convictions for traffic offenses that would indicate a pattern of disregard for vehicle or personal safety. The record checks will determine if the applicant meets the criteria established in §4 A-13A and B and shall:
    - (a) Submit satisfactory proof of completion of the minimum requirements imposed by the State of New York

(b) Submit a current certificate of completion of an EMT course to the EMS Board.
